A Historic Canopy for Gamblers

Right in the middle of the older section of the capital, there is a place where the gamblers reign, where people take a break from the bustling metropolitan life. memorial, it dates back to 1888. The inscriptions on the tall thing, read 'In token of sympathy with the Nawabs Abdul Gunni and Ahsanullah, this obelisk has been erected by their European

friends in affectionate remembrance of Khajeh Hafizullah, July 8, 1884." One is left to wonder by the two structures how cruel and sympathetic the colonizers can be at the same time. But, surely all that is part of history, and even ghosts do not live.

Fund for permanent cross dams on Matamuhri demanded

CHITTAGONG, Aug 25: Chakaria Samity leaders here today called upon the government to make available fund for the construction of four permanent cross dams on the river Matamuhri at Cheringa under Cox's Bazar district for the irrigation of over 60,000 acres of land of Chakaria during dry season, reports BSS.
