The Day the Skies Fell

by Fayza Haq

The skies fell on Sheikh Md Badrul Alam the day the Pak army suddenly swooped down to take away his father shaheed Abdul Hai on June '71. For days the area had been surrounded by Capt Faiz and his forces.

"Our family was blacklisted," the 29-year-old mathematician recounts, "as my uncle Abdul Latif Sheikh was a publicity secretary for Awami League, and he had his office on top of my father's pharmaceutical shop. My father himself was known to give the Freedom Movement all possible financial support. They had caught my cousin, beaten and tied him up the evening before. As a seven-year-old child, I was sitting beside my father as he was offering his Fazr

prayers, when they dragged in my half dead cousin who was crying out. 'Chacha help me!' My father consoled me by assuring me that he was only going to do some necessary shopping and would be back, and got into the army jeep never to return.

Badrul continues. The army was out to finish the en tire family. My mother fled from the backdoor with my baby sister. My sister, brother and I followed her. We were sheltered by a Christian lady who was later tortured but they could get little out of her Meanwhile the Pak army looted our shop came to our house six times and killed one of my uncles who was the Ansar

Bahini. My aging grandmother was vi ciously kicked and cruelly abused when they discovered that some of the members of our family had escaped. This was done by the Razakar Saifuzzaman. My old confused and shocked grandfather, not being able to stand the rampage and destruction of the family died of heart attack. Another uncle of mine died fighting at the border."

The young man elaborates. "My childhood memories are filled with visions of floating corpses being pecked by crows and we children hiding as we roamed about in the wilderness. living on 'ruti' (loaves) that my mother made on the open fire. The SDO of the area gave my mother Tk 500 as compensation with which she began a small grocery store, selling oil and salt at the village markets. Since '82 we have been

"It is a pity." he adds, "that after the Pak army had left, I hardly think that there has been social or economic stability in the country. Many times neighbours and miscreants have tried to seize our house. People were frightened to help us out but some of my father's friends came to our res-

With bitterness and despair he continues, "I have studied all through in Chittagong, living in fear of the Shibir. I could not talk to people I wanted to as I was afraid of losing my 'seat'. I

> had to sign bonds with the Razakars. After all the Jamaat and Shibir are undoubtedly Razakars. The same applies to the atmosphere in my home town of Gopalganj. Faridpur. People like members of my family have given their lives for fairness in society and yet today inequality and foul play prevail. My elder brother, Rafiqui Islam, was meritorious, but had to bring an end to his education at the intermediate level just to look after us, as he was the eldest. We rushed our sister Arjuman Ara into her marriage even before she completed her

school, while my other sister, Nazneen Sultana is Sheikh Md Badrul Alam struggling with her studies in Chemistry in Eden College, staying in a hostel, being supported by my brother. I myself



Apply knowledge, wisdom in uplift of nation: Abbas


