EC-India accord to boost economic links

BRUSSELS, Dec 21: The European Community and India yesterday singed a cooperation agreement aimed at boosting economic, political and technological links, reports Reuter.

Belgian Foreign Minister Willy Claes, whose country currently holds the EC's rotating presidency, and Indian Commerce Minister Pranab Mukherjee signed the accord during a break in a meeting of EC foreign ministers.

In a speech to mark the occasion, Claes said the new agreement confirmed the importance the EC attached to India's efforts to modernise its economy, move to a more open market system and to encourage the private sector.

AFP from New Delhi says: The Indian government cleared foreign investment proposals worth more than two billion dollar during the first 10 months of the year, nearly double the total for 1992, the Finance Ministry said vesterday.

Foreign investment projects worth a total of 2.19 billion dollar were approved by the ministry between January and October, up from 1.29 billion dollar for all of last year, it said in a statement.

The United States remained the leading foreign investor in India in 1993, with investment pledges totalling 1.07 billion dollar made during the first 10 months of the year, up from 410 million dollar for all of last

Britain was next with foreign

investment pledges of 200 million dollar during the first 10 months of the year, up from 39 million dollar in 1992.

More than 90 per cent of the proposed ventures are in key industries such as oil, food precessing, electronics, telecommunications and heavy machinery.

Finance Minister Manniohan Singh began opening up the sheltered Indian economy in 1991 to attract more foreign capital and upgrade Indian goods through competition.

While investment pledges have risen sharply since the market reforms began two years ago the Reserve Bank of India, the country's central bank complained recently that actual investment is still slow to materialise.

Myanmar begins new year with \$2b foreign investment

YANGON, Dec 21: 1994 will begin with more than two billion dollar already earmarked for foreign investment in Myanmar the Minister for the National Planning and Economic." Development, Brigadier General David Abel said.

The foreign investment pledges are in addition to some 78 projects worth more than one billion dollar already underway, Abel said in an inter-

view on Sunday with AFP. Foreign investors "know that Myanmar opening, the situation is stable. They can make money if they invest here," Abel said.

U.S and That companies are the leading investors, pouring in twice as much money as third-and fourth-ranked Singapore and Japan, according to

official figures. The Netherlands and Austria lead the European investors.

The oil and gas sector accounts for 381 million dollar, more than one-third of the total, followed by hotels and tourism (287 million dollar) and mining (155 million dollar).

Agriculture, which dominates the domestic economy and is a key sector targeted for future investments, accounts for only 2.69 million dollar in current projects.

Livestock and fisheries, forestry and industry are other. sectors which have already attracted significant foreign investments, officials said.

TOKYO, Dec 21: Asian stock markets closed generally mixed Tuesday, but share prices fell in Tokyo for the second straight day because of political uncertainfy in Japan, reports AP.

Tokyo's 225-issue Nikkei Stock Average lost 88.81 points, or 0.51 per cent, closing at 17,315.43. On Monday, it had closed at 17,404.24 after plunging 647.67 points, or 3.59 per cent — its largest single-day loss this year in terms of points.

The Tokyo Stock Price Index of all shares listed on the first section fell 1.52 points, or 0.11 per eent, to 1,445.73.

Share prices fell mainly because of political uncertainty despite growing expectations that the government will announce an economic stimulus package soon, possibly by the end of this week, traders said. In Hong Kong, share prices plunged because of profit tak-

The Hang Seng Index, the Hong Kong market key's indicator of blue chips, fell 290 50 points, or 2.7 per cent, closing at 10,524.28. On Monday, the index had surged 245 points.

Brokers said investors were taking profits after three straight days of record-breaking

BOMBAY, Dec 21 : India's major stock markets may remain closed by a brokers' strike until the new year after Bornbay exchange officials failed to scttle a dispute that has halted trading for the past week, brokers said today, reports Reuter. "It looks like we will meet in

the new year now," said M G Damani, Chairman of the Brokers Forum which represents most brokers on the Bombay bourse, India's largest exchange capitalised at 80 billion US

Brokers refused to trade after the Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI), which regulates the country's capital markets, banned forward trading a week ago.

After a four-hour meeting yesterday, the Bombay Stock Exchange (BSE) board said it had appointed a six-member committee to meet SEBI Chairman G V Ramakrishna to discuss a possible settlement of the impasse.

Brokers said the strike would continue until a settlement with SEBI was agreed.

Earlier brokers had said they might be wiling to resume trading today.

"Trading will not resume before a result comes out," said Damani. He will be member of the committee to be headed by BSE President G B Desai.
