Can We Lend Sufia A Hand?

Sufia now lies erippled on the 2nd floor of Ward CD of the Pangu Hospital. Her right arm and left leg have been severed under the wheels of a running train because her husband pushed her out in a fit of anger. She is also six months pregnant. This is how it happened.

Sufia, aged 22 from village Gochathata, was once an independent woman. A small trader, Sufia earned enough to make a living and support a son. Her first husband abandoned her five

years ago with one of the three children she gave birth to. Life was hard for Suffa, as it is hard for most single women who try to eke out a living for themselves without the help of a man. Yet Suffa had enough reason to thank her luck. She had managed to save Tk, 5,000, and hoped to educate her son. Sufia also dreamt of remarrying someday and settling down to a comfortable life. Her dreams were the same as any other young girl would cherish in a culture that eulogises family, children and motherhood.

A year ago sho married Fazlur Rahman, from the village next to hers. He had been courting her for the last six months and finally Sufia gave in, thinking that this would give her and her son security. She readily gave her husband the Tk 5,000 she

had judiciously saved so that he could go to the Middle East for a job. She also convinced her mother to give Tk 5,000 on loan. He promised to repay double the money and also adorn her with jewellery sarees and all the good things in life once he got his job in the Middle East.

Alas for Sufial And so much for her dream of sarees and jewels. All she got from her husband within six months of marriage was neglect and abuse, both physical and verbal. He demanded more money. He knew her mother had some in the bank and demanded she give all to him. Sufla refused to ask her mother and was beaten up

several times. She decided to leave him and told him so. About one and a half months also he convinced Sufia to come to Dhaka with him. On the train they fought violently when she told him he would not get a penny out of her even if he killed her. He pushed her out of the running train. Sufia does not remember anything after that. On regaining consciousness, she found herself in the Pangu Hospital with one hand and a leg amputated.

> The impression that one gets about her at first sight is that this s not a poor vulneraole woman who should be pitied. This is a strong tough woman who should be helped in her rehabilitation. n a situation where most women would ike to die, Sufia talks of life. She wants to give birth to the baby she is carrying and also to know who could help her to take care of it. She does not want to become a burden on society and therefore needs assistance. Her strength was amazing. Instead of being devastated by this experience, she demonstrates a quiet courage and will to survive. Asked what she would do after leaving the hospital, Sufia replied. If I could just manage to walk I would go back to my business. Suffa is a story of a

woman who was sund ving quite well on her own till a man caire und destroyed her life and has now left her make red and invalid. The hospital authorities are doing whatever they can, but with resource constraints there is urgent need for more medicines, for her wounds to heal quickly. She will also need prosthesis to be able to walk again.

The other question is legal and moral. When will our society issue a clear message that violence against women is not acceptable and that the law will come down very strongly against anyone who think they can beat, abuse, mutilate women with impunity.?

economic mismanagement and wrong policies of the past autocratic regime had aggravated the problem of unemployment in the country over the last one decade, reports BSS.

The State Minister said considering the unemployment problem as "alarming" the present government had taken a package programme to create opportunities for selfemployment and thereby save the nation from the curse of unemployment.

Addressing a seminar on "national and international assistance for self-employment in Bangladesh" here, Rahman said schemes taken to create self-employment opportunities included pisciculture, dairy farming and small and cottage industry.

Organised by Bangladesh Karma Sangsthan Sangha, the seminar was also addressed by Deputy Governor of Bangladesh Bank Shah Abdul Hannan, High Commissioner of Malaysia Ahmed Fuzi Bin Haji Abdul Razzak, Prof Abu Ahmed and the office-bearers of the sangstha.

Malaysian Commissioner Ahmed Fuzi Bin Haji Abdul Razzak said his country would continue to recruit skilled and semi-skilled workers from Bangladesh.

He indicated that Malaysia would recruit about 70,000 workers from Bangladesh in the coming year.

Razzak said Malaysia was satisfied with the Bangladeshi workers and added "they are better workers than people from other parts of the world."

State Minister for Finance economic and industrial Mojibur Rahman yesterday said growth of the Malaysia," the

high commissioner said. The State Minister said it was late President Ziaur Rahman, who for the first time had undertaken programmes for creating self-employment opportunities. Continuation of those policies would have made the situation different now, he said.

He said the Bangladesh Krishi Bank and the Rajshahi Krishi Unnayan Bank had already been directed to extend loans in liberal and soft terms for undertaking small ventures in those fields

He recalled that the programme of cultivation of HYV varieties of paddy like IRRI and Boro by the Zia-government had led the nation for attaining almost self-sufficiency in food.

Rahman said through providing a package of incentives the present government was also trying to attract foreign investment for quick industrialisation of the country to create additional employment opportunities.

In this connection, he said the frequent hartal calls by a section of opposition political parties were discouraging foreign entrepreneurs to make investment in Bangladesh.

He said problem of unemployment could not be solved overnight and stressed the need for a concerned effort both by the government, the private sector and other organisations to solve this gigantic problem.
