
Torrential rain damages huge

The existing launch terminals are beset with various problems causing utter inconvenience to the travelling people. The tinshed roof and railing at the enclosure of launch ghats which were made long ago have become unworthy of use.

Rain water pour into the shed causing immense suffering to the waiting passengers during the rain and storm. Passengers' have to stand on their foot for want of bench. There is no toflet at the ghats.

It can be mentioned here that the launch terminals which have been damaged during the devastating cyclone of April 29, 1991 have not yet been re-

Female smokers on increase
The number of female smok-

ers is increasing day by day in the rural areas of the district. Anti-smoking drive has been launched at the towns of the

district and publicity has been going on in this regard. But there are no drive and publicity against smoking in the

rural areas of the district. A survey reveals that the smoking tendency among the old women dhas increased mainly in the areas of tobaceo crushing mills and factories of

A survey conducted in village Kakchira under Patharghata thana of the district reveals that in the year 1988, there were 10 women smokers out of total 30 women in the village.

The smoking tendency is found among the landless and labour classes of people in the district. About 20 per cent are smoking bidis and 80 per cent are smoking tobacco dusts. Bamboo output

On decrease Production of bamboo has

decreased as bamboo clusters in greater Barisal district, especially in Barguna, is being destroyed due to lack of proper orientation, maintenance and plantation programme. These areas were once rich

in bamboo production. There were innumerable bamboo clusters in the vast areas of the district. Consequently, an acute bamboo crisis is prevailing in these bamboo enriched areas in Barguna district. Price has also increased many times. Meanwhile, no efforts are

taken to save the bamboo clusters in these areas. The owners of the clusters are also ignorant about the cultivation. The roots which remain underground after cutting bamboo are lifted haphazardly and being sold in the markets due to shortage of fuel. As a result, the tender bamboo plants are destroyed.

Proper nursing enables a bamboo tree to give birth to at least 20 tender bamboo plants every year, agricultural experts

Due to lack of proper nursing and maintenance a bamboo tree gives birth only to two or three tender plants every year. As a result, bamboo production is not increasing in proportion to the increasing demand.

.It can be mentioned here that about 90 per cent of the dwelling houses in this district are kutcha. The materials chiefly used in the construction of these houses include bamboo. Now, the price of bamboo ranges from Taka 70 to 110 per piece. Eighty per cent of villagers cannot afford to purchase it at an exorbitant price.

Gay girls

The number of gay girls is increasing in different areas of the town giving rise to anti-social activities. Local people said the gay

girls are found alluring people in launch ghat, Bazar Road, Tahshil office area, and some of Katpatty area of the town. According to report, a mid-

dle-aged woman of Katpatty area is carrying on immoral business at the town. She allegedly collects young girls from the villages on the assurance of giving good jobs and later compels them to resort to immoral activities for earning money.
