LAUSANNE, Switzerland, Dec 8: The Olympic Programme Commission has reco-

mmended radical changes to the events lineup for the 2000 Games in Sydney, informed sources said here Tuesday, report agencies.

A report drawn up by the commission for the International Olympic Committee executive is considered so controversial that the IOC has ordered it kept under wraps.

Commission chairman Phillippe Chatrier said he had been told to divulge none of the contents. IOC secretary general Francois Carrard gave a press conference just to say that no details would be published.

"The executive commission wants to take time to think about the recommendations made before taking a decision," said Carrard.

Kicking out sports considered obsolete or inappropriate and cutting back others are thought to be proposed. "The report is so radical that it is bound to stir up a fuss amongst international federations," said one source close to delibera-

Stopping the Olympic Games getting out of hand in terms of competitors and officials has long been a concern of IOC leaders. But each time the guestion comes round to a vote the lobbying of threatened federation leaders always puts back the tough decisions.

Wrestling, modern pentathlon, boxing and weightlifting have all been threatened with Olympic expulsion or being severely curtailed.

TV TALKS

The IOC expects to have a deal next month on the US television rights for the 1998 Winter Olympics in Nagano, Japan, with a projected selling price of more than 300 million dollar.

IOC marketing chief Dick Pound said Tuesday the negotiations are expected to be held in New York during the third week of January.

The CBS network paid 295 million dollars for the rights to broadcast the Feb. 12-27 Winter Olympics in Lillehammer,

Norway. "The fact that all three networks are interested suggests we would look for an increase over the Lillehammer fees," Pound said. "My guess is it's a number that will start with a 3."

Meanwhile, Pound said he doesn't expect the Canadian and Australian TV rights for the 1996 Atlanta Olympics to be signed until next month or after the Lillehammer Games. Previously, officials said they hoped to sign those deals by Christ-

Pound also said that IBM was expected to sign on in the next few days as a worldwide sponsor of the Atlanta Games.

IBM would become the eighth company to join The Olympic Programme, or TOP, the IOC's worldwide marketing programme.

"We have a valid contract with Oscar, and obviously they (Garza and Salas) are interfering with it," Nelson said.

"They won't let us talk to him and now they apparently have told him not to fight in New York, which means he will be suspended."

Sixteen months ago. De La

Barcelona. Since then he has won all 11 of his professional fights, 10 by knockout. Mittleman and Nelson signed him with a 1-million-
