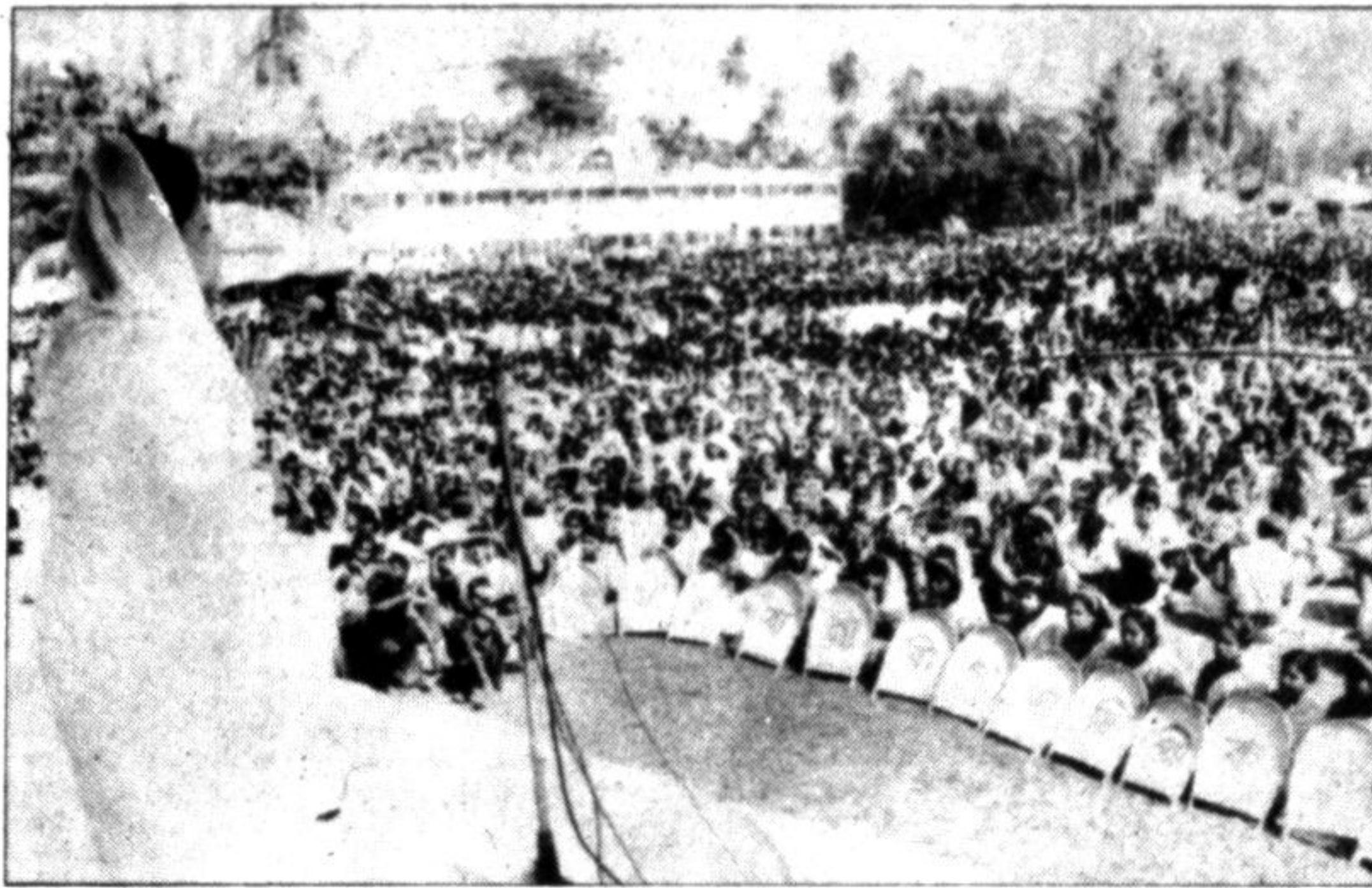
A private bill will be moved by the Opposition in Parliament seeking ban on communal politics, said Opposition Chief Whip Mohammad Nasim.
