Belwart, Reshmi Choori Nebae Naki. That's all Seema has to hear and she knows that her favourite vendor, the choort wala (one who sells glass bangles) is here. Buying and collecting not to mention wearing - them is a passion for her. All the different colours, shades and designs, no matter how much she collects, are never enough for her. Her father believes that she has more collection than the vendor himself has in his tookri (the big basket which he carries over his head). Yet everytime she hears this age-old call of the choori wala, she cannot resist tip toeing down the stairs to meet him and buy some wares or see what new items he

has that she still didn't acquire. Hers died hard. Seema's interest was even fanned out of proportion when she heard stories of her grand mother's childhood days in Calcutta. She loved talking to her grandma about her early days in Calcutta. Seema was delighted to imagine her grandma in her shoes, running down the stairs, buying glass bangles and matching them with dresses.

Even though, the culture of wearing glass bangles by the South Asian women especially of India, Pakistan and Bangla-

desh goes back to a time shrouded in historical mist, the appeal has almost unceasingly endured. Matching glass bangles with sarees or salwar kameez is just as much part of the entire getup or attire as the blouse (tops) or dupatta (thin cloth wornover salwar kameez).

Ahmed Fakir of Jamalpur who has been selling such bangles from before the liberation war says that "business was never dull except for rare occasions. My sale of bangles stood at Tk 150 only the other day and believe it or not only two girls made as much purchase. Bangles will never cease to hold their attraction for women and girls, not to exclude even the grand mothers. These bangle factories are usually situated in Azimpur, Lalbagh, Kuniya Char and Chawkbazar. However, Chawkbazar is very

famous for its bangles. These are the wholesale markets. Basically glass, sound, soda and dycs or colours are mixed and heated in a big frying pan till the ingredients turn liquid. This liquid is then passed through a machine which smoothens the surface and simultaneously coils around another machine which gives the final shape, explained Fakir.

These bangles are found almost every colour in fascinating designs of naksht and other folk motifs, the plain coloured ones are called resh mt choort. Fakir usually buys two grates of bangles. One gross is equivalent to 12 dozens and 12 gross make I grate in their dealings. One

gross costs Tk 120 to Tk 180 depending on designs, colour and quality. "I buy 25 gross or 2 grates free Mahajans, this fills my basket and usual-I sell all these within 8 to 10 days," he explained. Every day Fakir carns about Tk 50 to Taka 70, but his sale simply shoots up during festivals. "In melas (fair) Baishaki, Ekushey. Boi Mela, I sell about Tk 300 to 400 per day inspite of my other competitors being there.

· But Fakir is not exactly very content and happy with life. He has three daughters and their marri-

age and dowry have literally made him a fakir (beggar). He had established a shop some years back but unfortunately within days it was closed down. His shop had bangles worth Tk 1600 to Tk 1700 but an accident smashed his wares. He could never recover from the loss and start all over again. "Right now my only investment is my life and my tookri, lets see how far I can

Besides being a choori wala Fakir Ahmed arranges the Urs of Khwaja Baba every year in his home town. Many rich people donate money but ever in his life was he dishonest.

He is old and tired now but to survive, has to carry the tookrt over his head and say choort, choori, kacher choori. Nothing really changed. nor will ever, for him.

### Setting up of modern marine research instt under consideration

President Abdur Rahman Biswas said that the government would do every thing possible to build a modern, powerful and self-contained naval force in the greater interest of the country, reports UNB.

Recalling the importance of naval force in the arena of defence, President Biswas said in order to keep pace with time and for protecting of our vast sea-resources, we have to go for modernisation and strengthening of our naval forces".

"We have about forty thousand square miles maritime belt full of sea-resources and added that the onerous task of defending and maintaining our sovereignty over these vast national maritime area and keeping the respective economic zone free from outside threat lies with our naval forces".

Earlier, President Biswas handed over the commissioning "foreman' to the Commanding Officer of the vessel Lt Commander Muhammad Babar Ali.




