White House seizes NAFTA momentum on eve of vote

WASHINGTON, Nov 17: Seizing the momentum on the eve of a House showdown. President Clinton won a rush of converts Tuesday for the North American Free Trade Agreement. Opponents accused the White House of doling out billions of dollar to line up support, reports AP.

An Associated Press survey showed more than 200 House members were supporting the pact or likely to do so - a gain of roughly two dozen since the weekend. In contrast, opponents' numbers were dwindling, and also stood at roughly 200.

The rest of the 434 members were undeclared. To pass, the

measure needs 218 votes. "Tomorrow, the Congress has simply got to vote for hope over fear, for the future over the past. They've got to vote for confidence in the ability of the American people to compete and win," Clinton told the nation's governors, summoned to the White House to provide evidence of widespread support for the treaty.

World gold body to open office in Indonesia next week

JAKARTA, Nov 17: The Geneva-based World Gold Council said on Tuesday it would open a branch in Indonesia, hoping to woo inhabitants of the fourth most populous nation to buy more of the precious metal, reports Reuter.

Council members told a news conference that while indonesia was South East Asia's largest gold market last year, with consumption of 70 tonnes. they were stin peful of expan-

Indonesia, which produced about 24 tonnes of gold in the first eight months of last year, is considered important in the council's push to raise gold consumption generally.

China to-lower import tariffs on 3,000 items

BEIJING, Nov 17: China will lower import tariffs on nearly 3,000 items starting Dec. 31 an official newspaper said Tuesday, reports AP.

The move is part of China's efforts to meet conditions for joining the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade, the international forum that promotes free trade.

The China Daily said the Customs Tariff Commission decided to reduce tariffs on 2,898 items to make Chinese enterprises more competitive internationally. The list was not released, but customs offi cial said it includes raw mate rials and equipment that are in short supply in China, the newspaper reported.

it said average tariff rates would drop from the previous 39.9 per cent to 36.4 per cent.

China has been chipping away at its complex structure of import restrictions to try to qualify for GATT membership. Many of the barriers are in the form of product specifications that ean be met only be domestic manufacturers, or elab-

orate testing rules. China has signed a market access agreement with the United States that requires it to dismantle some of these import barriers over the next lew years.

Ethnic Chinese traders to face more competition in Malaysia

KUALA LUMPUR, Nov 17 Malaysia will continue to pursue its policy of positive discrimination to help its indigenous people compete with ethnic Chinese who have traditionally dominated the business sector. Finance Minister Anwar Ibrahim said yesterday, reports

Only when the indigenous Burniputras - mainly politically dominant ethnic Malays - feel secure will here be less need for government intervention in the market place, he said.

"I would say that the policy of affirmative action is a necessity here," Anwar said in response to a question at an international business confer-

But it is not a subsidy or to get people to be lazy," said Anwar.

That policy gives Bumiputras privileges in business, education and government aid with the aim of ultimately ensuring them at least a 30-per cent share of corporate wealth.

Anwar said the policy was aiready beginning to bear fruit although it was still too carly to say when it will end.

The Chinese are progressing very well now, and the Malays are doing much better than before," he said. " You are seeing a new breed of Malays
