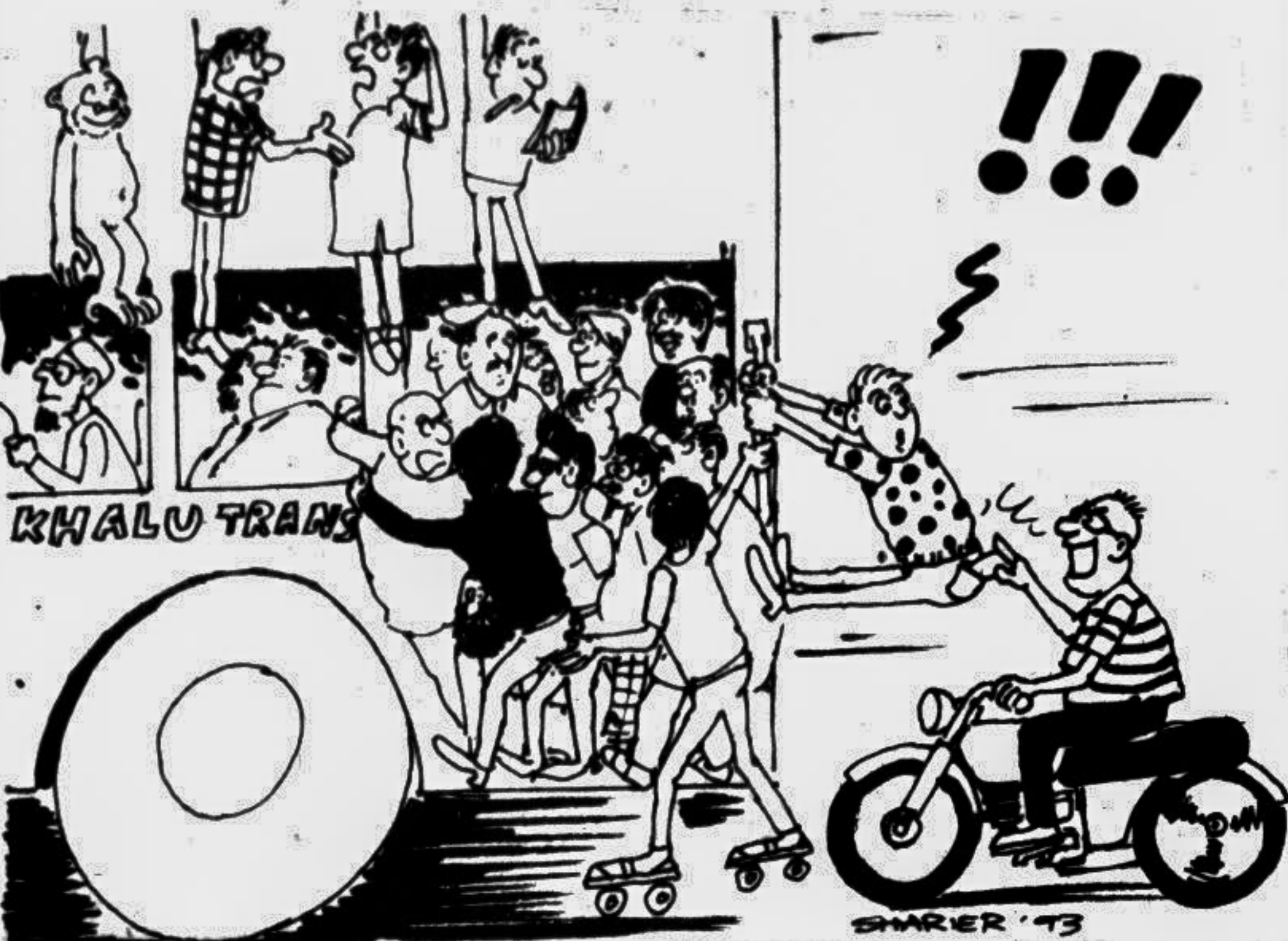


Dhaka Day by Day

The Lumbering Behemoth

A group of youngmen wait in the middle of a road on an island, apparently engrossed in the bioscope relayed live from the busy city streets. A first glance can brand them as a gang of street Romeoos — at least from their dresses and their particular interest in the hooded rickshaws.

However much interested they seem in the street affairs, these youngmen never forget — every now and then — to stretch their eyes to the extreme right from where they expect a double-decker. They know the largest behemoth on the city roads will have to slow down here to take a turn; slow enough to get easy ride.

Easy ride, indeed! All one has to do to have a ride from the middle of the road is to concentrate on the waist of one of the passengers, on the footboard and then run and jump for it. Never mind if you step on someone's foot because sooner or later you will be avenged. And by the time, the real bus-stop appears, from where you were theoretically supposed to get on, there will be hardly any room left for another passenger. Don't even think someone will dare penetrate the human shield at the gate to get down. Some come on board — on a double, double-decker BRTC bus.

Only a couple of months back 25 double-decker buses joined the government fleet of buses to meet the transport crisis. With a discreet height of standing comfortably on board and with a slower pace to get on and off in a convenient place — the double-decker buses duly deserve the extra fare the government charges. Even for the students these buses do not have the 50 per cent concession. Well, of course a bully student can always have the right to pay less!

If you think 'bully' as a strong word you are at your liberty to invent an ingenious excuse to

escape the fare which is higher than the wheeled boxes better known as the minibuses. Tk 500cr Hamdard Foundation project

Governor of Sind meets Keramat

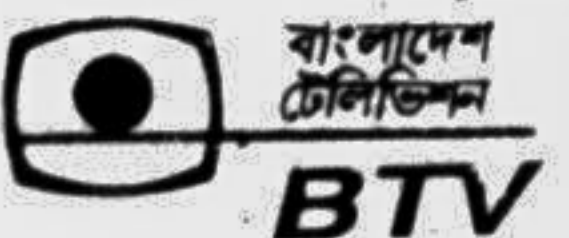

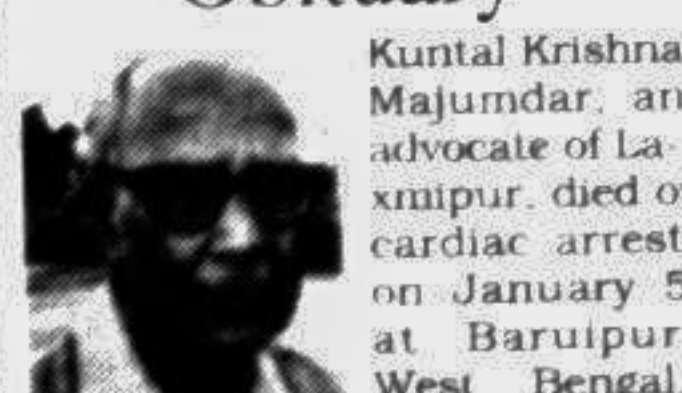

Noorjahan Award for journalists
