### Maradona would have liked it otherwise

BUENOS AIRES, Oct 11: Diego Maradona must wish his official comeback to Argentine soccer on Sunday had gone as well as his informal return only three days earlier, reports Reuter.

The stocky star, who has chosen Newell's Old Boys as the vehicle for his return to Argentine league soccer after nearly 12 years away, was exultant last Thursday after scoring the goal in Newell's 1-0 win in a friendly against Ecuador's Emelec.

But on Sunday, Independente beat Newell's 3-1 in a championship match and though Maradona engineered his side's goal, it fell to his team-mate Carlos Morales to score.

Cheered on by fans from both clubs, Maradona must still have felt a pang of jealousy as Independiente's Raul Alfaro Moreno scored three times - all with headers. The result hoisted Indepen-

diente to third in the 20-strong First Division with seven points from five games and left Newell's struggling in 18th Place with three points. Local commentators thought

they detected gestures of annovance in the former Argentina captain when his teammates' skills let them down. "May be someday, when

Maradona's teammates can reach his level of speed, his team will surge ahead," one commentator said.

There was no immediate reaction from Maradona, who was bursting with enthusiasm and self-confidence after the friendly against Emelec.

#### FAZ appeals to FIFA for re-match

LUSAKA. Oct 11: Zambia appealed to FIFA world soccer's governing body, on Monday for their World Cup qualifier against Morocco to be replayed. reports Reuter.

The Zambians blamed the Gabonese referee for their 1-0 defeat in Sunday's match in Casabianca which eliminated them from the World Cup. A draw would have seen Zambia through to the finals being staged next year in the United

We hope FIFA will agree to our suggestion that we have a re-match." Adrian Bauleni, the general secretary of the Football Association of Zambia (FAZ). told Reuters.

Bauleni criticised the Gabonese referee and Linesmen for being "poor, biased and intimidatory.

The move is the latest in a war of words between Zambia and Gabon. Zambia lost 18 of their top players and officials in a plane crash just off the Gabonese coast in April.

Since then Zambia has accused Gabon of failing to co-operate in investigating the crash and last month Zambia asked FIFA to appoint a new referee for the match in Morocco, saying Gabonese officials would not be neutral.

Soccer fans flocked to the FAZ offices on Monday, many angry about the way the match was officiated.

The majority of them felt Zambia should have been awarded a penalty in the dying moments and that the referee had ignored several fouls on Zambians

DERBY, England, Oct 11 Phil Defreitas, the England all rounder released by Lancashire at his own request last week, is set to sign for Derbyshire on a much lower salary, reports AFP

The 27-year-old former Letcestershire player, who wants to move back to the Midlands so that his wife can be near her parents, has had talks with Derbyshire Vice-Chairman Mike Horton and is close to agreeing

DeFreitas is believed to be among the English county game's highest earners at a minimum 30,000 pounds a season, but Horton told The Sunday Telegraph: 'The financial side of things is not a problem.


"We can accommodate him within our budget and without compromising our pay structure because he's prepared to make a financial sacrifice to be able to move to the Derbyshire area."



Pollard was speaking at the official launch of the 1994 Open, which will be held from Jan 17-31 and will offer record prize-money of 8.15 million Australian dollars (dlrs 5.37 million US).

"The issue of player and spectator safety has unfortunately put high on the agenda this year," Pollard said. "We have made plans to increase security, but those details will remain strictly confidential."

Prize-money has been increased by over 12 per cent in Australian dollar terms over the 1993 tournament. The winners of the men's and women's singles each will earn dirs 460,000 Australian (dirs 303,000 US).

"It is a substantial increase. but I believe it is a responsible one," Pollard said.

Reigning men's champion Jim Courier, Pete Sampras, Stefan Edberg, Goran Ivanisevic and Andre Agassi all have indicated they will contest the event, although Boris Becker has said he will be unavailable due to the imminent birth of his



a stroke of a kitchen knife, goes on trial Tuesday in the stabbing of Monica Seles, reports AP.

Parche, a 39-year-old unemployed lathe operator from the east German town of Nordhausen, is charged with causing grievous bodily harm. The charge carries a maximum

sentence of five years in prison.

Seles has not played tournament tennis since Parche stabbed her in the back on April 30, during a changeover in her quarterfinal match against Magdalena Maleeva of Bulgaria in a Hamburg tournament Seles suffered a wound 1.5 centimeters (a half-inch) deep.

Seles, clutching her back, screamed in pain as shocked security officials wrestled Parche to the ground. Parche leaped from the spectators' sec-

Parche told police he wanted to harm Seles because he could not bear to see her dominate the game over his favourite. Germany's national heroine Steffi Graf. Horrifyingly, Parche achieved what he set out to do.

In the five months since the stabbing. Seles has already dropped from No. 1 to No. 4 in the world rankings. Graf has regained the top ranking and is closing in on record earnings for a year that could reach dirs 3.7


After the stabbing, Seles went into seclusion while she was being treated by Dr Richard Steadman in Vail, Colorado.

Seles, an ethnic Hungarian, was born in Novi Sad, capital of the Serbian province of Vojvodina. She has lived in the United States since 1986 and lists her residence as Sarasota, Florida.


