**JESSORE**  
**Tk 1.62 crore uplift plan undertaken**

Nov 24: Water Development Board, Jessore division, will implement four projects under food for works programme during the current fiscal year with an allocation of 2500 metric tons of wheat worth about Taka 1.62 crore, reports BSS.

These schemes are re-excavation of a nine km canal under Kalidaskhali-Arpara flood control and drainage project in Salikha thana with 300 mt of wheat, re-excavation of 10 km portion of Betua river in Sarsa thana with the involvement of 1000 mt of wheat, re-excavation of a 6.8 km canal under Singla nebugati beel drainage scheme in Abhaynagar thana with 200 mts of wheat and re-sectioning of 20 km flood control embankment under Chenchuri Beel drainage scheme in Kalia and Narail thanas with the utilisation of 1000 mts of wheat.

Works of all these schemes have started by this time and the progress is 20 per cent on an average.

When completed, a vast tract of land of these thanas will get irrigation facilities for the production of additional quantities of foodgrains annually. Besides the area will be saved from saline water menace.

**NATORE**  
**Schools face accommodation, fund crisis**

Nov 24: Most of the high schools in six thanas and two pourashavas of the district have been facing numerous problems including shortage of teachers, educational appliances, accommodation and fund, says UNB.

About one lakh students of three government and 112 non-government high schools, and 19 junior high schools in the district have been taking their lessons under a lot of problems.

Many of the schools lack adequate classrooms and furniture which compelled them to take lessons amid great difficulties. Due to want of science laboratories and libraries most of the schools could not provide practical lessons to the science students. Want of equipment also hampers the education of the students.

Some 200 posts of teachers are lying vacant in different schools of the district affecting the normal teaching.

Many school building are in dilapidated conditions. Scarcity of drinking water is also reported from many schools.

Local leaders urged the authorities to take immediate measures to solve these problems for better education of the rural students.

**Tk 75,000 robbed**

Nov 24: Dacoits looted cash and valuables worth about Taka 75,000 from the house of a food officer in Daulatpur thana on Sunday, reports UNB.

Police said a gang of armed dacoits stormed the house of officer-in-charge of local food godown by breaking open the door and looted gold ornaments and cash.

A case has been filed with the local police in this connection.

In another incident a theft was committed in the house of Haji Mozammel Huq of Bilgathura village in the same thana on Sunday night.

Thieves entered the house by breaking the lock and took away 10 tolas of gold worth about Taka 60,000. A case has been filed with the police.

**COMILLA**  
**One awarded 7 yrs RI for robbery**

Nov 24: A man has been awarded seven years rigorous imprisonment with a fine of Taka 2,000, in default, to suffer one year more for committing dacoity, says UNB.

The case, in brief, was that about 10 to 12 dacoits raided the house of Subedar Makbul Hussain of Kalagan in Chandina thana, beat the inmates and looted cash, ornaments and other valuables worth Taka 20,000 on January 27, 1992.

A case was filed and police, after investigation, submitted charge-sheet against three people.

The court after examining the witnesses and records jailed Rakibuddin Bhuiyan alias Tuheen for seven years and acquitted Abdul Matin and Raquul Islam in a recent judgement.

The prosecution was conducted by Advocate Sharafat Ali while advocates Abu Taher Sarker and Abdul Jalil appeared for the defence.

**15 commit suicide in 90 days**

Nov 24: At least 15 people, including nine women, allegedly committed suicide in the last three months in Sadar thana, police sources said, reports UNB.

The victims were identified as Lucky (17) of Shalgaria, Sujan (13) of Radhanagar, Rafique (22) of Nayamoti, Latif Molah (30) of Hamidpur, Shirin Khatun (25) of Vurempara, Rubi Khatun (20) of Ataikula, Shefali (30) of Chorghosur, Monjil Mia (27) of Varara, Rupali (15) of Arifpur, Nurunnahar (22) of Mahendrapur, Abdus Samad (30) of Naldah, Mayna Khatun (3) of Bakshipur and Sabina Yasmin (18) of Shalgaria.

Hospital sources said poverty, failure in love affairs, family feud, torture and unhappy family life were the main reasons behind the suicide.

Village elders said the tendency to commit suicide in the district is increasing day by day.

**NOAKHALI**  
**Tk 40 crore road reconstruction programme**

Nov 24: Reconstruction of four important roads in Noakhali and Laksmipur districts has started with the financial assistance from Asian Development Bank, reports UNB.

According to official sources, Sonapur-Khasherhat road, Khasherhat-Charbata road, Hatya-Jahajmara road of Noakhali district and Laksmipur-Alexander road of Laksmipur district, measuring about 95 Km long will be repaired under the post cyclone rehabilitation programme.

A total of Taka 40 crore will be spent for the implementation of the programme. The work will start from the next month and is expected to be completed by the end of the next year.

With the implementation of the programme, road communication in rural areas of both the district will be improved to a great extent.

**50 JCD activists join BCL**

Nov 24: About 50 JCD activists led by former VP of Tengalaha RIM Degree College Students' Union Asrafur Kabir joined Awami League backed Chhatra League in Kazipur thana on Monday, says UNB.

They decided to join BCL after the recent JCD factional clash. The clash ensued when both the factions — one led by Palash and other by Asrafur Kabir — announced two separate panels for the coming elections of Tengalaha RIM Degree College Students' Union to be held on December 6.

Supporters of both the factions brought out separate processions on the campus, chased and attacked each other with hockey sticks which left four injured, including Asrafur Kabir.

After the clash the faction led by Asrafur Kabir joined the Chhatra League (M-I) at a simple ceremony in presence of AL Kazipur unit president Abdul Hannan Talukder, said an AL press release.

Injured Asrafur Kabir (25), Anwar Hussain (24), Bablu (22) and Jahangir (20) were released after first aid, witnesses said.

Meanwhile, two factions of JCD activists ransacked Kazipur BNP office Monday when local BNP leaders turned down their proposal to observe the "protest day" on the alleged attack by Chhatra League on JCD last year.

On November 21, last year, Chhatra League activists attacked JCD leader Rabiul Karim Hasan and chopped his led, JCD sources said.

**One killed, another hurt in road mishap**

Nov 24: A youngman was killed and another wounded in a road mishap near Monica cinema hall on Habiganj-Shayestaganj road on Monday morning, reports UNB.

Police said a Habiganj bound bus coming from Madhabpur hit a rickshaw near the cinema hall at 7 am killing rickshaw passenger Alauddin (25) of Sultanshi village in Sadar thana on the spot.

Rickshawpuller, Jalal Mia (32) was rushed to the Sadar hospital in a serious condition.

The driver of the bus managed to flee with his vehicle. A case has been filed with the local police.

## 5000 acres of land remain fallow for siltation

GAIBANDHA, Nov 24: About five thousand acres of cultivable land have turned into desert due to heavy siltation at Gaibandha sadar, Fulchhari, Shaghata and Sunderganj thanas.

Huge quantity of sands are accumulated on the upper surface of land after breaching the flood control embankments at different points. The deposited layer of sand will be one to three feet thick. As a result, fertile lands have now become almost unfit for the cultivation of crops consequently a large number of marginal farmers have turned into destitutes.

According to the assessment of Agriculture Department, due to siltation, the district is unable to produce crops worth about Tk five hundred crore.

During the past years, flood control embankments at various points along the river Teesta and Brahmaputra were washed away by the surging water. The water with sand from the river bed flooded the

crop land through the breaches of embankments which ultimately were deposited and damaged the fertility of arable crop land.

During this season, more areas went under the sand layer due to wide spread erosion of the river Brahmaputra at Rasoolpur under sadar thanas in which about 15-kilometre long embankment areas were eroded away by the river.

Poor peasants, who once survived on growing crops on these vast tract of land, have now been forced to beg on the streets.

**Sugarcane crushing starts**

Rangpur Sugar Mills Ltd went into production recently. The cane crushing was formally inaugurated by age-old cane cultivator Mowlana Rastuddin and senior labour Lokman Biswas. Earlier on this occasion, a public gathering was held at the mills compound where Taher Ahmed, General Manager, Md Ali, President

Labour Union, Emdadul Huq and Moslemuddin addressed the gathering. General Manager called upon all to render co-operation to bring the industry a profitable one.

This year recovery rate of sugar was fixed at 8.40 per cent. Production target of sugar was fixed at 12,050 metric tons by crushing 1,43,450 metric tons of cane.

Diarrhoeal disease has claimed another 11 lives at Mallbari area under sadar thana last one week and 150 more have been attacked with the disease. The victims were identified as Nasiruddin (50), Mokbul Hossain Akanda (32), Jamiruddin Tarafder (30), Halima Begum (55), Liton (8), Moslema (6), Rabeya (2), Mofijun Bewya (65), Azena (40), Nasim (5), and Kalam (13).

Eight persons died at Baxir Khamer village. According to local people, contaminated drinking water and food poisoning are the main reasons of spread of the disease.

## National policy soon for handicapped

COMILLA, Nov 24: A five-day orientation workshop aimed at providing training to parents, social workers and teachers opened here on Sunday with call for larger involvement of the people in upholding the rights of the mentally retarded, reports BSS.

The opening session of the workshop under the auspices of the Society for the Care and Education of Mentally Retarded, Bangladesh (SCEMRB) was addressed by Deputy Commissioner Kabetur Rahman as chief guest and inaugurated by SCEMRB President D P Barua, District Education Officer Mohammad Abdul Mannan was special guest.

The workshop is providing training to about 50 teachers, parents and social workers from SCEMRB's regional catchment area comprising its five branches in Comilla, Feni, Chittagong, Sylhet and Nangolkot rural project as part of its motivational and awareness programme.

In his inaugural speech, SCEMRB President D P Barua said, the rights of education of the handicapped including the mentally retarded have been incorporated within the framework of national strategy for

universal education for all citizens by 2000 AD.

He said, a national policy for the handicapped is expected to be announced shortly while the government has already declared formation of a trust for their rehabilitation.

Referring to SCEMRB's role in promoting the cause of the mentally retarded through its 24 branches, he said the first national institute for them has been set up in Dhaka a few years ago with financial support from the government for their education and training as well as development of multi-disciplinary professional research.

Chief guest, Kabetur Rahman assured support for the cause of the mentally retarded in the district of Comilla. Secretary General of SCEMRB J I Mamun, Shafigur Rahim, Chairman, Catchment Area Programme, Ashraf Ali Chowdhury, President, SCEMRB Comilla branch and Saher Banu Salam, SCEMRB NEC members spoke at the inaugural session.

Maitri Chowdhury, Senior Guide Teacher of SCEMRB, Ramizuddin Ahmed and Sheikh Mahbub Ali, both counsellors of SCEMRB presented papers on various aspects of mental retardation.

## Bumper aman production expected

PATUAKHALI, Nov 24: Bumper aman production is expected in Bhola district, it is learnt from the official sources, reports UNB.

According to Agriculture Extension Department, about 3.20 lakh metric tons of cleaned rice are expected this year in the district.

The sources said against the target of 1.58 lakh hectares of land, a total 1,54,956 hectares were brought under aman cultivation.

Owing to bumper production, officials expected that at least 3.20 lakh metric tons of aman will be produced this year against the target of 3.04 lakh metric tons.

It may be mentioned that last year's aman production of this area also exceeded its target.

They urged the concerned authorities to start purchasing of aman crops as per government announcement by easing the sale procedures to ensure fair prices of their produce.

## Engine driver arrested for stealing oil

DINAJPUR, Nov 24: A railway engine driver was arrested by the Parbatipur Railway police for his involvement with the stealing of diesel oil at Chirirbandar station, reports UNB.

Railway police arrested the driver, Kapil Das, while he was stealing about half a drum diesel oil from the railway engine near the godown of Chirirbandar station. Police also recovered some railway spare parts from his possession on November 10.

## Stress on anti-crime activities

KHULNA, Nov 24: The monthly meeting of the Khulna district law and order committee was held recently at the conference room of the Deputy Commissioner, reports BSS.

Presided over by the Deputy Commissioner Khulna, Kazi Reazul Huq, the meeting was attended by Salahuddin Yusuf, MP, and Harun-al-Rashid, MP, both advisers to the district law and order committee.

Superintendent, Khulna and Deputy Director NSI, Khulna and concerned officials of police and district administration also attended the meeting. The meeting reviewed the law and order situation prevailing in the district. It took a number of important resolutions towards further improving the law and order situation.

While participating in the discussion Salahuddin Yusuf, MP, and Harun-al-Rashid, MP, stressed the need for more vigilance against crime and criminal activities in the rural areas.

**52 killed in 9 months**

More than 52 people were killed and 329 others injured in 548 fire incidents during the

last 9 months in 16 districts of Khulna and Barisal divisions.

According to official sources here, property worth about Tk 2.62 crore was also gutted during the period, January to September, when 43 small and large industries and 78 houses were charred.

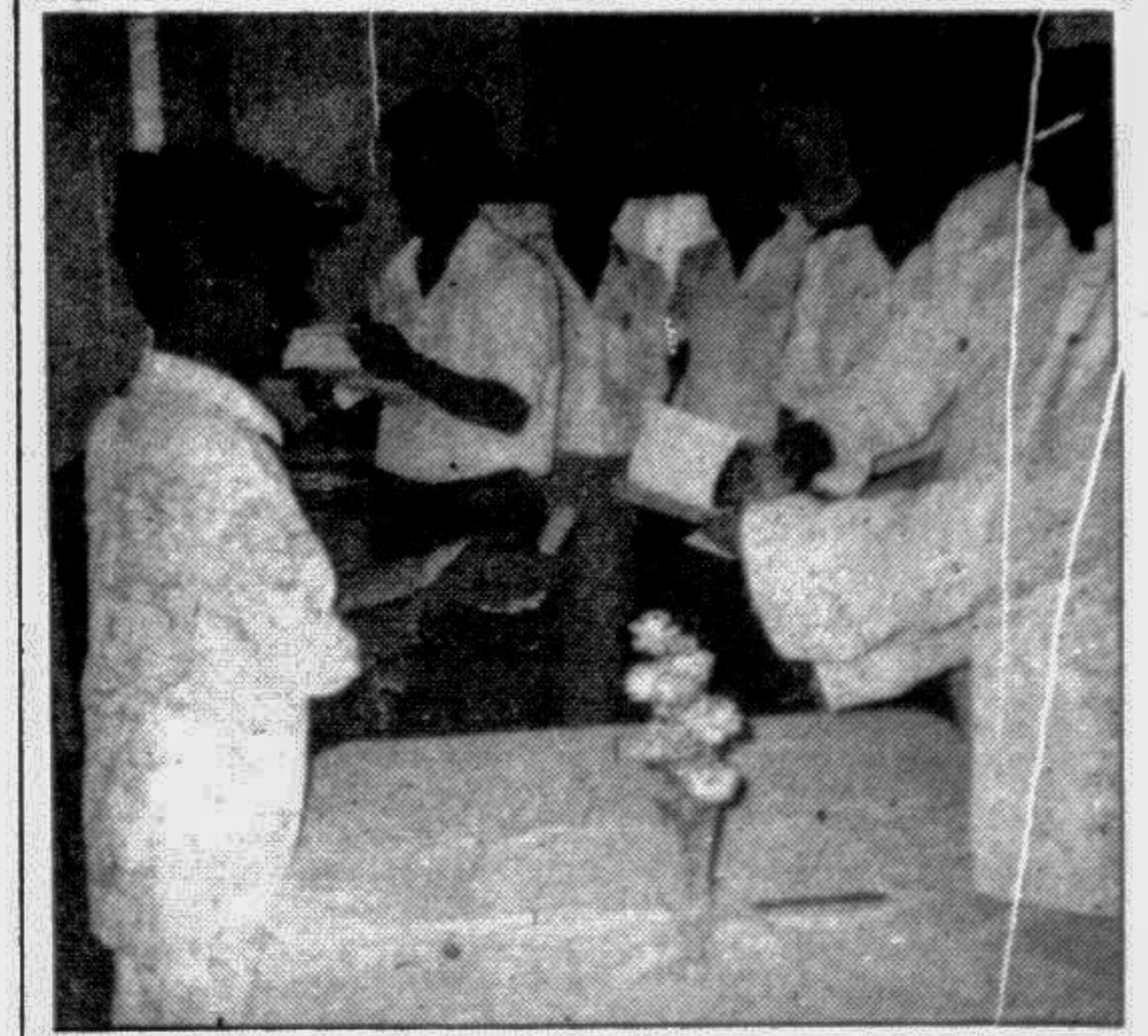

Highest fire incidents took place in the month of February, while lowest in month of August.

## An honest husband

JESSORE, Nov 24: One Hanif of Dighirpur under Sharsha thana in the district, has handed over his wife with Indian sarees to local thana police and was later forwarded to jail *hajaj* for smuggling recently, according to information.

Reports say that his wife, Rasida was a professional smuggler. Trips to India and back with Indian sarees for sale by trespassing border, was her regular practice.

She did not stop the illegal trade despite strong opposition from her husband. Finally, her husband took this decision being failure in attempts to correct her. The story of smuggling has created widespread sensation in the area.

**Deadly weapons, arms recovered**

Another report says: Keshabpur thana police in the district recovered a number of arms ammunition and deadly weapons from a paddy-store house at Volukaghar of the thana Monday.

Detail report says that on receiving a secret information a contingent of police led by OC of the thana raided the house of Ibrahim of the village and recovered two pigeons, two rounds of live cartridges two *randas*, three powerful bombs and two sets of police uniform from the paddy store-house by breakup open the lock. Ibrahim was not in the house during the raid. No one was arrested.
