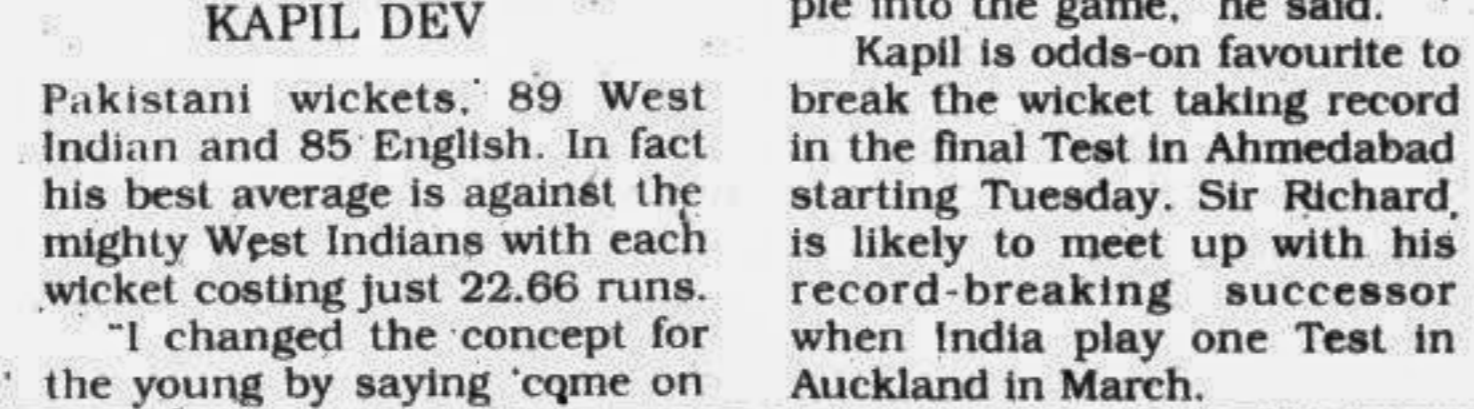
Australians fly to SA for 3-Test series

Those were three of the more intriguing stories at the Millrose Games on Friday night, reports AP.

to break four minutes. "It was a disappointment," said Coghlan, who won by 65 yards in 4:04.55. "I was really hoping I could go under four minutes. I felt optimistic coming in."

Coghlan is the world indoor record-holder at 3:49.78 set in 1983 and the world Masters record-holder at 4:01.39 set in the 60-metre dash in 7:00. The clocking broke the Millrose record of 7:14 set by Carlette Guidry in 1991 and equaled by Guidry in 1992.

Facing a brilliant field, including 1992 Olympic silver medalist Tony Dees and 1992 bronze medalist Jack Pierce, the long-legged Foster bolted from the blocks smartly, took the lead at the second hurdle and held it the rest of the way.

Other winners included 1992 Olympic 1,500-metre champion Hassiba Boulmerka of Algeria in the women's mile in 4:30.01, seven-time Millrose champion Antonio McKay in the men's 400 in 48.04, and Rubeen Reina, two-time former NCAA 3,000-metre champion from Arkansas, in the 3,000 in 7:50.16.

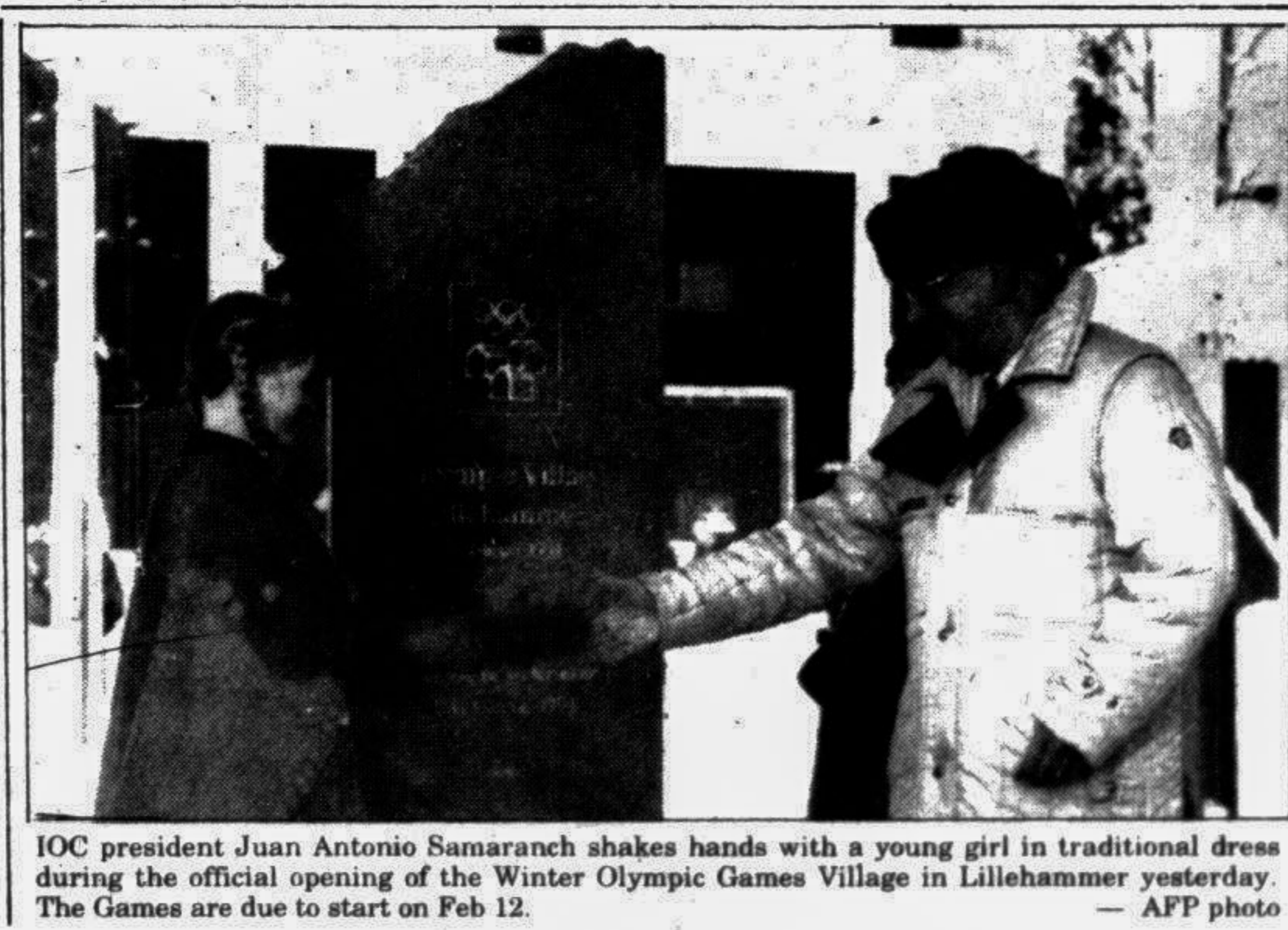
