Allegations against IAHS sponsors refuted

Chairman of the Institute of Applied Health Sciences (IAHS) National Professor Nurul Islam yesterday refuted allegations of irregularities against the sponsors of the IAHS terming those to be propaganda by a section of misguided people.

Speaking at a press conference at the Jatiya Press Club, he announced that the IAHS — a private medical college based in Chittagong — would never be dissolved but function under the newly-formed private University of Science and Technology (UST).

The press conference by the National Professor followed allegations by a section of guardians of the students of the IAHS on August 5.

The guardians, in a press conference accused the sponsors of the IAHS of running a "non-existent" private medical college without affiliation to the Chittagong University.

Prof Islam lauded the present government's decision to open private universities in the country terming it an epoch-making step. He also thanked the Jatiya Sangsad for passing the Private University Ordinance 1992.

He said that the IAHS au-

thorities had tried their best to receive affiliation which was denied by the Chittagong University despite repeated appeals.

Prof Nurul Islam pointed out that the efforts to affiliate the IAHS with the Chittagong University were not approved by the then government and unnecessary debate was raised despite three inspection reports by the university.

The Chittagong University decided to formulate the statute and ordinance on October 1, 1991 — 30 months after the opening of the IAHS, he said.

"We have tried to fulfil all the terms but efforts were made to tarnish our image by not affiliating the IAHS," he added.

Vice Chairman of the IAHS governing body Prof Muhammad Ali and one of the patrons of the private medical college Nur-e-Alam Siddiqui were, among others, present at the press conference.

Launched on May 13, 1989, the IAHS began the first MBBS class with 42 students under the banner of the Janasheba Complex of the Islamic Medical Mission, a national voluntary organisation led by Prof Nurul Islam.

Three die in city incidents

Three persons died in separate incidents in the last 48 hours in the city.

All the bodies were sent to the DMCH morgue for autopsy.

BRTC staff to be halved, Jatiya Sangsad told

The Bangladesh Road Transport Corporation (BRTC) incurred a loss of about Tk 280.95 crore since its inception in 1961 till last July, Communications Minister Col (Rtd) Oli Ahmed informed parliament yesterday, reports UNB.

Replying to a question from Mizanur Rahman Manu (AL), the minister said certain steps and plans were taken to bring down the loss.

According to the plan, the minister said, the state-run corporation staff would be nearly halved to 1890 from 3509. Already, 1163 people were relieved through voluntary retirement programme and another 63 went on normal retirement. The total strength of the corporation stands at 2283, he added.

Oli Ahmed said import of 30 double-decker buses had been finalised under the Annual Development Programme, and the buses are expected to reach country this month.

Besides, the authorities also took steps like closing down more bus depots. Four out of 19 depots in the city have already been closed down to cut expenses and coach services in six routes where buses were running at loss also stopped, the minister said.

Replying to another question from Shamsul Haque (AL), the minister said 146 buses of the corporation were now running

in different routes.

Country to export 18 lakh bales of jute

The country is expected to export 18 lakh bales of jute in the current financial year and earn about Tk 336 crore, the Jute Minister told parliament.

Replying to Mirza Azam of Awami League, Brig (Rtd) Hannan Shah said the government had plans to set up 125 jute purchasing centres this year. Of them, 103 centres have been opened and the remaining 22 will be opened soon.

To a supplementary, he said at the initial stage of the current jute season, the government had received orders of exporting 3 lakh bales of raw jute.

Responding to another supplementary question, the minister said the country was expected to produce 40 to 45 lakh bales of jute this season. The government mills and jute purchasing centres have bought more than 12 lakh maunds of jute.

Plan for 64 km-long railway track

The government has a plan to construct 64 km-long double metre gauge railway track from Tongi to Bhairab Bazar.

Replying to a question from Latifur Rahman (Jamaat), the minister said the plan would be implemented as soon as necessary fund is available.

In reply to another question from Joimul Abedin Hazari (AL), the minister said 581 rail accidents had taken place since January 1 till August this year, killing 14 people and injuring 64.

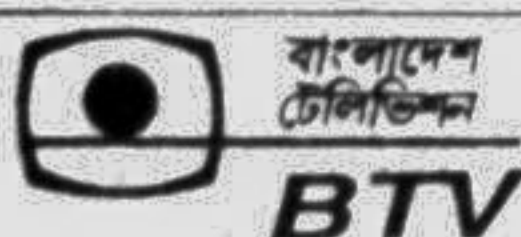
A total of Tk 80,000 was given as compensation to the members of 8 families of those who were killed and Tk 1,01,500 to 20 families of those injured in the accidents, he added.
