Taka 10 cr Islamic
Foundation budget
for '93-94 okayed

The first meeting of the
newly-formed board of govern-
ors of Islamic Foundation,
Bangladesh unanimously ap-
proved a budget allocation of Tk
10 crore for meeting revenue
and development expenditures
of the foundation for the finan-
cial year 1993-94, reports BSS.

The meeting was held at the
conference room of Islamic
Foundation with Minister for
Religious Affairs Muhammad
Keramat Ali in the chair.

Different aspects like book
publication, research work,
book sale, shop rent of Baitul
Mokarram and other places,
Islamic mission activities, press
work and other allied subjects
came up for discussion and
stress was laid for strengthen-
ing the performances of these
projects.

It was informed in the
meeting that about Tk two crore
is expected to be received from
sale of books of Islamic Founda-
tion during the current finan-
cial year.

The minister thanked the
newly selected members of the
board and urged them to co-
operate in creating dynamism
in the activities of the foundation
in future.

A five-member sub commit-
tee headed by Alhaj Md Niza-
muddin Khan, MP was formed
to check up the expenditure of
the budget allocation for 1992-
93. The committee will submit
its report by January 15 next.

Similarly a one-member
committee headed by Alhaj
Nizamuddin Khan, MP was also
formed to study the rents of
shops at Baitul Mokarram.
Justice Ruhul Islam will work
as advisor of the committee.

The members of the newly
formed board of governors at-
tended the meeting were Vice-
Chairman of the board and Sec-
retary, Ministry of Religious Af-
fairs Abdul Awal, member of
the board Alhaj Md Nizamuddin
Khan MP, Moulana Ataur Rah-
man Khan MP, Justice Ruhul
Islam, Vice-Chancellor of Open
University Prof Dr Shamser Ali,
University Grants Commission
Chairman Md Shamsul Hoque,
Chairman of Bangladesh
Madrasah Education Board Prof
Abdul Mannan, Khatib of Baitul
Mokarram National Mosque Al-
haj Maulana Abaidul Hoque,
Khatib Lalbagh Shahi Mosque
Moulana Md Aminul Islam and
Pirzada Alhaj Moulana S M
Ruhul Amin.

Environment management
action plan in Jan

The government will launch
an environment management
action plan by January next to
safeguard environment and
health, Environment Minister
Akbar Hossain told a seminar in
the capital yesterday, reports
UNB.

He said the action plan will
give priority to problem areas
like urban air pollution, moni-
toring of drinking water and
fresh water quality, food safety,
coastal water quality, solid
waste disposal, smoke emission
from vehicles, safe use of agro-
chemicals, and treatment and
disposal of industrial wastes.

The minister was speaking
as chief guest at the seminar on
"Critical Environment, Health,
and Safety Issues of the Devel-
oping Countries" at the Engi-
neers Institute in the afternoon.

The seminar, organised by
the Institution of Engineers,
Bangladesh (IEB), was presided
over by Dr Engr Md Anwar Hos-
sain.

An expatriate Bangladeshi
expert Dr Hebab A Quazi of
Martech International Inc, Cali-
fornia, USA, presented a key-
note paper on different aspects
of environmental pollution.
Honorary secretary general of

IEB Engr M A K Azad also
spoke on the occasion.

He referred to government ef-
forts in strengthening local and
international environmental
health information system for
exchange and proper use of in-
formation and technology.

"Government has also em-
barked upon large-scale af-
orestation programme and tar-
gets to cover 18 per cent of total
land with the focus on poverty
alleviation", the minister added.

He said the government is
also actively considering
"overhauling of the existing leg-
al codes for environmental pro-
tection." Several acts and ordi-
nances relating to environmen-
tal health exist but they seem to
be outdated or not adequately
responsive.

"We are finalising the draft
of the Environmental Act for
submission before the cabinet
soon," Akbar said.

He, however, reminded that
Bangladesh's problem is unique
with regard to environmental
health care. "Low resources
base, high density of popula-
tion, poverty and illiteracy, lack
of awareness etc are formidable
predicaments."
