Wheels within wheels

PARIS, Oct 16: France's matchrigging scandal took a new twist on Saturday, when an ex-Marseille players reportedly said that the French Football Federation urged him to bring down club president Bernard Tapie, reports AFP.

The affair has centred on Marseille's former general manager Jan Pierre Bernes and defender Jean-Jacques Eydelie. who are accused of offering bribes to three Valenciennes players last season.

But French daily Liberation claims that compromising tapes of telephone conversations last month between Eydelie, then in Argentina and federation chief Jean Fournet- Fayard, have been given to the judge in the

The claims about the tapes. which were apparently handed over by Eydelie to judge Bernard Beffy during an audition in Valenciennes on Oct 1, were quickly denied by Fournet Fayard on Saturday

"What a caricature," he said. There is absolutely no question of that happening.

Liberation claimed that the tapes reveal the federation chief telling Eydelie that if he changed his testimony to implicate Tapie, he would stand every chance of being allowed to play football in France again.

But Forunet-Fayad hit back at the report, telling RTL Radio: I cannot promise things that I can't control.

"What's more," it's obvious that if Evdelie comes back, he has a chance of playing football in France again. If he doesn't come, he has no chance. It's as simple as that.

"It's my opinion that people are once again trying to confuse the situation. Leave us alone and let justice run its course once and for all."

The often talkative state prosecutor in the affair, Eric de Montgoifier, refused to comment on Liberation's report.

Eyedelie was charged with corruption in June a month after the Valenciennes v Marseille match, after telling police that he had acted as an intermediary for Bernes.

Indian show

NEW DELHI, Oct. 16: The Indian government today relaxed liberally the foreign travel guidelines for sports persons and announced incentives and assistance to coaches and federations for a better Indian showing at the Hiroshima Asian Games next year, reports PTI.

According to the new guidelines introduced specially for the trainings and competitions of Asian Games probables, no prior approval of the government will be required henceforth for the teams participating in competitions abroad at their own cost.

And, in some select cases, priority disciplines will be entitled to boarding and lodging alllowances, as applicable to class one government officers, for participation in the training and competitions.

This is in addition to the international passage cost provided earlier.

An official press release saud the government would provide all the equipment required for both training and competition in the priority disciplines.

If the national federations appointed team managers and coaches on a contract of one year, the government would pay Rs. 8000 per month for a man-

For coaches taken on corr-tract, the government would

reimburse the actual contract amount for the Indians, and up to 1000 US dollars per month for foreign coaches. The government also an-

nounced special incentives for coaches. In addition to the payment of a monthly ho norarium to the members of the coaching team, including the national and assistant coaches, the schemes for rewards and incentives for winning medals in the Asian Games will be extended to the coachesi.
