A Gazipur-bound bus (Dhaka-Cha-28) ran over all the four persons when Nasima was waiting for an auto-rickshaw at 10 am.

Parul, a relative of Nasima, was given first aid at the Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) while on auto-rickshaw driver Anwar was admitted to the hospital.

Meanwhile, Cantonment police seized the bus and arrested its driver Mubarak.

'Chakma leaders' demands unreasonable'

A Foreign Office spokesman here vesterday said some of the demands of the Chakma refugee leaders tantamount to seeking an autonomous state which is contrary to the Constitution of Bangladesh, reports UNB.

"We have done everything possible within the constitutional framework to meet their demands for their safe return to and rehabilitation in the Chittagong Hill Tracts," he said when asked about the repatriation of the Chakma refugees from India

"The ball is now in the court of the refugees," the spokesman

His remarks came just a week ahead of the sixth round of talks between the special committee on the Chittagong Hill Tracts headed by Communications Minister Oli Ahmed and the Parbattya Chattagram Jana Sanghati Samity, the umbrella organisation of the outlawed Shantibahini insurg-

The meeting is scheduled to be held in Khagrachhari on November 24 to find out a solution to the problems in the hill tracts and pave the way for repatriation of the Chakma refugees

To a query, the Foreign Office spokesman said the governments of Bangladesh and India are cooperating with each other and pursuing the tribal refugees, now staying in the Indian state of Tripura, to return to their homeland.

But, he observed that some of the 'political leaders among the refugees' are trying to obstruct the planned repatriation for serving their interests.

On the repatriation of Rohingva refugees, the Foreign Office spokesman expressed his optimism that the process of repatriation would be accelerated following the signing of an agreement between Myanmar and the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) on November 5.

NEW DELHI, Nov 16: The Indian peninsula (sub-continent) was continuously on the move northward at the rate of 5 to 5.5 cm every year, reports

Xinhua. An observer of business and politics today quoted noted Indian Geologist K S Valdiya as saying that this motion created a constant buckling up of the Himalayas, located at the lead ing northern edge of the In-

dian plate. At the same time it caused multiple splits or crisscrossed faults all across the ranges, he

He said that the greatest one of these faults was the 200-km long fault from the southern edge of the Kashmir Valley through the Kangra region, Dehradun, Mussoorie and further east. The region was very active.

He said that the Himalayas may appear to be calm and beautiful, but they are in a constant state of tectonic agony, leading to the possibility of earthquakes.
