

U.S.A. Will Give Away 55,000 "Green Cards" In New "Immigration Lottery" Bangladeshis Are Eligible To Apply

Soon the U.S. Government will begin handing out 55,000 "Green Cards" to people just like you. The cards will be given out through a "Green Card Lottery" run by the U.S. Department of State. The Green Cards, also known as "Permanent Resident Visas," give the right to live and work permanently in the U.S.

You and your family could be among the lucky winners. But, you must act fast. The entry period will be brief, and is coming soon.

What You Get With A Green Card

Your Green Card lets you live and work as long as you wish in the U.S., or come and go at will. You can sponsor relatives for Green Cards. Five years later you can apply for U.S. citizenship, if you wish. And when you get a Green Card through the Lottery program, your wife or husband and unmarried children under 21 also get Green Cards.

Background On The Green Card Lottery

The Green Card Lottery became law in 1990. The program is run by the Department of State in Washington, D.C. The program has run for several years, but this year Bangladeshis can take part.

Are You Qualified To Win A Green Card?

You qualify to enter the lottery and win a Green Card if you meet the following requirements:

- You (or your husband or wife) was born in Bangladesh (or certain other countries);
- You have an Intermediate Certificate, or 2 years experience in certain jobs;
- You qualify as an "immigrant," which means you are healthy and able to earn a living, are not a major criminal, not a drug dealer, etc.

You do not need a job offer, American relatives, or wealth. You do not need to speak English. You can be living in any country — even living and working in the U.S. illegally. You can enter and win even if you have other immigration procedures going on, such as a relative petition or employer petitions. Entering the Lottery does not affect other petitions.

How The Lottery Works

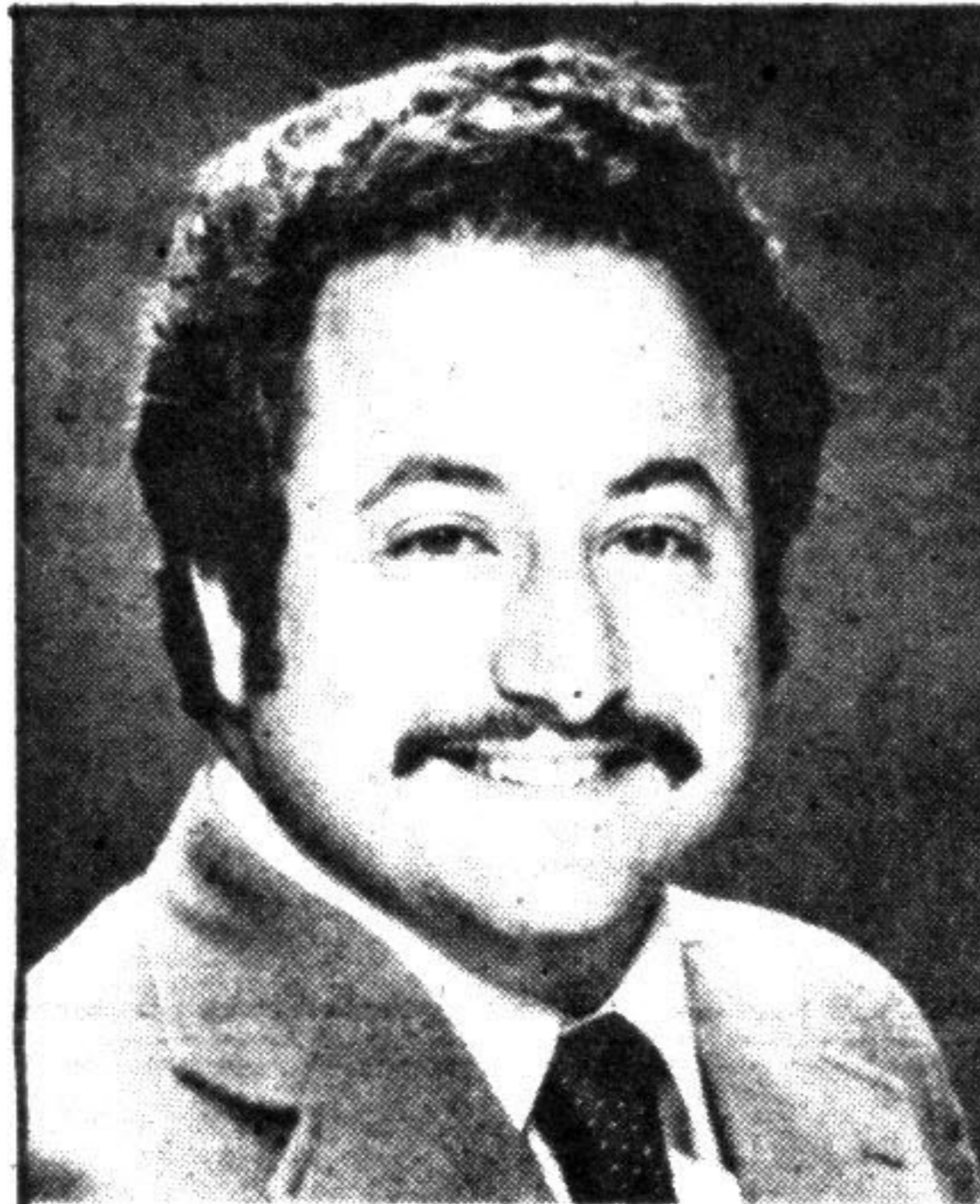
People taking part must file formal papers called a "Registration" with the Department of State. The Department then selects 55,000 winners by chance. No country can win all the Green Cards; each country will have a fair share.

The papers must be prepared and filed in a specific, detailed legal manner, or they are disqualified. Assuming you win, you then fill out simple forms, have a short interview at the nearest American consulate, pay a small fee, and get your Green Card. Your husband or wife and any unmarried children under 21 receive their own Green Cards at the same time.

How To Increase Your Winning Chances
