Privatisation Board strengthened 15 public sector units to be sold this month

In a bid to accelerate the floundering privatisation drive, the government has recently reconstituted the Privatisation Board, giving it greater autonomy.

"The Board now has been given a separate budget and the power to independently deal with all privatisation matters," said a top official of the Privatisation Board, formed under a government directive in March, 1992. "We are working in full swing now and we are about to finalise the privatisation of 15 public sector units within this month," he added.

To attract more private investors the Board, meanwhile,

has lowered the amount of the minimum bid money from five per cent of the quoted value to 2.5 per cent and has also withdrawn the condition requiring the new private owners to retain all employees of the divested units for a period of at least one year.

A World Bank-funded technical assistance project of about Tk 10 crore for the Privatisation Board has also been recently approved by the Planning Ministry.

However, one government source pointed out that the Board is still facing problems with the valuation of the units to be divested, labour militancy

in targeted units, opposition from some of the line ministries and inadequate response from private investors.

Under the new changes instituted late last month, the Privatisation Board has now been placed directly under the high-powered Council Committee on Finance and Economic Affairs in the Cabinet Division under the Prime Minister's office. It was earlier placed under the Planning Ministry and all initiatives had to be approved by the ECNEC.

The recent changes come after repeated prodding from the donor community, specially

Thugs reign in KNM logging zone

The production of the Khulna Newsprint Mills (KNM) has declined by almost 50 per cent due to deteriorating law and order situation in the logging zone of the Mills in the Sundarbans, official sources said.

As a result, the newspaper industry has been affected following the increase in the market price of per ton newsprint to around Tk 25,000 from the usual price of between Tk 21,500 and 22,000.

According to a top official of the Bangladesh Chemical Industries Corporation (BCIC),

dacoits have been terrorising people in the logging area at Bashangara along the river Pashur and most of the labourers have been refusing to go there for the last few weeks.

As a result, the extraction of raw material — the gewa wood — has fallen by 50 per cent from 13,000 cubic feet a day and the daily KNM production has consequently declined to 80-83 metric ton (MT) from 140 MT, he said.

With newsprint becoming scarce in the markets, some newspapers were compelled to drop some of their regular pages.

"The KNM could have maintained the steady supply to the newspapers by utilising its stock. But that has not been done due to mismanagement," the sources added.

The BCIC, however, has instructed the KNM to restore the newsprint supply to the newspapers according to their quotas.

The KNM was established to feed the newspaper industry of the country. It produces around 47,000 MT newsprint annually of which the newspapers consume around 30,000 MT. The rest is bought by dif-

Interview with CCC mayoral candidates Ctg will be commercial capital: Mohiuddin

CHITTAGONG, Jan 8: The Awami League nominee for the January 30 mayoral election here, A B M Mohiuddin Chowdhury pledged to make efforts for developing all economic infrastructures to turn Chittagong city into the commercial capital of the country.

Mohiuddin said "if elected, I will take steps to create an environment favourable for business activities in Chittagong city in a bid to check the trend of business-migration from here to Dhaka. I will also keep a vigil to foil any conspiracy by any vested quarters to cripple this port city's economic importance."

In an interview with The Daily Star at his office, flanked by many others of his party colleagues, the general sec-

retary of the city AL here said in the past, because of the absence of pragmatic policies and steps, most of the trade from this commercial city was not

concentrated in Dhaka, making Chittagong a 'desert'.

Mohiuddin remarked that Chittagong was neglected and subjected to step-motherly attitude by the governments in the past which resulted in the backwardness of most of the areas under the Chittagong City Corporation.

"Most of the 41 wards under Chittagong City Corporation (CCC) still remain undeveloped and uncultured, like the remote villages. Those who became mayors of CCC only served their own purposes instead of improving the lot of the city dwellers," Mohiuddin also remarked.

"Besides, some incompetent people were picked up in the administration from Chittagong as mayors and ministers who

City polls candidates come out in the open

Official campaigning for the January 30 city corporation elections in Dhaka, Chittagong, Khulna and Rajshahi began yesterday.

Supporters of the mayor and commissioner candidates in all the four cities took to the streets carrying poll symbols, placards and banners, seeking votes.

Nearly 30 lakh voters are expected to exercise their franchise to elect four mayors and 144 commissioners in the country's first-ever direct balloting in the four metropolitan cities.

In the capital, the Left-parties alliance candidate for the mayorship Manzurul Ahsan Khan launched his campaign through a public rally at the Purana Paltan crossing in the afternoon.

Other candidates, backed by the major political parties, are scheduled to address their opening public rallies today and tomorrow.

The ruling BNP and the Jamaat-e-Islami are due to hold separate rallies in the city to project their candidates for the mayoral posts today while the Awami League will project its candidate at a public meeting marking the 'home-coming day' of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman tomorrow.

However, the Jatiya Party yesterday cancelled its inaugural projection rally, scheduled for this afternoon.

Supporters of the mayoral candidates and the ward

Police refusing to accept GD, alleges Manzur

Mayoral candidate of the left party alliance Manzurul Ahsan Khan yesterday alleged that 15 police stations in the city have refused to accept his GD entries on violation of election rules.

The Sutrapur, Kotwali, Sabujbagh, Motijheel, Tejaon and Gulshan thanas refused to give him their signature, date, time and GD number while the Mohammadpur, Dhanmondi, Ramna, Cantonment, Mirpur and Uttara thanas accepted my letter of complaint but refused to give me the GD number, he said.

In a press release, the left party alliance candidate said, the police officials of these thanas had told him that they could not give him the GD number without the permission from the higher authorities.

Tk 240 cr to be released for JMB work soon

The government will release

Tk 240 crore, equivalent to 60 million US dollars, shortly to initiate work of the Jamuna Multipurpose Bridge (JMB) project without delay, reports UNB.

The money is being provided as necessary initial financing, pending finalisation of the loan agreements with the World Bank, Asian Development Bank and Japan — three co-financiers of the multimillion dollar project — in view of importance of the bridge over the Jamuna river that cut the country into two halves.

This was decided at a high-level inter-ministerial review meeting on the JMB held here yesterday with Finance Minister M Saifur Rahman in the chair.

The meeting noted with satisfaction that negotiations on credit agreements with the WB concluded successfully and that

with the ADB would be held here January 12-14.

Credit agreements with World Bank and ADB are expected to be signed very soon. The signing of exchange of notes and the loan agreement with Japan, the other co-financier of the project, is also expected soon.

The meeting was informed that stages were set to initiate the JMB project work, and all parties, including all agencies of the government, are in close contact with one another for expeditious finalisation of all components of the project.

Finance Secretary M Nasimuddin Ahmed, ERD Secretary M Lutfullah Majid, Chairman of NBR Akbar Ali Khan, Executive Director of JMB Muhammad Ali and Secretary, Roads, Rezaul Hayat were present in the meeting.

Govt wants skilled police force for rule of law

Prime Minister Begum

Khaleda Zia yesterday inaugurated the 'Police Week '94' with assurance that her government intends to build a skilled police force that can play its due role in establishing rule of law in the country, reports UNB.

"Training arrangements suiting the needs of the time have been made to modernise the police force," she said addressing the inaugural parade at Rajarbag Police Line in the morning.

The Prime Minister, escorted by mounted policemen in a ceremonial reception on her arrival at the parade ground, was received by Home Minister Abdul Matin Chowdhury and Inspector General of Police A S M Shahjahan.

Begum Zia reviewed the parade and took salute of contingents drawn from metropolitan police, armed police battalion, traffic police and female police.

At the function, the Prime Minister decorated seven policemen, two posthumously, with the 'Bangladesh Police Medal' and 18 others with the 'President Police Medal' for gallantry.

Ministers, MPs, diplomats, chiefs of Army and Air Force and senior civil, police and military officials were present at the inaugural parade.

Lauding the activities of the police force during the last year, including successful raids against terrorists, recovery of illegal arms and unearthing spurious medicine factories, the Prime Minister said the people expected much more from them.

"Members of the police force have to play a more people-ori-

ented role," she said.

Mentioning the setting up of a new staff college for police, upgradation of training programme at the Sardah Police Academy and other regional training centres and expansion of facilities, Begum Zia hoped that they would utilise the facilities properly in providing more security to public life in future.

"Impartiality, transparency and accountability are necessary to properly perform this responsibility," she said, asking the members of the force to go nearer to the people.

The Prime Minister recalled the role of police force in the War of Liberation and mentioned the first confrontation with the occupation forces at the Rajarbag Police Line.

14 to vie for each DU Hons seat

Prokrichi plans 3-day strike from Jan 11

The non-administrative government officials including the engineers and agriculturists are likely to go on a three-day strike from January 11. The doctors have already announced an indefinite work-stoppage from the same date to press home their demands.

The non-administrative civil servants and the professionals including the engineers, agriculturists and doctors (Prokrichi) have been agitating since February last year to realise their 17-point demands for administrative reforms in gen-

eral while the doctors are struggling to realise a 21-point set of demands of their own.

Meanwhile, a meeting between the government and the Bangladesh Medical Association (BMA), held yesterday afternoon, failed to approach a possible way to avert the strike threat of the doctors.

Health Minister Kamal Ibne Yusuf, Health Secretary Shameem Ahmed and Director General of the Health Directorate Professor Nurunnabi represented the government

BCCI scandal

Ailing Abedi asked to face trial Jan 22

ABU DHABI, Jan 8: The

Criminal Court on Saturday ordered the ailing founder of the collapsed Bank of Credit and Commerce International to appear for trial with co-defendants facing sundry charges in one of the world's most largest banking scandals, reports AP.

Agha Hasan Abedi, in his mid-70s, lives in his native Pakistan and is bedridden with paralysis. He is the only one at large among 13 former BCCI officers who have been on trial at the Abu Dhabi Criminal Court since Oct 9.

The summons, signed by judge Shihab Al-Rahman, was published as an advertisement in local newspapers Saturday. It ordered Abedi to appear

for a Jan 22 hearing, the fourth in the case brought against the defendants by members of Abu Dhabi's ruling Al Nahyan family, BCCI's majority shareholders.

It referred to the losses and damages suffered by the shareholders as a result of the criminal acts committed by Abedi.

The United Arab Emirates and Pakistan have no extradition treaty, and Abedi reputedly is an influential personality in Pakistan and could block any action the government there might contemplate against him.

Police-NDP gunbattle: 4 arrested

CHITTAGONG, Jan 8: Police in a pre-dawn swoop today arrested four National Democratic Party (NDP) activists from a hideout in hilly area of Razzan thana following a gunfight for several hours.

Md Iskander, alleged chief of 'Iskander-Bahini' and Bidhan Barua were held with bullet wounds and the other two were identified as Fazal Amin and Md Rafiq.

Police recovered two rifles and 66 bullets from their possession.

Police said the NDP activists fired over 2000 rounds of bullets during the battle from their hideout at Bedbedi under Kachupara.

Many NDP activists fled into deep forest.

Earlier, on Friday evening, an AL leader of Razzan thana named Nihar Kanti Biswas alias Mintu Biswas, 50, was gunned down by unidentified assailants at Fakirhat Bazar near the thana office, police said.

Mintu was in a tea stall during the attack.

AL leaders blamed the activists of NDP for killing Mintu but NDP denied the charge.

Housewife shot dead by BSF

FENI, Jan 8: Villagers demonstrated against the killing of a housewife in firing by Indian Border Security Force (BSF) when her body was brought to her village from hospital for burial today, reports UNB.

Dhanbia, 40, wife of one Ali Ahmed of village Baurpathar in Parshuram thana, was hit by a bullet when the BSF fired on the Bangladesh Rifles at nearby Muhurichar at about 11:00 am on Friday.

BDR sources said the BSF men opened fire without provocation, triggering an encounter that lasted an hour.

The demonstrators demanded immediate measures to stop the recurring shooting by the Indian border guards over a dispute on the frontier land-mass.

Bangladesh Rifles' 7 Battalion protested the firing to the Bilonia unit of the BSF, but they were yet to respond.

Meanwhile, about 2,000 people of Nizkalikapur and Dakkhin Kaotali villages are passing days in grave concern and have dug trenches to protect themselves from the cross-border firing.

They could not harvest their crops due to mounting tension because of the border trouble.

The BSF first opened fire on the Bangladeshi farmers at Muhurichar on November 27. A flag meeting was held on November 29 between the BDR and the BSF, but it did not yield peace.

The Indian farmers trespassed into Muhurichar on October 13, and started tilling the land for winter crops.

Reaz presents credentials to Ghali

Ambassador Reaz Rahman presented his credentials to the UN Secretary General as the newly accredited permanent representative of Bangladesh to the United Nations on Thursday, reports UNB.

UN Secretary General Dr Boutros Boutros-Ghali accepted the credentials in a very simple but warm ceremony, according to a message received in Dhaka yesterday.

Receiving the credentials, Dr Boutros Ghali recalled his various meetings with Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia, particularly during her visit to the UN General Assembly last October.

He praised Bangladesh's role and contribution to the peace-keeping process. He also praised its consistent support to the United Nations and the cause of multilateralism.

The Secretary General requested the permanent representative to convey his warm regards to the Prime Minister and the Foreign Minister of Bangladesh.

Ambassador Reaz Rahman, in his brief statement on the occasion, reaffirmed Bangladesh's unequivocal commitment to the purposes and principles of the UN charter.

He also expressed the determination of Bangladesh to play a constructive and active role especially with the advent of a democratically elected government in the country.

Ghali also assured the permanent representative of all help and support in the fulfilment of his mission.
