Ganges Kobadak Project

Effect of Farakka Barrage starts earlier this year

KUSHTIA, Feb 8: The operation in the Ganges Kobadak Project, the biggest irrigation project in the country have been facing setbacks much ahead of time this year because of the unilateral withdrawal of Ganges water by India through construction of Farakka

The Farakka issue has already been discussed in many forums including Zia Parishad where speakers blamed India for economic and environmental aggression on Bangladesh and demanded rising of Ganges water sharing issue in world forums. Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia placed the issue in United, Nations General Assembly recently.

On the other hand, local leaders through public meetings raised their voices to go for construction of Ganges Barrage Project which late President Ziaur Rahman initiated in order to overcome and counter the adverse effect of

The work began in 1980-81 through laying of foundation at four kilometre downstream of Hardinge Bridge near Talbaria at a cost of Taka 1131 crores.

The scheme was taken up in the backdrop of the unilateral withdrawal of water of the river Ganges in the upper reaches by India through Farakka Barrage. The scheme aimed at removal of water From Our Correspondent

scarcity for irrigation, flood control and improvement of irrigation in 25 south western districts of the country.

The districts are Pabna Rajshahi, Kushtia, Natore Nawabgoni, Naogaon, Sirajgoni, Meherpur, Narail, Chuadanga, Magura, Jhenidah, Jessore, Satkhira, Khulna, Bagerhat Bhola, Pirojpur, Barisal, Jhalokati, Sariatpur, Faridpur, Gopalgonj, Rajbari and Madaripur.

In the year 1980-81 Project Implementation Cell was formed under the auspices of Water Development Board and later in the year 1984 a separate office was established under the name of Ganges Barrage Project for its implementation. But the progress of work on

the project is negligible. Till now about four crore taka have been placed and only a portion of survey work was taken up. To complete the first phase of the work, an amount of Taka six core is required, according to informed sources

It is surprising to note that nothing substantial progress is found so far and no fund has been allocated although it has become life and death question for the people of this country and as such its future remain uncertain with small water in river Ganges and as a result process of desertification has

Help maintain peace for achieving progress

The project included the construction of three pump houses having lifting capacity of 16000 cusecs of water each three main regulators and 775-kilometre long flood control embankment and these will facilitate preservation of water throughout the year.

The three proposed pump houses will ensure adequate water lifting for irrigation. This will also be helpful for the Ganges Kobadak Project area which suffers a setback every year during dry season for want of adequate water in the river Ganges. The total expenditure of Taka 1131 crores includes Taka 220 crores in foreign exchange.

A UNB report says: After opening of the four corridors in the border areas the revenue earning out of smuggled cattle has increased to a great extent, official sources said. The corridors have been set

up at Mohiskundi, Kathuli Kashampur and Jagannathpur. According to the sources.

hazards and obstacles of auction purchasers have also been relieved with the opening of these corridors recently.

During the last month 9430 cows and 246 buffaloes have been seized while smuggling through these corridors and sold in auction at Taka 88,89,700 on the spot at government prescribed rate by customs authority.

Largest number of seized cattlehead and buffaloes snuggled through the Mohiskundi corridor stood at 5837 and 36 respectively.

Besides, with the opening of the BDR sector four headquarters at Mirpur anti-smuggling activities had been geared up and huge quantity of incoming and outgoing smuggled goods were seized.

It may be mentioned that during the year 1993, goods worth about Taka 10.48 crore were seized, 122 smugglers arrested and 2581 cases filed with the police while in 1992, contrabands worth over Taka 10 crore were seized, 204 alleged smugglers held and 2079 cases filed.


