She became a principal 1989 and went to Kandala but in absence of professional satisfaction, she came back to Bombay and took up principalship in a school. But she resigned in Feb '93. Industries Minister A M Zahiruddin Khan yesterday said the government is planning to introduce venture capital scheme to step up export of nontraditional products, reports

He was speaking at the second session of a day-long seminar here on the 'Export of Non-Traditional Products: Problems and Prospects' at the Metropolitan Chamber of Commerce and Industry (MCCI).

The traditional export products sector has reached an 'inelastic position,' he said underlining the imperatives for exploring the potentialities of nontraditional items.

The minister said that there would be a sector-to-sector overhaul in the non-traditional export market. He said that he would sit with different sectors every month and discuss the problems they might be facing. "We will hold your hands and lead you on.'

Zahiruddin Khan urged the private- sector investors to stimulate the rural areas through production of non-traditional items for export that will "bring a ripple effect on the economy.


