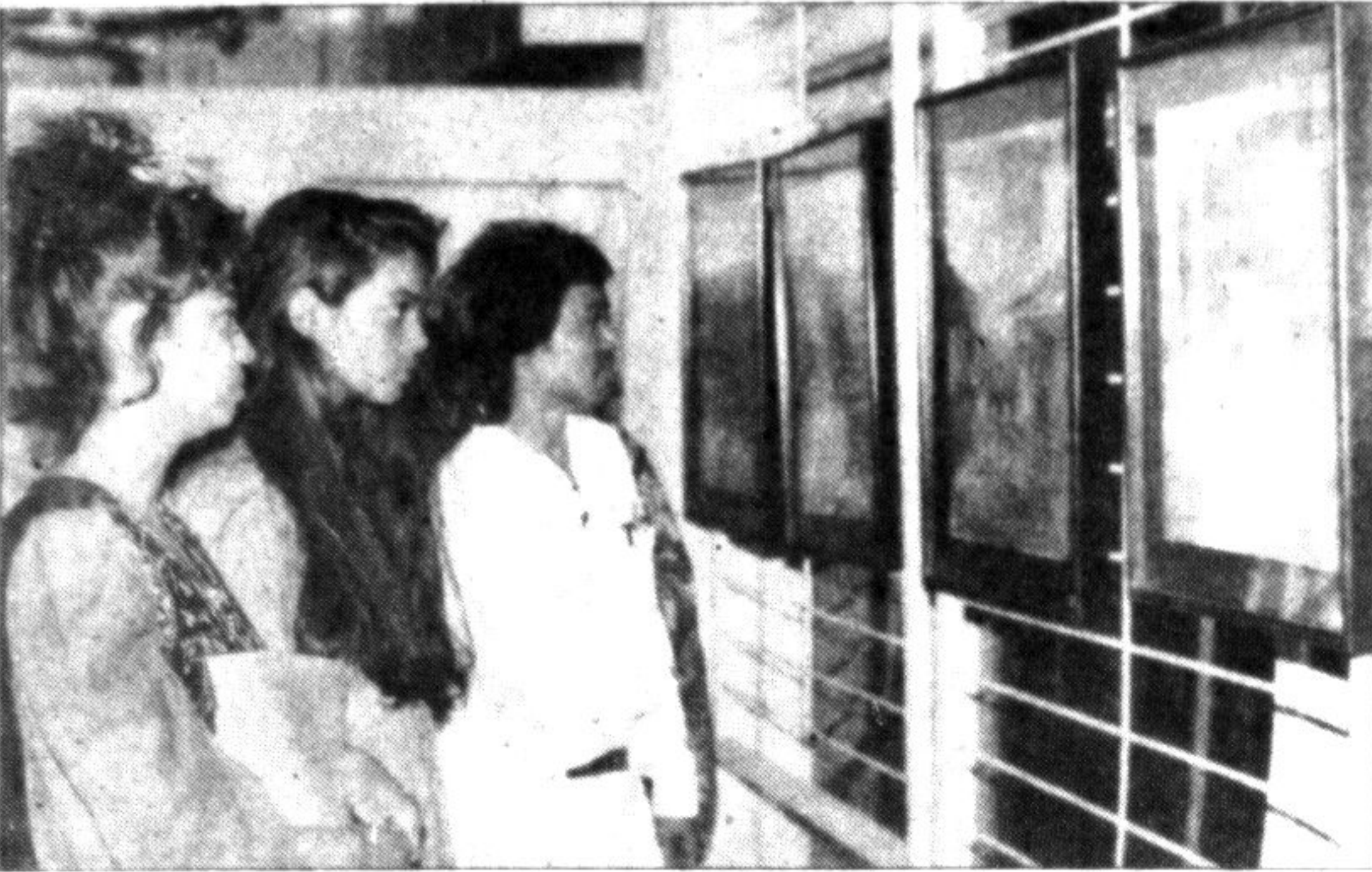

**Water may contain bacteria even after purification, JS told**

Water may contain bacteria even after purification by chemicals, a senior minister told parliament yesterday, reports UNB.

In response to a supplementary question during the question hour, LGRD Minister Barrister Salam Talukdar, however, did not say whether water with bacteria causes any harm to the consumers.

Bacteria is found in drinking water all over the world even after purification, he said. Replying to Mirza Azam (Awami League), Barrister Talukdar told the House that the water bill in Dhaka city had been increased by 10 per cent per 1,000 litre, but it is still far from meeting the production cost.

Talukdar said the 10 per cent increase was necessary to meet the enhanced expenditure for the maintenance. The production cost of 1,000 litre water is Tk 4.37 and with 10 per cent rise in the water bill it will be reduced to Tk 4.10 which is still less than the actual production cost, he said.

**Tk 1.53 cr allocated**  
The government had allocated Tk 1.53 crore for fuel and maintenance of jeeps.

A delegation of Vikarunnessa Noon School and College yesterday submitted a memorandum at the Prime Minister's Shugandha office demanding ban on the movement of trucks in the metropolitan area from 10am to 6pm, reports BSS.

Earlier, students and teachers of the institution brought out a procession and held a rally in front of the Jatiya Press Club demanding exemplary punishment of the truck driver responsible for the killing of Rumana Parveen.

The rally urged the government to deploy traffic police in front of the educational institutions for controlling the speed of the vehicles.

The rally was addressed by the asstt. head girl of the college Sumaiya Sharmin.

Principal of the college Hamida Ali, Vice-Principal Latifa Begum, Shameem Jahan, Rokshana Shamin and the head girl of the college Sultana Lubna Alam, were, among others, present in the rally.

Rumana Parveen, a first year MBBS student of the Sir Salmullah Medical College and a former student of Vikarunnessa Noon School and College, was killed when a speeding truck rammed her rickshaw near Dhaka Medical College Hospital recently.

**Milon memorial sculpture opens today**

A sculpture built on the Dhaka University campus in memory of Shaheed Dr Milon will be inaugurated today at 11 am, reports UNB.

Dr Shamsul Alam Khan Milon, Joint Secretary of Bangladesh Medical Association (BMA), was gunned down on the DU campus on November 27 by the hired musclemen of the autocratic regime of Ershad at the fag end of the democracy movement.

The Shaheed Dr Milon memorial sculpture has been erected at the south-east corner of Dhaka University Central Library, BMA and Shaheed Dr Milon Sangsad have jointly constructed it.

Dhaka University Vice Chancellor Prof Emajuddin Ahmed will open the plaque of the memorial sculpture at a simple function.
