BRUSSELS, Jan 26: Four of the six qualifiers for the World Chess Championship finals have been decided after draws dominated the penultimate round of the Candidates' matches in Wijk Aan Zee, the Netherlands on Tuesday, reports Xinhua.

Viswanathan Anand of India Gata Kamsky of the United States and Vladimir Kramnik of Russia all scored easy draws to earn a place among the last six world title candidates with decisive victories in their elimination matches.

The first player to qualify for the finals, Valery Salov, finished and easy 5-1 victory over fellow Russian Alexander Khalifman on Monday.

Twelve of the world's best Grandmasters are competing in the Dutch costal town in knockout matches.

The Candidates matches are the concluding stages of a twoyear competition designed to find a challenger for world champion Anatoly Karpov of Russia in 1995.

India's Viswanathan Anand. world number three and the fastest Grandmaster in the world, completed an easy twopoint victory over Russian emigre Arthur Yusupov who is considered one of the hardest players in the world to beat.

Anand is one of the favourites to qualify to play Karpov. Along with Kramnik and Kamsky, he has also reached the final eight of the unofficial world title series being organised by Garri Kasparov, who was stripped of the world title last year.

Two of the six matches remain in the balance after Tuesday's penultimate round.

Anglo-German tie now in Berlin

BONN, Jan 26: An International friendly between England and Germany, cancelled in Hamburg for fear of neo-Nazi violence, will take place in Berlin's Olympic Stadium, reports Reuter.

The German Football Federation (DFB) decided today to hold the match in Berlin but to keep the same date, April 20 the anniversary of Adolf Hitler's birthday.

The DFB originally planned to hold the match in the northern port city of Hamburg.

However, city officials asked that the game be moved to another venue because of fears that neo-Nazis planned to disrupt the event to mark Hitler's birthday.





"Skip any instruction. Do as you like," answered my captain. I was in a state of daze and threw my bat around and Pakistan won quite comfortably in the end," recalled Malik.

It was the coming of age of a stylish stroke maker, the present captain of the Pakistan team and an affable, low-profile sports star.

Reminded of Imran's criticism of him in the great allrounder's autobiography, Malik rounded off, " I never said anything to defend myself or never indulged in counter criticism. I was misquoted. He kept on listening to others and never checked it out with me."

No truth behind Tyson deal



NDIANAPOLIS, Jan 26: Authorities on Tuesday denied a television report that a deal was in the works that co-

uld free American boxer Mike Tyson from prison, where he is serving time for a rape conviction, reports AP. "Indeed, we are bewildered

as to where these rumours

originated. They certainly did not come from the prosecutor's office," Marion County Prosecutor Jeffrey Modisett said. Tyson, a former heavyweight champion, was convicted of raping beauty pageant contestant Desiree Washington in an

Indianapolis hotel room in

1991. He is serving a six-year prison sentence at the Indiana Youth Center. An Indianapolis television station reported Monday night that Tyson would admit the crime in return for prosecutors recommending his sentence be cut to time served. The station

did not disclose its sources for the report. "If anyone had asked the prosecutor's office directly, they would have been informed that

we have not initiated any dis-

cussions with anyone from the Tyson defence team and that we are not currently engaged in any negotiations involving the Tyson defence team," Modisett The TV station earlier said

both sides may be agreeable to such a deal to avoid an upcoming hearing ordered by the Indiana Court of Appeals to determine whether the prosecutor's office withheld evidence. "That's not true. There is no

such 'deal," Rob Smith. a spokesman for Modisett, said. "We're not entertaining any deal similar to that from any party. To my knowledge we have not been approached and if we were approached we would not entertain any such deal."

The TV station reported Tuesday morning that prosecutors were said to be in talks with Tyson's lawyers but would wait for the Tyson camp to file their proposed deal with the courts before a decision is made

with the prosecutor's office, Dershowitz said. "I am going ahead and preparing for the hearing."

The Court of Appeals rejected Tyson's first appeal to reverse his 1992 conviction. Dershowitz has taken that appeal to the US Supreme Court, but it has not decided whether to hear the case.

The defence also pursued a second round of appeals on its contention that Tyson should have a new trial because the prosecutor's office withheld from the defence team information that the woman intended to sue Tyson for civil damages. The defence claimed that the information showed she was motivated to by a potentially large damage award against the former heavyweight boxing champion.
