The newly-elected National Assembly was inducted by outgoing Speaker Gohar Ayub Khan who administered a collective oath after which the deputies signed the membership register individually.

The hung parliament's crucial sitting is scheduled for Tuesday, when the House is to elect a prime minister for the next five years.

CHITTAGONG. Oct 15: Shortage of equipment and absence of modern logistics stifle smooth cargo handling at the country's major sea-port here.

time since 1960.

With the volume of cargo increasing everyday there is serious apprehension that things may come to a head unless steps are taken immediately to equip the port with advanced state-of-the-art handling equip-

Amanul Islam, Chairman of the Chittagong Port Authority. while talking to this correspondent, admitted the seriousness of the problem and said steps have already been taken to procure modern handling equip-

According to port sources the cargo volume rose to 7.6 million metric tons (MT) in the 1992-93 fiscal, an increase of over a million tons over the past ten years. The port's annual handling capacity is only six million MT.

Another senior port official. speaking on condition of anonymity, said one reason for the backlog in cargo handling has been the marked increase in containerized cargo. Over the years there has been a growing trend globally towards shipping in containers, also preferred by

"This factor has aggravated the problem since the existing facilities here are designed basically to handle bulk cargo," the source explained.

The port authority, in the meanwhile, has procured fourstraddle carriers and some other equipment, which is still inadequate to cope with yearly increase of nearly 20 per cent in container traffic, said Director (Traffic) Mohsin Sarker

He said 'Regularly we are facing crisis here because some of the equipment, due to lack of proper spares, frequently go out of order".

Presently, around 25000 MT of cargo are handled daily, up from about 15000 MT per day handled ten years back, the director informed.

During the '92-93 fiscal, Chittagong port handled 1,50,987 containers, up from the 5,000 or so containers handled in '82-83 fiscal, port reports said.

Officials say he port should be provided with gantry Crane, Shore Key Cranes etc., to match the growing demand. Otherwise, the port may lose out on global trade in the near future.

Besides, Chittagong is lag-

ging far behind other ports of the region which have rubbertyred gantry (RTG) and other logistics, they said.

Due to lack of gantry cranes certain cargo vessels reportedly avoid Chittagong and divert to other neighbouring ports.

Port sources said the two Multipurpose Berths (MPB) which were inaugurated on August 18 this year by Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia. could not yet be pressed into full operation due to various short comings.

The two MPB were built as container terminals at a cost over Tk 400 crore.


