guest, State Minister for Science and Technology Prof M A Mannan said the government had attached the highest priority on development of female education.

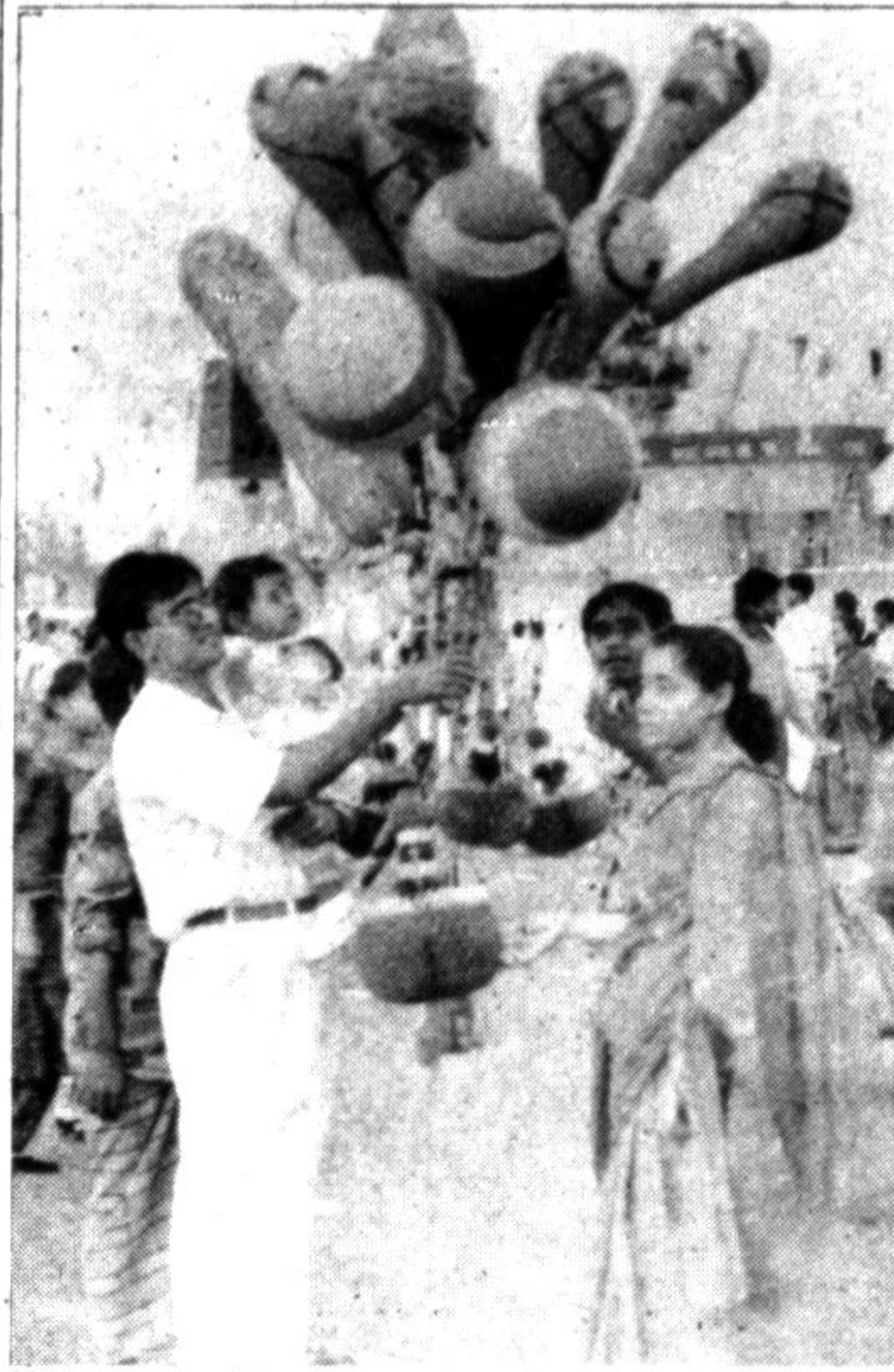
He also called upon the students to become worthy citizens of the society.

**Post-natal death rate targeted at 4.5, JS told**

The government has set a target of reducing the post-natal death rate from the existing 5.7 to 4.5 (per thousand) by the year 1995. State Minister for Health and Family Welfare Sirajul Haq told the Jatiya Sangsad yesterday.

To achieve the goal, he said, during the question-answer hour, that Tk 18 is spent for food for each patient at the country's all hospital including the PG hospital. However, Tk 22 and Tk 25 are spent for every patient at the paying bed and cabin respectively.

According to the minister, one midwife for each of those centres were being trained for successful delivery. Satellite clinics have been spread over at different localities for the benefits of the pregnant mothers.

The House was also told, during the question-answer hour, that Tk 18 is spent for food for each patient at the country's all hospital including the PG hospital. However, Tk 22 and Tk 25 are spent for every patient at the paying bed and cabin respectively.
