A fixed-wing aircraft of the smallest size would not be able to safely land in 'Ramu'. a remote area in the Chittagong Hill Tracts, whereas a helicopter does it with relative ease. "Choppers beat any other form of transport in such crucial operations such as : relief, medical emergencies, aerial surveys, pipeline and other inspections, project planning and development works, off-shore drilling and fishing operations, search and rescue operations, bank cash transfer and transportation. And all these for those engaged in business, industry and other private enterprises," explains Major (Retd) Q M Nazibullah Consultant Sales and Marketing of Skyways. With choppers patrolling the air the traffic system can be helped too. 
"This is because of the auto-rotation process installed in American choppers, explains Rashid

"In any emergencies you can switch off the engine and sip tea, the blades would rotate as windmills which make the craft light. It would not crash, instead land, even on a dime. This technology the Russians could not master.' Skyways Techno Services (STS) is basically
