

A comprehensive plan has been formulated to reactivate the dormant Bangladesh Shilpa Rin Sangstha (BSRS), according to official sources.

Under the plan, the BSRS expects to mobilise Tk 86 crore by the end of the current year by issuing debentures. realising overdue loans and starting commercial banking.

Sources say, the BSRS plans to start commercial banking from July this year and a floor of the Sharif Mansion in Motijheel has already been rented.

The authorities of the BSRS are expecting Tk 15 crore by the year-end as bank-deposits. Tk 50 crore from debentures and Tk 21 crore from the loanee entrepreneurs of its pro-

Foreign exchange regulations simplified

The country's commercial banks have been permitted to go for forward dealings in any valid foreign exchange transactions' independently by the central bank.

A circular issued by the Foreign Exchange Division of the Bangladesh Bank yesterday also withdrew the restrictions on swapping forex to help the dealers cover their own risks in forward transactions.
