

Setting up cell to check int'l criminals directed

Inspector General of the Police (IGP) ASM Shahjahan yesterday directed the police personnel to be more vigilant to check the activities of international criminals within the country, reports BSS.

He directed to set-up a cell immediately at the police headquarters to take quick legal actions after collecting information and data on the activities of international criminals and the nature of international crimes and their degree in the country.

Shahjahan was addressing the high officials of the police at the police headquarters here in the city.

The IGP also directed the police officials to maintain more close contact with the international police organisation, 'INTERPOL', in checking international crimes.

He asked the police officials for maintaining mass contact for checking all sorts of crimes within the country. He said police-public cooperation and partnership should be built up for checking crimes. He called upon the police personnel to let complainants know the results of enquiry according to law.

Reviewing the crime position in the country during the month of September the meeting was held that it had come down.

During September the police recovered smuggled goods and

drugs worth over Taka 1.28 crore and arrested about five hundred people on different charges and filed cases against them.

They also recovered 136 pieces of illegal firearms and 487 rounds of ammunition from remote areas of the country by launching drive against illegal arms recovered during the same month.

Workshop on STD begins

A two-day workshop on 'development of strategies for prevention and control of sexually transmitted diseases (STD) in Bangladesh' began at the NIPSO auditorium in city yesterday, reports BSS.

Deputy Leader of the Jatiya Sangsad Prof AQM Badruddoza Chowdhury inaugurated the workshop as the chief guest, while Health and Family Welfare Minister Chowdhury Kamal Ibne Yusuf attended it as the special guest.

Presided over by the Director General of Health Services, Prof Nurun Nabi, the inaugural session was also addressed by WHO Representative in Bangladesh Dr ANA Abeyesundere, Health Secretary M Fazlur Rahman and director of VHSS Dr Mohammad Nasiruddin.

A total of 50 participants drawn from different government and non-government agencies are participating in the workshop.

The participants will assess the prevalence of sexually transmitted diseases, their management services available in the country.

Bangladeshi products appreciated

Government leaders of Iran have highly appreciated Bangladesh's products, particularly handicraft, being displayed at the 19th International Trade Fair in Tehran, reports UNB.

Some 51 countries from across the world are participating the fair scheduled to end today.

Food Minister Mir Shawkat Ali returned home Sunday after an eleven-day official visit to the United Kingdom and Belgium, reports BSS.

6 new double-deckers in city routes

Bangladesh Road Transport Corporation (BRTC) yesterday pressed into service six newly imported double-decker in city routes, reports BSS.

With the introduction of these buses, the fleet of BRTC's double-decker now stand at 26 in the city.

The new double-deckers are a part of 30 such buses to be pressed into operation in phases. The rest of the buses are likely to arrive by the first week of November. Four of such buses will be put into service in Chittagong city, two in Khulna and one in Rajshahi Divisional Headquarters soon while six others will operate between the capital and port town of Narayanganj.

Initially, the six new double-deckers would be pressed into operation on Gulshan-Gabatali and Gulshan-Mirpur Section-1 routes in the city from Kallyanpur bus depot.

Road and Road Transport Secretary Syed Rezaul Hayat has formally inaugurated the operation yesterday a simple function held at Kallyanpur bus depot. BRTA Chairman AR Khan also spoke on the occasion.

Indonesian envoy to Bangladesh

Government yesterday has accorded approval to the appointment of Dr Hadi A Wayarabi Alhadar as Ambassador of the Republic of Indonesia to Bangladesh, reports UNB.

Born in 1941, Dr Hadi is a career diplomat. After having joined the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in 1968, he was on various diplomatic assignments abroad, including Indonesian Missions in Damascus, New York and Geneva.

64 held in city

Police arrested 64 people from different parts of the city in last 24 hours on various charges, reports UNB.
