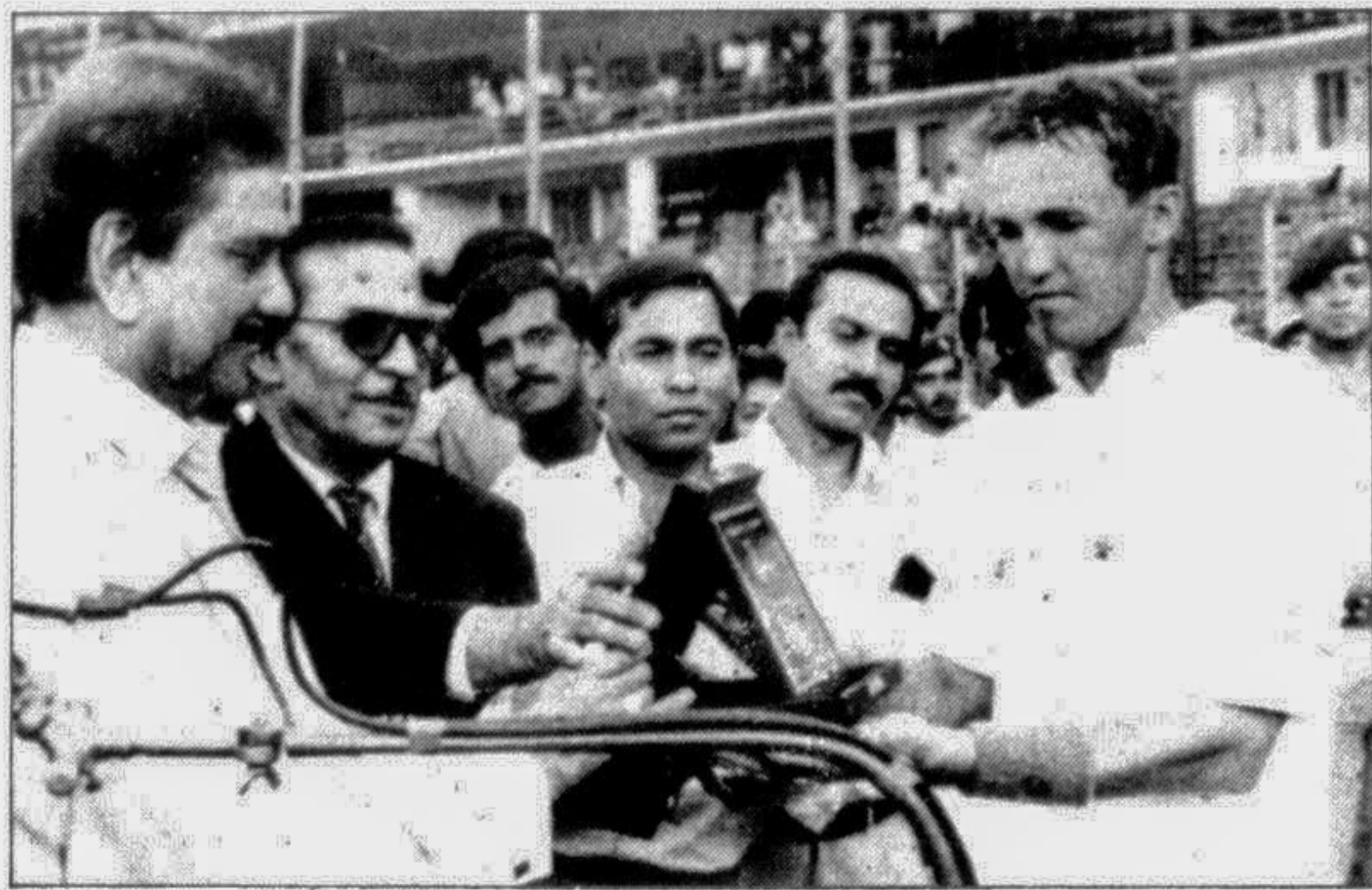


Bangladesh vs Zimbabwe match scoreboard

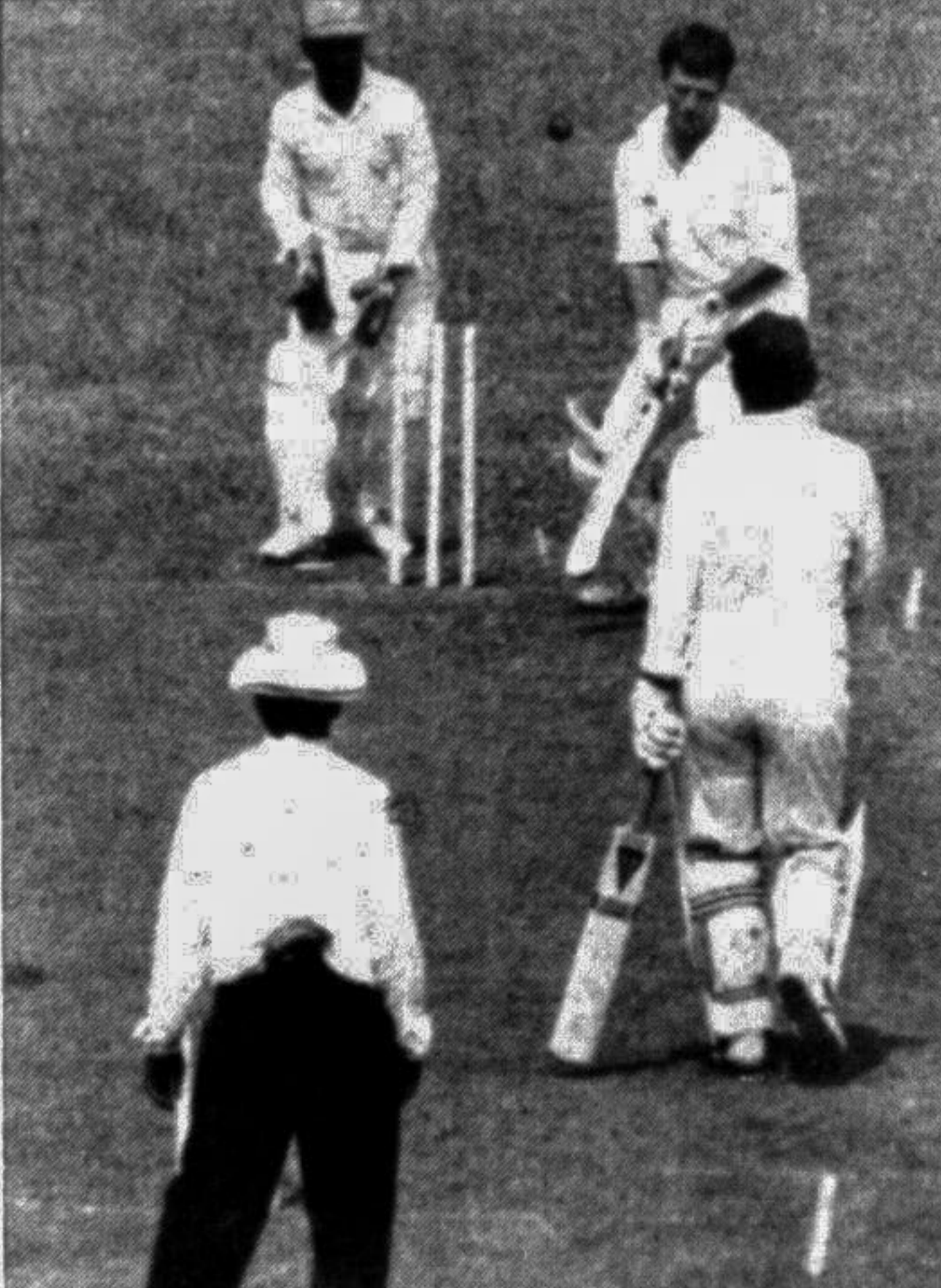
