White House seizes NAFTA momentum on eve of vote

WASHINGTON, Nov 17: Seizing the momentum on the eve of a House showdown. President Clinton won a rush of converts Tuesday for the North American Free Trade Agreement. Opponents accused the White House of doling out billions of dollar to line up support, reports AP.

An Associated Press survey showed more than 200 House members were supporting the pact or likely to do so - a gain of roughly two dozen since the weekend. In contrast, opponents' numbers were dwindling, and also stood at roughly 200.

The rest of the 434 members were undeclared. To pass, the

measure needs 218 votes. "Tomorrow, the Congress has simply got to vote for hope over fear, for the future over the past. They've got to vote for confidence in the ability of the American people to compete and win," Clinton told the nation's governors, summoned to the White House to provide evidence of widespread support for the treaty.

World gold body to open office in Indonesia next week

JAKARTA, Nov 17: The Geneva-based World Gold Council said on Tuesday it would open a branch in Indonesia, hoping to woo inhabitants of the fourth most populous nation to buy more of the precious metal, reports Reuter.

Council members told a news conference that while Indonesia was South East Asia's largest gold market last year, with consumption of 70 tonnes. they were stin peful of expan-

Indonesia, which produced about 24 tonnes of gold in the first eight months of last year, is considered important in the council's push to raise gold consumption generally.

China to-lower import tariffs on 3,000 items

BEIJING, Nov 17: China will lower import tariffs on nearly 3,000 items starting Dec. 31 an official newspaper said

Tuesday, reports AP. The move is part of China's efforts to meet conditions for joining the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade, the international forum that pro-

motes free trade. The China Daily said the Customs Tartif Commission decided to reduce tariffs on 2,898 items to make Chinese enterprises more competitive internationally. The list was not released, but customs offi cial said it includes raw materials and equipment that are in short supply in China, the

newspaper reported. it said average tariff rates would drop from the previous 39.9 per cent to 36.4 per cent.

China has been chipping away at its complex structure of import restrictions to try to qualify for GATT membership. Many of the barriers are in the form of product specifications that can be met only be domestic manufacturers, or elab-

orate testing rules. China has signed a market access agreement with the United States that requires it to dismantle some of these import barriers over the next lew years.

Supporters say the pact would open a vast new Mexican market for American industries, creating jobs, and serve as a linchpin for broader agreements involving other countries.

Opponents, including organised labour, say thousands of jobs will be lost as American firms move factories south to take advantage of lower wages and laxer environmental standards in Mexico.

Asked if a majority of the House yet supported the accord, Clinton said, "We're getting there."

His optimism was echoed by Wednesday. Passage there leading congressional supportit to lose," said Republican leader Michel, part of an unlikely coalition of democrats and Republicans working to surmount stiff opposition from

labour-backed democrats. Clinton desended the lawmakers who have been searching for promises from the White House. "The people that I've talked.... have been nobly motivated. Most of them have taken great risks," he said.

The White House worked hard to win over the 23-member Florida delegation, with its concerns about agriculture, although several of the state's lawmakers remained uncommitted late in the day.

Clinton telephoned the state's agriculture commissioner, Bob Crawford, at dinner at his hotel Tuesday night to pitch the agreement.

Crawford, who had been an opponent of the pact met with the state's lawmakers during the day and said the administration had made "dramatic" concessions over the past several days.

Ethnic Chinese traders to face more competition in Malaysia

KUALA LUMPUR, Nov 17: Malaysia will continue to pursue its policy of positive discrimination to help its indigenous people compete with ethnic Chinese who have traditionally dominated the business sector, Finance Minister Anwar Ibrahim said yesterday, reports

Only when the indigenous Burniputras - mainly politically dominant ethnic Malays - feel secure will here be less need for government intervention in the market place, he said.

"I would say that the policy of affirmative action is a necessity here," Anwar said in response to a question at an international business confer-

But it is not a subsidy or to get people to be lazy," said

That policy gives Bumiputras privileges in business, education and government aid with the aim of ultimately ensuring them at least a 30-per cent share of corporate wealth.

Anwar said the policy was aiready beginning to bear fruit although it was still too carly to say when it will end.

"The Chinese are progressing very well now, and the Malays are doing much better than before," he said. " You are seeing a new breed of Malays

Delors urges UK business leaders to help E European competitors

HARROGATE (England), Nov 17: European commission president Jacques Delors urged British business leaders to provide technical and practical help to the competitors of eastern Europe, in a speech here on Monday, reports AFP.

And he condemned management policies based on cutting pay, in a speech read on his behalf to the annual conference of the Confederate on of British Industry (CBI) business leaders.

Delors is ill with influenza In a speech read by E C Secretary General David Williamson, he called on business leaders to allow small groups of managers from eastern Europe to visit western firms to study the way they produce goods and services.

The commission of the European Community would be prepared to pay for the travel and accommodate on expenses. "It is up to you business people to organise the programmes. he said.

The scheme was modelled on productivity missions which had been a part of the Marshall Plan to boost the European economy after World War II. Delors said. He also told CBI delegates:

"Europe's long term strategy cannot be one of competing solely on costs."

US industrial output up 0.8 in Oct

WASHINGTON, Nov 17 Industrial production shot up 0.8 per cent in October, the biggest jump in nearly a year and the fifth consecutive monthly increase, the government said Monday, reports AFP.

The increase in the Federal Reserve's industrial production index followed at 0.4 per cent rise in September.

Auto production was up 7.3 per cent in October and 3.9 per cent in September. Excluding autos, production

was up 0.4 per cent in October and 0.3 per cent in September. Industries were operating at 82.4 per cent of capacity in October, the highest since August 1990, just after the start of the recession.

If capacity exceeds 85 per cent, the result could be production bottlenecks, which in turn could lead to inflation.

Manufacturing output was up 0.9 per cent in October, the best performance this year. Durable goods production was up 1.3 per cent in October, following a one per cent increase in September.

PARIS, Nov 17: Israeli and Palestinian delegates met here on Tuesday to discuss the economic status of the West Bank and Gaza Strip under the Israeli-PLO accord on autonomy for the occupied territories, reports AFP.

Israeli Finance Minister Avraham Shohat and the head of the Palestinian team, Abu Ala, held a head-to-head meeting on Tuesday before the formal start of talks in their economic coordination commit-The committee was dis-

cussing the agenda for transfer

of economic and financial au-

thority to the Palestinians, under the Washington agreement of September 13.

Parallel political discussions between Israel and the Palestine Liberation Organisation are underway in Cairo

aimed at breaking a deadlock over security measures to be taken in the territories and the scope of an Israeli military withdrawal.

In a speech at the Paris meeting Tuesday, Abu Ala pro-posed as first agenda item the "removal of all obstacles and constraints' to development so as to encourage Arab and international investment.

He said the need was for a shift from the constraints of occupation "to a new state of mutual respect, parity, revival, recovery, and the launching of a comprehensive development process according to Palestinian plans, programmes and priorities."

Shohat said the West Bank, Gaza and Israel would only realise their full development potential through "open and unrestricted trade relations."
