Weather forecast for the next 24 hours commencing 6 am today (Saturday) says, the sky will remain partly cloudy over the country.


The Met Office forecasts, temporary light rain or thunder-shower may occur at one or two places over Chittagong division and weather will remain mainly dry over Dhaka, Rajshahi, Khulna and Barisal division.

Day temperature is likely to rise by one to two degree Celsius over the country.

The maximum temperature of the country yesterday of 34.7 degree Celsius was recorded in Satkhira and the minimum 22.6 degree was recorded in Rangamati.
