It is expected that over 13.16 lakh metric tons of Boro paddy will be produced in the five districts in the current season.

#### Frequent power failure disrupts production, cultivation

Oct 5: Frequent power failure and load shedding have become a common feature in the district headquarters and its adjoining areas causing immense suffering to the town dwellers for long, reports UNB.

Local people alleged that not a single day passes without power disruption and almost every night electricity goes off plunging the entire town into darkness giving rise to anti-social activities.

The production in local mills and factories and workshops has also been affected due to frequent power disruptions.

Besides, irri and aman cropfields are also affected due to frequent power failure. The farmers are unable to husk paddy for want of power as most of rice mills are run by electricity.

Fluctuations of voltage causes damage to household electronic gadgets. Most of the streets in the district town remain under darkness after sundown as most of the poles have no bulbs or with fuse bulbs.

A case has been registered Police also recovered one abandoned locally made pistol from Barandipara along the Dhaka road on Wednesday. None was arrested.



## Destitutes in towns for employment, food

NARAIL, Oct 5: Number of the landless and unemployed people have been increasing alarmingly in the district, reports UNB.

According to official sources 60 per cent of the total population depends on agriculture, 10 per cent on different occupations and the rest 30 per cent are unemployed.

Of the farmers 60 per cent are landless, 30 per cent with a few acres of land and the rest 10 per cent are landless, said the source.

Due to recurrent floodings and other natural calamities every year a large number of people become destitute and move to the thana and district headquarters in search of food and job opportunities.

Many unemployed educated young people are seeking opportunities for self-employment under various income generating projects. But due to poverty

they cannot meet the requirements of such opportunities.

Another report says: Bamboo production has decreased in the district due to indiscriminate

use of its roots in brickfields. The district was famous for bamboo production a few years back and about 80 per cent rural people were dependent on it for erecting their thatched houses. But at present due to its scarcity they are facing serious problems.

There were thousands of bamboo clusters in the district but these are gradually being vanished due to large scale use in burning bricks. A medium size bamboo is being sold between Taka 70 and Taka 100 in the market.

Meanwhile, repair and construction of kutcha houses in the rural areas are being hampered badly for want of bamboo and the traditional cottage industries are facing extinction.

# Sharp decline in soil fertifity in Chandpur

From Our Correspondent CHANDPUR, Oct 5: Mineral

constituents of soil have shown a sharp decline indifferent areas of the district.

perts, fertility of soil in some areas has continued to decline mainly due to artificial method of cultivation (irrigation), absence of crop rotation and regular use of chemical fertilizers. Experts; who conducted experiments on soil taken from different areas, say zinc and sulphur, the two main ingredients of soil naturally found, other than ofcourse, nitrogen, have been sharply reduced. The necessary quantity of zinc, sulphur lacking in the soil also reduces

the fertility which means less food for the crops on that particular land. Another reason for loss of

such soil fertility is the exten-

sive use of chemical fertilizers According to agricultural exon these croplands. The experts on this issue say, indiscriminate use of chemical fertilizers like, urea and TSP, adversely affect the natural fertility of soil. Absence of crop rotation fur-

ther adds to loss of such natural contents in the soil as, zinc, sulphur and potassium. The farmers in the area are reluctant to continue their ancestral practice of sowing same plant every season or year resulting in damaging the soil to even greater extent.
