

## District roundup

**BARISAL**  
**PHED sinks over 39000 tubewells**  
 Nov 22: The Public Health Engineering Department (PHED) has completed the sinking of 22,100 shallow and 17,226 deep tubewells for supplying pure drinking water to rural areas in three PHED divisions under Barisal circle between the fiscal 1987-88 and 1992-93, reports BSS.  
 The area covers the districts of Barisal, Jhalakati, Pirojpur and Bhola under Barisal division, Patuakhali and Barguna under Patuakhali division and Faridpur, Rajbari, Gopalganj, Madaripur and Shariatpur under Faridpur division.  
 Besides, 1,451 Tara pumps were installed in Faridpur division, and 1,204 shallow shrouded (SS), very shallow shrouded (VS) and pond sand filter (PSF) tubewells were installed in Jhalakati, Pirojpur and Barguna districts during the period.  
 A total of Taka 104, 581,000 were spent for the implementation of these projects in the circle, and official source said.

**MYMENSINGH**  
**International Aboriginal yr inaugurated**  
 Nov 22: A two-day function was inaugurated at the Women's Complex here Saturday to observe the international aboriginal year, reports UNB.  
 Organised by Tribal Welfare Association the inaugural function was attended by Barrister Mainul Hossain as chief guest. Promad Mankin, MP, presided over the function.  
 The speakers expressed their resentment over the government's view that "there was no need to officially observe the international aboriginal year as aboriginals in the country had no problems."

They demanded constitutional safeguard for protection of the cultural and ethnic traditions of the aboriginals.  
 A colourful rally was brought out in the town after the inaugural function.  
 The functions included holding of rally, seminar, exhibitions and cultural functions.  
 About 5,000 Garos, Hajongs, Kuchs, Balus, Hadis, Banais and Barmans participated in the function.

**PATUAKHALI**  
**Private school starts functioning**  
 Nov 22: A new educational institution, named Eakub Ali Sharif College, is going to start functioning at Boga Bandar at Bauphal thana in the district next January, says UNB.  
 According to report, Dr Eakub Ali, a pathologist of IPGMR who hails from the locality will bear the expenses of the establishment of the college.  
 Sources said the construction work of the college is going on in full swing and is expected to be completed by December next.  
 Mentionable that at present there are five affiliated colleges in the thana.

**FARIDPUR**  
**24 school buildings under construction**  
 Nov 22: Construction works of a three-room academic building each in 24 non-government high schools in 24 thanas of greater Faridpur region have been started by the Facilities Department, says UNB.  
 Official source said government has sanctioned Taka 18.76 crore for the project which is scheduled to be completed within the current financial year.  
 The sources further said one non-government school from Goulunda, Maksudpur and Goshairhat thanas would be brought under the programme in near future.  
 Another report adds: A seminar on 'Health and Education for All' was held at the DC's conference room recently.  
 DC of Faridpur, K M Nurul Huda attended the seminar as chief guest while Civil Surgeon of Faridpur Dr Kazi Syed Ahmed chaired.

Director of Publicity and Co-ordination Jahanara Hossain and Principal of Faridpur Law College also attended as special guests.  
 The seminar was also addressed by District Information Officers Monzur Ahmed Khan, Deputy Director Abu Iqbal Md Yunus, Asst Prof of Faridpur Medical College Dr Md Badrud-din.

**SAVAR**  
**One killed, 4 injured in road mishap**  
 Nov 22: A truck helper was killed and four others were injured, two of them seriously, when the truck fell into a roadside ditch on Nabinagar-Kaliko road early Saturday, says UNB.  
 Police and witnesses said that Abdul Jalil (35) died on the spot when the truck, carrying sand, fell into a roadside ditch and turned turtle after the driver lost control at Ganakbari at 5 am.  
 The body was sent to Dhaka Medical College Hospital for autopsy.  
 The two seriously injured labourers were also admitted to the DMCH.  
 Police seized the truck but its driver fled away.

**KUSHTIA**  
**3 commit suicide**  
 Nov 22: Three young women allegedly committed suicide in three separate incidents in sadar thana of the district on Sunday, reports UNB.  
 The victims were identified as Arzina (18), daughter of Mongol Mandol of village Nandi, Shyamoli (16), daughter of Yazuddin of village Kandaradia and Jahanara (28), wife of Uk-luiddin of village Ujagram.  
 The reasons behind the suicides could not be known immediately. Three cases were filed with sadar police.  
 Another report from Satkhira adds: Morzina (20), mother of a child was allegedly killed by her husband Khodabakhsh of Elachar village on Sunday.  
 According to family sources, Morzina was being tortured by her husband for the last few months for non-payment of dowry. On the fateful day when she refused to pay the dowry the cruel husband strangled her to death.

**SIRAJGANJ**  
**Indian sarees worth Tk 2.10 lakh seized**  
 Nov 22: Police recovered 1,111 pieces of smuggled Indian sarees worth about Taka 2.10 lakh from Shimuldia and Kunkunia villages in Kazipur thana on Sunday night, says UNB.  
 Acting on a tip, police raided the house of Shahjahan and Salmuddin of village Shimuldia and recovered 79 pieces of Indian sarees. Later, they raided houses of Mokbul, Fazlur Rahman, German and Razzak of village Kunkunia and recovered 1032 pieces of sarees.  
 Police arrested German and Razzak from the spot.  
 Two separate cases were filed with the police.

**FENI**  
**CI sheets for cyclone victims**  
 Nov 22: Distribution of 27,480 bundles of CI sheets among the cyclone affected people of the three districts of greater Noakhali has been started, reports UNB.  
 Official sources said 6,000 bundles were allocated for five thanas of Feni district, 17,480 bundles for Noakhali district and 4,000 bundles for Laxmipur district.  
 The CI sheets are being distributed across the country under the cyclone rehabilitation programme with Saudi help.  
 Distribution of 1702 bundles of CI sheets has been started in Sonagazi thana, 1430 bundles in Parshuram thana, 700 bundles in Chhagalnaiya, 774 bundles in Dagonbhuiyan and 312 bundles for Feni paurasava.  
 In the meantime, distribution of CI sheet has already been started in Sonagaji and Parshuram thanas.  
 Government has also allocated another 1000 bundles of CI sheets for five thanas of Feni district under the flood rehabilitation programme. Work for listing the affected families has already been started.

**COMILLA**  
**2nd place in performing surgical contraception**  
 Nov 22: The Comilla district in a country-wide intensive family planning drive secured the first place in Chittagong division and second in the country in performance of surgical contraception, reports UNB.  
 Official sources said the intensive drive began on October 25 and ended on 31.  
 The district performed 373 tubectomy and 52 vasectomy cases during the period.

## Inter-city express trains run as local trains

RANGPUR, Nov 22: The inter-city express trains running between Rangpur and Dhaka have now become local trains causing sufferings to thousands of passengers.  
 The trains carry passengers without tickets beyond the capacity, maintain no time-table and lack amenities.  
 The inter-city Teesta and Ekota express trains were introduced to ply between Dhaka and Rangpur-Dinajpur region a few years back with a commitment to carry the genuine passengers providing them required comforts and amenities during their journey on this long route.  
 It is surprising that in the recent days the inter-city mail trains have lost their characteristics.  
 \* All the compartments are packed-up by passengers without tickets and goods. The toilets turn dirty spreading bad smell. The food available in the trains and ferries are much costly and are of low standard. The attendants are not now found at their respective compartments to render services to the passengers. It is alleged.  
 The irregularities have been causing immense sufferings to the passengers travelling everyday on this long route procuring tickets of these inter-city trains to enjoy a comfortable journey.  
 The beggars and the vendors are aggravating the situation on this long route. The railway personnel on duty look at them without making any resistance.  
 The journey by long route coaches has been drawing large number of the people now-a-days following anomalies in the inter-city train services.

### House wife commits suicide

SATKHIRA, Nov 21: A pregnant young housewife of Kaladurgapur in Kaliganj thana allegedly committed suicide by taking poison on Monday, reports UNB.  
 The victim, Puspa Rani (20) embraced Islam, took her name as Rokeya and got married with Jahidul Islam of the same village two years back.

## Reconstruction of 260 primary schools going on

BARISAL, Nov 22: Local Government Engineering Department Barisal, has been implementing 383 projects in Barisal district at an allocation of Tk 12,59,45,000 during the current fiscal year, reports BSS.  
 According to an official source, the projects included reconstruction of 117 registered non-government primary schools, 143 government primary schools, and repair of 123 government primary schools.  
 The Asian Development Bank (ADB) has been financing the projects, the source added.  
 Meanwhile, on an average 50 per cent work of these projects has been completed.  
 Another report says: A week-long eye camp concluded at the diabetic centre of Barisal under the joint auspices of Comilla Kalyan Samity and Lions Club of Barisal on Wednesday.  
 The camp was inaugurated by Professor Md Bakher Ali Mian. It was presided over by Prof Md Kudrat-e-Khoda.  
 A total of 34 cataract patients was operated upon and 800 patients were given treatment. Medicine and spectacles were supplied free of cost.  
 The concluding function was attended by A M Rashid, Divisional Commissioner and Mamtaz Uddin, Deputy Commissioner.  
 Meanwhile, State Minister for Education Principal M Eunus Khan said here that the development of the country was possible only through the development of the villages and ensuring the excellent livelihood of the toiling masses.  
 He said, the present government is firmly determined to fulfil the fundamental demands of the people irrespective of religion.

## Imam loses job for adopting FP methods

SIRAJGANJ, Nov 22: An Imam of Dorota Mosque of Dorota village in sadar thana has lost his job for allegedly adopting family planning methods, reports UNB.  
 The ill-fated Imam Moulana Romjan Ali (50) has been working for 18 years in Dorota Mosque.  
 The Imam in a written petition to the Deputy Director of Family Planning demanded immediate enquiry into the matter that led his termination for adopting family planning methods. He also demanded legal action against the Mosque Committee.  
 It is learnt that the village elders and the Masjid Committee could not accept the Imam's decision in favour of the family planning programme and a few days back they terminated him from the job.  
 Meanwhile, the local administration has asked the Thana Family Planning Officer to probe into the matter immediately.  
 The matter has created sensation in the area.

## Bus dacoity, huge cash robbed

CHITTAGONG, Nov 21: Daring road dacoities were committed on the Arakan Sanak road of Chittagong-Cox's Bazar highway near Moulavir Dakan of Satkania thana on Tuesday, reports UNB.  
 Police said a group of armed dacoits numbering 20, committed dacoities in eight to nine buses and trucks by putting up barricade.

## BNP leader's house attacked

PABNA, Nov 22: Rift in local BNP widened further when a rival group attacked the residence of district general secretary of the party Shahjahan Ali, Sunday, reports UNB.  
 Ali, who is a public prosecutor, said a group of people patronised by BNP vice-president Azizur Rahman and Sirajul Islam MP attacked his Shibpur residence in the town at 6-30 Sunday morning with fire arms.  
 Police confirmed the incident but did not arrest anyone till late in the evening.

## BAU officers on six-day work abstention to realise demands

MYMENSINGH, Nov 22: Administrative activities of Bangladesh Agricultural University came to a halt Sunday due to work abstention by the officers of the University, reports BSS.  
 Bangladesh Agricultural University Officers' Association observed the work abstention at the call of Bangladesh Inter-University Officers' Federation to press for its two-point demand, said a press release.  
 A six-day work abstention programme by the officers of the country's seven universities began on Saturday.  
 The Federation demands modification of pay scales for university officers and their representation in different authoritative bodies, including senate and syndicate.  
 The BAU Officers' Association at a meeting Sunday with its president Alhaj Md Ziaul Islam in the chair demanded immediate implementation of the two-point demand. They also condoned the death of renowned educationist Prof Abdul Quddus, an ex-Dean of Animal Husbandry Faculty of BAU.  
 The Association expressed its deep sympathy to the members of the bereaved family and prayed for the departed soul.

## Road now open to traffic

TANGAIL, Nov 22: The 10-kilometer Bhatkura-Bashail Road in Tangail district is now open to traffic three months ahead of the scheduled time, reports UNB.  
 The road, a part of 285-km feeder road improvement project has been constructed in 33 months at a cost of Taka 12.45 crore.  
 The feeder road is nearing completion in the districts of greater Mymensingh involving a cost of Taka 362.88 crore.  
 The Asian Development Bank (ADB) assisted project is being implemented under 12 contracts of which Bhatkura-Bashail Road is the first completed one, said a PID handout.  
 The road is linking Bashail — one of the remotest thanas of greater Mymensingh which was hitherto devoid of road link and disconnected from any revenue route with Dhaka-Tangail Highway. It was constructed by a local construction firm using local ingredients and indigenous technology.  
 The road has a 600 feet permanent bridge over Northkhola river and eighteen box-culverts.  
 He said, new roads are the heralds of progress. They offer employment during the construction phase and improve access for local people to important facilities and public utilities as soon as they are completed, he added.  
 He called upon all political parties to shun the path of indiscriminate hartals and strikes and join hands with the government for country's speedy development.  
 Deputy Speaker of Jatiya Sangsad Humayun Khan Panni and Chief Engineer of Roads Highway department, Ataur Rahman also spoke on the occasion. Local MPs and elite were present.
