A Feminine Touch on Papier-mache

Despite the numerous art galleries springing up of late and regular weekly exhibitions being held, it was a pleasure to see Masuda Kazi's experimentation on papier-mache with gouache. These works at "Jojon" art gallery ranged from

realistic and impressionistic to abstract. Masuda got the inspiration to use papier-mache from a maidservant in her childhood who had made household utensils to store rice and vegetables. She also saw her husband Kazi Raqib and her colleagues experimenting with different media and decided to do the same herself.

Of the 34 exhibits, "Waiting" depicted a girl annoyed with her co-mates and sulking on the doorsteps-A cat was shown as keeping her company. The brown dress of the girl was done as subtly as the grey fur of the cat and the details of the verandah. Plenty of interesting textural work had naturally crept in due to the use of the particular handmade media.

artist had an obvious fascination. Its eyes were realistic with yellow and black, while its fur a blurred black and white. It had a background of varied squares of grey, blue, mauve and pink with an interesting play of texture.

A cat in an impressionistic form was brought in "Cat-7" with detailed textures on the limbs, tail and the head. There was yet another cat in the next entry which showed another feline creature seen sitting in front of an old door. The walls of the house were depicted as weatherbeaten. The cracks on the papiermache lent interest to the composition on mottled green, with touches of white.

"Cat-3" delineated three pets crouched on top of a wall. A window was shown at the back. Grey framed the basic composition. The subject dear to the heart of the artist was shown on a large scale in "Cat 6" where a cat was shown as resting on a couch, with drapings and cushions all around. Shades of blue were used in this paintings and it was held together with layers of grey

In "Wall" she has brought in brown, green, grey and white to depict the decaying atmophere due to the constant rains. There was a

staircase in front and the composition was completed with a little cat in the doorway.

In "The Portrait of a Woman" the artist has brought in facial features, jewellery and hairstyle which gained a three dimensional look due to the medium used. It was in white and grey and surrounded by grey

> and black squares. In "Wall-11" were squares of yellow. grey, pink and white and it was surrounded by an oblong rectangle, which was framed with colours of grey and black.

"Icon" presented a portrait in a Russian style with an impression of a face surrounded with abstract splashes ofbright oranges, reds and brown. Meanwhile, in "Mushroom" the artist has mag nified the tiny mushrooms found around some old houses, with the white touched up with yellow ochre and grey. It was held up by the black background.

"Abstract-II" had various colours of grey, yellow, green. red and blue. The artist admitted that the work was just a play of colours and

had no symbolic meanings behind the use of shapes or colours that she had used. In "Stones-I" Masuda has inserted actual

stones on to the papier-mache background. One of the stones had human features roughly sketched on it. The colours used on the stones were red, blue and green.

In "Hills" the artist has brought in vellow ochre and green. In "Sky" she used various tones of blue including ultramarine, beige, black and brown. This was semi-abstract like the "Hills". In "Hills-II" the painter has brought in the sky and the moon, with black and red, included in the touches.

In "Stones-II" Masuda has brought in the textures of a mat and a rope along with her assortment of stones. In the wall series, the painter has experimented with textures and colours in the same semi abstract form.

In Masuda's works there was a serene depiction of the world around her with a decisive nostalgia for her childhood. Masuda, who has taken part in ten exhibitions, paints "saris" at home, six a day, and supervises the making of folk hand-icrafts, to supplement her income as a painter.
