Surprise visit at RAJUK Rafiq finds anomalies

Works Minister Rafiqul Islam Mia paid a surprise visit to the Rajdahi Unnayan Kartipakkhya (RAJUK) yesterday and gave some spot decision to improve the efficiency of the employees, reports BSS.

During the visit, the minister went round different sections of the RAJUK and detected some irregularities and inefficiencies in its functioning.

Barrister Rafiq caught red-handed Sharfuddin, a RAJUK employee, who had been acting as an agent for building plan approval. The Works Minister asked the RAJUK authority to hand over the employee to the police and also to take departmental action.

He expressed his dissatisfaction over unnecessary delay in responding to complaints of the members of the public. He freely talked to the visitors to RAJUK and enquired about their problems. During investigation of some files in the Authorised Officer's Section, the minister detected unnecessary delay in responding to a particular complaint as regards construction of a three-storied building in Dhalkanagar, Sutrapur violating the approved plan.

He gave spot decision to take disciplinary action against persons responsible for the delay in responding to the complaints. Alauddin Khan of 336, Peererbagh, narrating his woes to the minister, said he had

visited RAJUK more than 50 times with a complaint regarding construction of a building by his neighbour in violation of the existing rules. He said that he had fought a legal battle on this matter suffering a financial loss of Tk 30 thousand. Asked if his complaint had been redressed, Khan replied in the negative.

Anwara Begum, a former Parliament Member, who had a chance meeting with the minister at RAJUK, said that she had visited RAJUK 30 times in connection with building plan approval.

The minister will be personally available to listen to complaints of members of the public from 10 am to 4 pm on September 21 at the conference room of RAJUK.

Bangladeshi painter's show in USA

A 12-day painting exhibition of Goutam Chakraborty, a young promising painter of the country, is currently being held at gallery "The Five" in Boston, USA, reports UNB.

The show which began last Wednesday will continue till September 25.

Goutam will also participate in a group show in New York from September 28 to October 4.

Rajshahi Girls School's Zia Bhaban opens

RAJSHAHI, Sept 18: Mayor of Rajshahi City Corporation Mizanur Rahman Minu today formally inaugurated the 'Zia Bhaban' of the Rajshahi Multilateral Girls High School, reports BSS.

Hatchery, nursery at thana level soon: Noman

The government has taken steps to ensure at least one hatchery and one nursery at thana level soon to help boost fish production, reports UNB.

Minister for Fisheries and Livestock Abdullah Al Noman said this when he was exchanging views with the thana-level Fisheries Extension Officers, participating in a two-day Trainers Training Course, during his surprise visit to Matsya Bhaban here yesterday.

Referring to the farmers' awareness of potentiality of pisciculture to achieve self-sufficiency, the minister urged the extension officers to help the farmers in the planned pisciculture.

He instructed the officials to take prompt action for the successful implementation of the planned pisciculture project taken up by farmers. Stressing the need for bank loan for such projects, he said that the process of realising bank loan for pisciculture projects would be simplified.
