

Australian Cricket Board (ACB) said here today it had accepted invitations for Allan Border's team to visit Sharjah in the United Arab Emirates and Shri Lanka next year, reports AFP.

ACB chief executive Graham Halbish said the Australians were likely to visit Sharjah and Shri Lanka for one-day competitions, adding to their commitments to tour South Africa and Pakistan. Australia are due in South

Africa in early February for three Tests and eight one-day internationals before heading to Pakistan in late September for up to three Tests and five onedavers.

Halbish said the ACB was almost certain to send the Australians on to Sharjah direct from South Africa to join a six nation tournament in mid-April. Border's men would then

have three months off before playing in a triangular competition with South Africa and Shri Lanka on the way to Pakistan. "The ACB has had offers for these two visits and we are

considering them very strongly," Halbish said. "Initially, we were very reluc-

tant about Sharjah because of the money we were offered but they have come back to us with a much larger guarantee. "Regarding Shri Lanka, we

do have a duty to tour countries

who visit us and it was felt that it would be fitted in on the way to Pakistan, if the itineraries are suitable. After the tour of Pakistan Australia are set to host

England for a full Ashes Series and then tour the Caribbean to play the West Indies. Halbish said the ACB was

LONDON, Nov25: England legend lan Botham has added his voice to the criticism of the Test and County Cricket Board over the Pakistan ball-tampering controversy, reports AFP.
