27 pc domestic resource provided to ADP

Kindergarten Assoc threatens movement

Bangladesh Kindergarten Association yesterday threatened to launch a greater movement if the government failed to meet its 13-point demand including registration of kindergarten schools on easy terms, reports UNB.

Leaders of the association told a press conference at Jatiya Press Club in the morning that the academic life of about 10 lakh students of 5,000 kindergarten schools in the country had become uncertain due lack of normal facilities.

The demands also include distribution of books free of cost among the kindergarten students, stoppage of commercial rate in gas, electricity and WASA bills, salary for the teachers, allocation of abandoned land or houses for

To begin with, the building will house some offices of the judiciary. But some courts will be shifted there within very short time, the Law Minister said.

The Met Office forecasts, day temperature is likely to remain nearly unchanged.

The country's highest temperature yesterday of 33.0 degrees Celsius while the lowest 22.6 were both recorded in Kutubdia.

Many places of the country yesterday experienced rainfall. Chief amounts of rainfall recorded during the day time were: Madaripur 83 mm, Dhaka 54, Sylhet 37, Faridpur 26, Barisal and Sylhet 20mm each, Tangail and Khulna 18 each, Comilla 14, Bholi 13 and Majlidiourt 10 mm.
