Pakistan urges US to help settle Kashmir dispute

QUETTA, Aug 29: Pakistan's caretaker Prime Minister on Saturday urged the United States to help settle his country's territorial dispute with India over Kashmir, which he said could turn into a flashpoint, reports Reuter.

Moeen Qureshi told a news conference Pakistan did not want to have major issues with the United States,

"We would particularly like the United States to involve itself in the problem of Kashmir because we believe Kashmir can be a flashpoint of a conflict in this region," he said.

His appeal came only to days after Islamabad protested against a US decision to impose arms control sanctions on Pakistan and China over alleged missile technology transfer by Beijing, which both sides deny.
