

Inside Today Scuffle over 'toll collection' at city rly station

Two killed as Ansars fire on vendors

Two persons were shot dead and three others seriously wounded when Ansars fired indiscriminately near the Airport railway station in the city's Kurmitola yesterday.

Hundreds of villagers, enraged at the killings, went on a rampage at the railway station around 8:20 am, hurling stones that left scores of people hurt.

Two members of the Bangladesh Ansars and VDP who were on duty on the 10 Down Surma Mail — a Sylhet Dhaka train — opened fire after scuffles with vendors who were travelling on the train without tickets. The Ansars were reportedly collecting tolls from the vendors, witnesses said

The Ansars responsible for the killings were arrested by the Railway police when they reached the Kamalapur station by the same train.

They were also suspended said a Railway spokesman.

Jasimuddin, 28, a fish-vendor, died on the spot while a chief security officer of the Trust Guard Company Sikder Fazlul Haque, 35, who was passing by the rail crossing, died on way to the Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH). A bullet pierced through Jasimuddin's head while Sikder was hit on the ch-

Three seriously injured persons - Alamgir Hossain, 22, Quayum, 30, and Mustafa, 32, - who also suffered bulletwounds, were admitted to the DMCH. Alamgir is a hawker and the two others were passers-by, reports our DMCH correspon-

Credit insurance scheme soon

Dangers of destabilising Pak democracy over: Leghari

ISLAMABAD, Nov 14: Pakistan's new President Faroou Ahmed Leghari vowed today to strengthen democracy and national cohesion, amid optimism that the new setup augured well for political stability, reports

Speaking to reporters after his induction, Leghari also promised to seek improved relations with the United States.

Leghari, 53, a former close lieutenant of Prime Minister Benazir Bhutto, was elected by the 464-member parliamentary electoral college Saturday, with opposition candidate Wasim Sajjad defeated by a 106-vote

The victory gave a political boost to Bhutto and lent a considerable degree of stability to her coalition government politicians and analysts here

The 53-year-old Oxford graduate, Sunni Muslim and big landlord from the key province of Punjab, is widely respected for his moderate views and clean political record.

"The dangers of destabilising · democracy are over." Leghari said in his first comments after he was administered the oath by Chief Justice Nasim Hasan


The ceremony was attended by Bhutto, chiefs of the Army, Navy and Air Force, opposition members and Sajjad, who has reverted to his previous post of chairman of Senate after serving as Acting President for nearly four months.

"The presidency will no longer become the centre of intrigues and conspiracies,' Leghari said, adding that the office would now serve as a source of strength for democ-

The opposition leader, former Premier Nawaz Sharif, whose Pakistan Muslim League (PML) suffered a major political setback because of the defeat in the presidential race, did not attend the swearing in cere-

Leghari said he would keep the presidency aloof from party politics and play his constitutional role for consolidation of equitable democratic system.
