SRINAGAR, Nov 15: The Indian army siege of the Hazratbal Mosque entered a second month today as clashes between Muslim militants and the security forces left 25 more people dead in the Kashmir

Some 50 armed Kashmiri Muslim separatists and several dozen Muslim pilgrims have been hold up in the mosque on the outskirts of Srinagar since it was ringed by paramilitary troops on the night of October

Efforts to bring about a negotiated settlement have been unsuccessful and Indian offi cials indicated today that their patience may be running out.

SRINAGAR, Nov 15: The authorities tonight indicated there were 'positive signals' of armed militants trapped inside the Hazratbal shrine giving them up soon. Chief official negotiator, Mehmood-ur-Rahman told PTI that negotiations had entered a 'decisive'

"The militants have to come out and surrender or we will have to review our strategy." Kashmir police chief Manohar Nath Sabharwal told reporters. Chief government negotiator Mehmood-ur-Rehman also ap-

peared exasperated on Sunday when he warned the militants not to tax the government's patience" and said the "time has come for you to surrender.

Srinagar and other towns in the Muslim-majority Kashmir valley were paralysed by a general strike today and troops and riot police patrolled the deserted streets to prevent protests against the Hazratbal siege.

Shops, businesses, schools and government offices were closed and police chief Sabhar wal said that troops would move quickly to break up any public gatherings of more than four

In defence of the Taka

The Taka, which has been made convertible for most foreign transactions, was deemed to be rather over-valued by the World Bank. As reported in The Daily Star November 11. World Bank Vice President Joseph Wood, who was in Dhaka last week, suggested that the currency be devalued by an unspecified amount. Finance Minister Saifur Rahman opposed the idea vigorously. Why is this suggestion, and how

The World Bank's prescription of devaluation has taken many by surprise. Traditionally it is the International Monetary Fund (IMF) which is quick to point out exchange rate misalignments to governments. In case of Bangladesh the IMF has no complaint in this respect. The most recent IMF mission to Bangladesh gave a thumbs-up to the prevailing exchange rate of the Taka.

The WB is taking a different tack on this matter. Their view is that the Taka is valued correctly from a short-term perspective. But, from the longer term perspective of gaining a niche in the global market on a competitive basis, the Taka is overvalued. The reference point used by the Bank to establish this argument is the exchange rate of the Indian rupee. Rapid lowering of the inflation rate in Bangladesh in comparison to the inflation rate in India and

successive devaluation of the Indian rupee have caused the Taka to appreciate in relation to the rupee. In March this year the World Bank estimated that between 1985 and 1992 the exchange rate of the Taka adjusted for price differences appreciated by 44 per cent against the rupee. In the same period the Taka appreciated 22 per cent against the Pakistan ru-

These developments, according to the World Bank, are causing Bangladeshi products like jute and leather to lose their competitive edge in the international market. The effect of this loss in competitiveness is being compounded by two sets of factors within Bangladesh. Firstly, labour productivity is going down while wages have gone up, secondly, poor performance of infrastructure parastatals like the PDB are making many inputs more and more expensive. Biman's repaired DC-10 to fly again December 10

Nabajug, the DC-10 aircraft of Biman Bangladesh Airlines which met with an accident at ZIA on May 18 last will fly again on December 10 after completion of repair works. Biman sources said yesterday.

"It will be a test flight which will hover over the capital for a few minutes," a senior official of Biman's engineering department told The Daily Star.

"The aircraft will then be sent to Rome for D-checking." he said, adding that the Nabajug would join the fleet for full operation in early January.

The aircraft, one of the four Biman DC-10-30s, met with an accident while landing in stormy weather on a return flight from Jeddah. All 135 passengers and crew survived un-
