
# Private degree college to be set up

# Another 25,000 attacked

Diarrhoea claims 310 lives From Our Correspondent

KISHOREGANJ, Oct 8: Diarrhoea has so far claimed 310 lives and attacked 25,000 people in the district during the last ten weeks, according to an unofficial source.

Of the dead, 29 died in Kishoreganj, 28 in Hossainpur, 33 in Karimganj, 32 in Pakundia, 13 in Katiadi, 38 in Nikli, 9 in Tarail, 21 in Bajitpur, 12 in Kuliarchar, 7 in Bhairab, 14 in Austagram, 52 in Mitamain and 22 in Itna hanas.

But the Civil Surgeon office confirmed the death of 130 only and said that 11,000 people have been attacked by the disease during the period

The villagers of the affected areas informed that due to the negligence of the workers of Health Department, the disease has been spreading fast. The medical teams are hardly found in the affected areas, they further informed.

Civil Surgeon office sources said 70 medical teams were working in different thanas to combat the disease.

The situation aggravated during the period due to absence of adequate preventive measures and inadequate sup-

ply of medicines. The patients coming in large numbers were facing accommodation problem in the health complexes and sadar hospital. They have not arranged extra beds to tackle the situation.

patients complained. Acute scarcity of pure drinking water and deficiency of balanced diet have been attributed to the outbreak of the diseases, the doctors said.

Local MPs, political leaders and union parishad chairmen have urged the authorities concerned to supply life saving drugs and send more medical teams to save the suffering people and combat the disease

It may be mentioned here that the government has imposed ban on publishing and selling note books upto class eight. But some unscrupulous traders are publishing substandard note books with fake name and addresses. These note books are full of errors and distortion of facts and it misguide the students.

Some guardians complained that these note books are being sold at an exorbitant price in different markets of the district. It is reported that the owners of bookstalls do not sell text

books without notes. The students and guardians have urged the concerned authorities to take necessary steps regarding the matter.

#### Catching of fish fry indiscriminate

Defying the government order, the fish fry are being caught indiscriminately in different parts of the district.

It is reported that, a section of fishermen in sadar, Tarail, Karimgani, Bajitpur, Itna, Mitamain, Austagram, Bhairab, Hossainpur, Pakundia, Katiadi, Nikli and Kuliarchar thanas of the district are catching fish fry of ruhi, katla, magur, mrigal, puti, singhi, boal, kalibaush, shaol etc from rivers and canals. Everyday a huge quantity of different varieties of fish fry are being sold in different markets, hats and bazars of the district.

It is learnt that some of the fishermen are catching these fish fry. The government has banned the catching of fish fry below nine inches to implement its open water fish production programme.

It is alleged that law enforcing agencies are often play a stlent role to take any action

against the illegal catching of fish fry. If indiscriminate fishing goes on unabated, it is apprehended that the quantity of fish in the district will be declined.

#### Heart disease

Over 20,000 people in 13 thanas of the district have been suffering from heart disease.

According to an unofficial estimate heart diseases have attacked about 3,000 people in Kishoregani sadar thana, 1600 people in Katiadi, 1500 people in Hossainpur, 1700 people in Pakundia, 1300 people in Karimganj, 1200 people in Tarail, 2400 people in Bajitpur, 1800 people in Kuliarchar. 2700 people in Bhairab, 900 people in Itna, 600 people in Austagram, 700 people in Mitamain and 600 people in Nikli thanas.

Many people have died of heart disease in the district. During the last three years over 250 people have died of heart attack in the district, it is

Deaths from heart disease cases and heart attack are abnormally increasing in the dis-

The treatment facilities for the heart disease patients in the district are very poor. There is only one hospital and twelve health complexes in 13 thanas of the district.

It is learnt that for want of better treatment facilities hundreds of heart disease patients are either to go to Mymensingh and Dhaka or to Calcutta for treatment.

"Mental unrest, smoking, high blood pressure, abnormal eating of rich food and a high level of cholesterol in the blood are among the main causes of heart attack, it is informed.

# Withdrawal of income tax demanded

KHULNA, Oct 8: The small jute traders have demanded the withdrawal of income tax imposed on them recently.

This was expressed at a press conference arranged by the Small Jute Traders Association at the local press

The traders informed that they used to supply jute to the mills at a nominal profit. The mill authorities however delayed the payment for a considerable period of time, they pointed out.

The National Board of Revenue (NBR) imposed in March '93 2.50 per cent income tax in March '93 on the small jute traders which will be realised from June of the same

But the NBR did not impose any tax on the agents or big suppliers, the traders disclosed.

The traders claim that the imposition of tax on them as unethical and unreasonable as their income is small.

Bangladesh Jute Mills Corporation (BJMC) requested

jute traders. The NBR took a decision in 1988-89 to impose tax on them but later gave up the idea con-

sidering their low income. The supply of raw jute to the mills has decreased considerably following the decision of income tax, mill sources in-

formed. The mills are at present purchasing raw jute from the agents at a higher rate causing losses to the mills, sources in-

formed. If this situation continues, the mills are to bear heavy losses, mills authorities disclosed.

It is interesting to note that the NBR did not impose such taxes in Dhaka and Chittagong
