
# Matthews mauled in a melee



PERTH. Dec 12: Former Australian Test cricketer Greg Matthews, in hospital with a severe head injury received in a nightclub scuffle, was much improved on Sunday.

reports AFP. Neil Marks, manager of the New South Wales Sheffield Shield side, of which Matthews 'is a member, said he had spoken to the 33-year-old veteran early in the day and found him to be in good spirits.

But his condition was still being closely monitored at Royal Perth Hospital, where he was likely to remain for several days, Marks said.

Marks said although he had confirmed the blow to Matthews skull Occurred at a Perth suburban nightclub, he still had not established the circumstances in which the injury was received.

Matthews, a talented batsman and off-spin bowler, was found in a distressed condition at the side's hotel by teammate Randal Green early on Thursday the day before a game against Western Australia and taken to hospital. The head injury was revealed

when he was given a cat-scan. Marks said the Matthews

incident would be covered in his post-match report to the New South Wales Cricket Asso-

Matthews wife, Jillian, was expected to fly from Sydney to Perth to see her husband early this week. Marks said

He said it was likely he would miss at least the next two Sheffield Shield games.

Earlier on Saturday team manager Neil Marks said Matthews had suffered a severe concussion and was vomiting blood following an incident at a trendy Perth nightclub early on

Thursday morning.

He is listed in stable condition at the Royal Perth Hospital doctors said light and noise are badly affecting him. The incident had left him with severe bruising of the skull.

Marks said he had spoken with Matthews on Saturday for the first time since the incident and said the last thing Matthews recalls is being manhandled inside the nightclub and heading towards the nightclub door off his feet.

"Greg was drinking with friends and all he can remember is an arm coming around his throat with a forearm at the back of his head lifting him up.' Marks said.

"The last thing he remembers is heading towards the door off his feet, being dragged suppose," he said. "Greg said he was drinking but that he wasn't drunk."

Matthews was under the care of a neuro-surgeon and would remain in hospital for another three days, Marks said However, Marks claimed

Matthews would require more time to fully recover from his head injury, which could bring a premature end to a 10-year state-level career.

"I think Greg will be out of cricket for at least a month," he said. He will be on medication for a while.

Maher, owner of the Hip-e Club where the basing took place, told the Sunday Telegraph that Matthews was forcibly ejected from the club after an altercation with a "I have nothing but admira-

tion for the way my staff handled what could have been a nasty situation," Maher said.

Police said they plan to interview staff at the nightclub and Matthews today.

# Sao Paulo win it again

TOKYO, Dec 12: South American football champions Sao Paulo FC retained the Inter-Continental Cup with a lastgasp goal here today to beat European champions AC Milan 3-2, reports AFP.

The Brazilians waited until the 86th minuted to seal victory with winger Muller picking up a long through ball from midfielder Toninho Cerezo and rounding goalie Sebastiano

The Italian club winners of this European-South American Cup in 1969, 1989 and 1990. Piled on the pressure throughout the first half, opening up eight scoring chances to Sao Paulo's one, but failed to hit the target and went in at the break trailing 1-0. Brazilian international Pal-
