Tk 70cr Establishment Ministry projects completed

Establishment Ministry has so far completed six major development projects at a cost of Tk about 70 crore since independence of Bangladesh, reports BSS.

The projects including the construction of Bangladesh Public Administration Training Centre (BPATC) at Savar. The other projects are construction of four regional PATC at Dhaka, Chittagong, Rajshahi and Khulna, establishment of personal management information system and management services wing at Bangladesh Secretariat, construction of Central Transport Pool Complex, BMRE of BG Press, and installation of equipment at the three government presses.

This was informed at the 16th meeting of the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Establishment Ministry at Jatiya Sangsad yesterday.

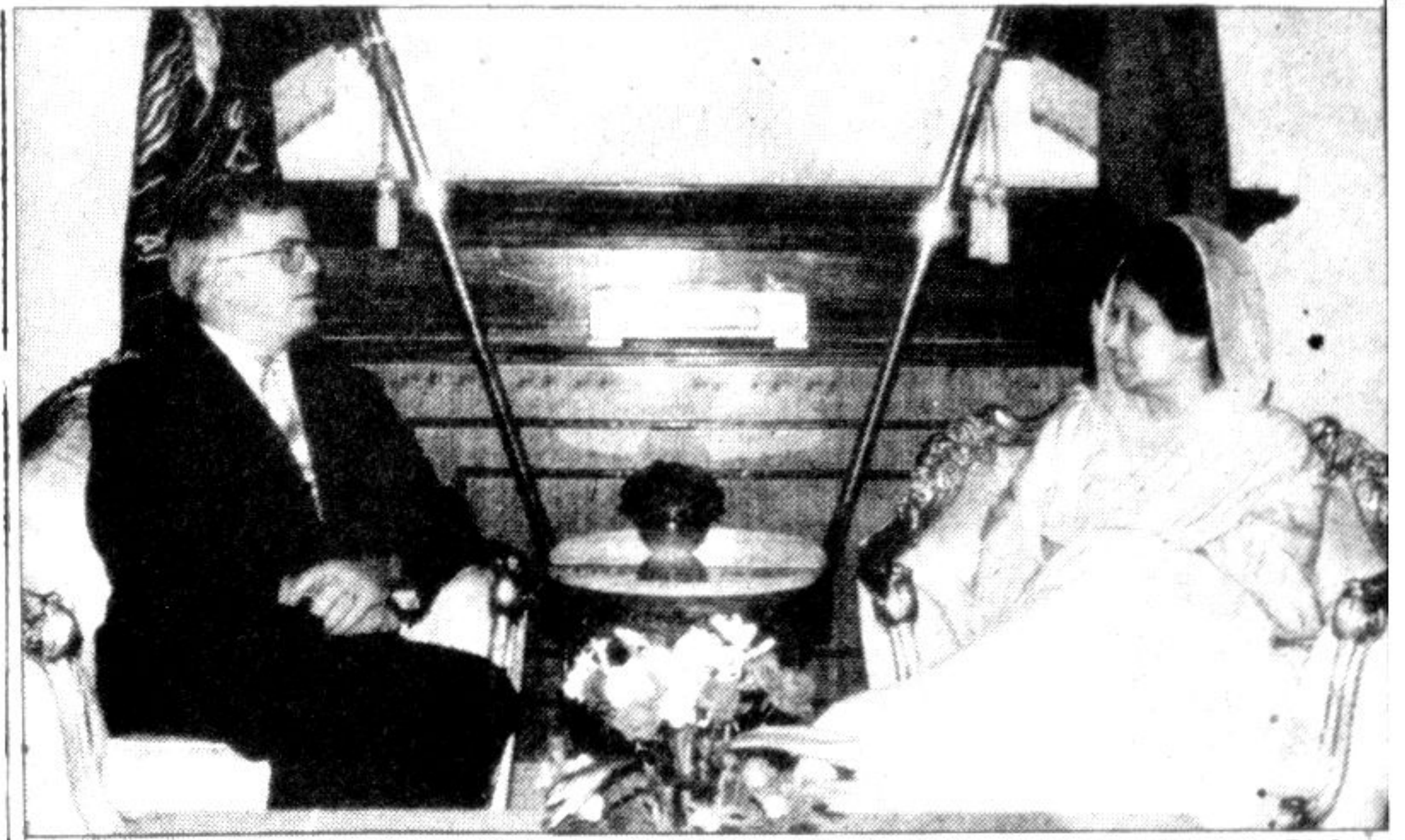
Deputy Leader of the House Prof AQM Badruddoza Chowdhury, LGRD and Cooperatives Minister Abdus Salam Talukder, Works Minister Barrister Rafiqul Islam Miah, Education Minister Barrister Jamiruddin Sircar, Awami League MP Syeda Sajeda Chowdhury, Jatiya Party MP Dr TM Fazle Rabbi Chowdhury and Md Shamsuddoha MP (CPB) participated in the meeting while it was chaired by State Minister for Establishment Barrister Md Aminul Hoque.

Establishment Secretary Habibur Rahman, BPATC Rector Kazi Mohammad Manzoor-e-Mowla, Director-General of BCS (Admn) Academy Dr Fazlul Hasan Yusuf and concerned officials were present.

The meeting was informed that due to the non-availability of fund, a few development projects of this ministry have not yet been implemented. However some development projects are being implemented under normal ADP.

The meeting underscored the need for improving and time-befitting the training to public servants to establish an effective, efficient and transparent administration. The meeting asked the BPATC and BCS (Admn) Academy authorities to submit a report before the committee with recommendation for increasing the effectiveness of the training. The members of the committee also asked the authorities to submit another report on the assessment scores of the trainees and their subsequent placement and improvement in their working fields.

The members of the committee also gave directives to the authorities to take measures to ensure full participation of the officials in the training courses.

Dhaka Day by Day

Promoting Designer Panjabis

An array of panjabi collection

Bengalis call it *panjabi* and Panjabis call it *Bangali kurta* nobody seems to want to claim this garment as his own. Yet the *panjabi* or *kurta*, whatever you want to call it, has been the most common male clothing in the sub continent. Whether it is a Bangali Babu over his *dhuti*, the Maulana Sahib over his *pajamas* or your next door neighbour over his jeans, the *panjabi* is regarded as an anytime wear. The *panjabi* of old used to be confined to light sombre colours — stark white, off white or beige at the most. Nowadays panjabis come in a wide range of colours and designs reflecting the more bold and fashionable male of the nineties.

The two-day *panjabi* exhibition held at the Alliance Francaise on November 11th and 12th reflected this new trend. With colourful, intricate patterns on soft luxuriant fabrics the 'panjabis' defied the old image of being the outfit of the unimaginative, conservative male. The exhibition organized by Blue Eyes and Pride Textiles was geared to promote the latest concept of designer *panjabis*. Each piece was different from the other and had unique designs.

Amongst this remarkable collection was an off-white *khaddar* creation with a complicated wooden bead work that was ornate enough to be worn on formal occasions such as weddings or dinners. Then there was the beige raw silk *kurta* with golden *zari* and bead work — dressy even for a woman. In fact, explained Iftakar Khalid, advisor to Blue Eyes, most of the *panjabis* were unisex and were equally popular with the women. For occasions such as 'milads' or more casual ones like lunches, there were the cream, or beige *panjabis* in soft cotton or *khaddar* with beautiful chocolate or mustard embroidery for the classic mughal look. Although not on display, these *panjabis* were available in a variety of colours — mauve, maroon, sky blue and even magenta. For the white lover, there were milky white cotton *kurtas* with white polka dots, stripes or checks embossed on them and white embroidery on the collar. Costs ranged between Tk 900 to 1800.

But it was the collection of flamboyant coat-

ies or *sadris* that took the show. It included multi coloured waist-coats in cream raw silk with patches of magenta, olive green, saffron and navy blue topped off with outlining *zari* work. If this seemed a little too decorative for the suave male taste, Khalid assured that it was not: "many men wear this kind of thing nowadays, it is ideal for festive occasions".

Other versions of this design included an off white piece with beaded work against a backdrop of sea green, light mauve and off-white and a cotton *coat* with *zari* work over mustard, salmon and olive green silk. For a more dramatic look were the handpainted waist-coats in pastel green and olive green or mauve. For the environmental buff was an interesting looking *sadri* in beige and off-white with black patterns — made of pure jute.

The fabrics which included mainly pure cotton, *khaddar* raw silk and silk mixed, were from Norshingi, Tangail and Narayanganj.

The idea introducing designer *panjabis* came out in November 91 when four young men in their thirties decided to do business together. At that time these coming entrepreneurs were either studying or involved in small business ventures. Kazi Jainul Islam Bappi the owner of Blue Eyes decided that it was time to start a business of designer clothes made locally. Although Blue Eyes has its own collection of shirts, dresses and other garments, it is the *panjabis* that have become really popular. During Eid festivals a big display is arranged to attract the crowds. This is why the exhibition took place in the 'off season' for *panjabis*: to attract the Eid market. Blue Eyes has its own designers who get ideas from Pakistan and India, modifies them into their own designs and then instruct the tailors. The result is a unique collection of *panjabis* and *sadris* with designs that can't be seen in any other boutique.

The exhibition with its wide collection of designs reflected the varying tastes in men's wear. From simple, understated patterns to dramatic, flamboyant styles the show had something for everyone. It also promoted the *panjabi* as the latest in designer wear.

'Master plan for Matamuhuri Irrigation Project a must'

CHITTAGONG, Nov 20: Member of Jatiya Sangsad M R Enamul Huq today called upon the government to take necessary steps to explore and exploit vast natural resources of Chakararia thana in Cox's Bazar, reports BSS.

Addressing a press conference at a hotel here, he said, utilisation of the sweet water from the river Matamuhuri for irrigation, increased shrimp and salt production as well as development of forest resources and internal communications system of Chakararia will facilitate increased revenue income from the area.

He said that a master plan for the Matamuhuri River Irrigation Project should be drawn up immediately.

He said, construction of water control structures at four places of the river will facilitate irrigation of over 60,000 acres

of land during the dry season which will enable the farmers to produce more than two lakh tons of rice, worth over Tk 150 crore per annum.

Enamul Huq said, there are 20 thousand acres of land under shrimp cultivation projects in Chakararia thana and by introducing semi-intensive shrimp culture, shrimp worth Tk 150 crore can be produced annually. Electrification of shrimp projects is necessary to obtain this end, he added.

He further added, production of salt on 8,000 acres in Chakararia thana can be doubled by applying modern methods of salt production and advancing loans to salt producers.

Waz mahfil held

Korean Film Festival opens

A three-day long Korean Film Festival '93 marking the 20th anniversary of the establishment of diplomatic ties between Bangladesh and Korea was formally inaugurated yesterday by the Minister for Information Barrister Nazmul Huda at the Bangladesh National Museum auditorium in the city, says a press release.

The inaugural ceremony, jointly organised by Bangladesh Film Archive and the Embassy of the Republic of Korea in Dhaka was also attended, among others, by the information Secretary Nooruddin A Almasood and the Ambassador to Bangladesh Sung Oh Shin.

Speaking on the occasion as chief guest Barrister Nazmul Huda said that this event would further strengthen the bonds of mutual understanding existing between Bangladesh and the Republic of Korea and go long towards bringing the two peoples closer. Information Secretary Nooruddin A Almasood presided over the inaugural function which was also addressed by the Ambassador.

The Korean Ambassador in his remarks said that this film festival was a memorable occasion since it marked the 20th anniversary of the establishment of diplomatic ties between Korea and Bangladesh.

Four noted Korean feature films in addition to two documentary ones will be screened at the National Museum.
