The Army pilot. Michael Durant, had no comment as he was gingerly carried on a Red Cross stretcher from a compound in central Mogadishu. He appeared to be in pain and looked dazed. His legs were covered with a red-and-white sheet.

UN officials say Durant would need immediate medical attention for leg, arm and back injuries.


