WASHINGTON, Feb 13: The Clinton Administration's bid to reform legislation governing foreign aid is being criticized by members of the US Congress as well as private sector organizations, reports USIS.

At the first Senate hearing on the administration's proposed Peace. Prosperity and Democracy Act of 1994, the measure was challenged on some of its policy implications.

Paul Sarbanes. An example is the case of Pakistan, which is participating in UN peacekeeping operations in Somalia but is barred from getting US foreign aid other than humanitarian - be-


Under the proposed new law, Pakistan could get aid specifically for its peacekeeping needs in Somalia, a State Department official confirmed.

Earlier the same day, private development and environmental groups at a hearing with the House Foreign Affairs Committee said the proposed bill is vague and lacks a focus on priorities.

Richard Bissell, a former assistant administrator of USAID, argued that USAID should remain as independent as possible from the State Department and that its traditional programmes not be folded into the State Depart-

ment's jurisdiction. Bissell said "development is a long-term process," and he is concerned that it may become "hostage" to the short-term demands of the budget.

#### Hosokawa seeks to raise Japanese contribution to int'l community

TOKYO, Feb 13: Japanese Prime Minister Morihiro Hosokawa stressed in a statement Friday that the country should make more contributions to the international community, reports AFP.

"Japan must try to fulfil its responsibility as much as it can as a more trustworthy state in the international community.' Hosokawa said in a statement read here by Chief Cabinet Secretary Masayoshi Takemura.

Hosokawa was in Washington Friday for talks with US President Bill Clinton.

The Prime Minister said in the statement that the peacekeeping role of the United Nations should be strengthened.

.The statement was read at a meeting held to celebrate Japan's National Founding Day a national holiday.

Some 1,300 people, including members of parliament. attended the ceremony orga nized by the association to celebrate national holdays with support from government.

## Armenia urges Georgia not to attack gas pipelines

MOSCOW, Feb 13: Armenia appealed to neighbouring Georgia on Saturday to take "adequate measures" in order to stop attacks on the only pipeline delivering natural gas to the republic, a news agency said, reports AP.

ITAR-Tass quoted an Armenian government statement as saying that sabotage acts on the pipeline continued despite Georgian assurances that the country would prevent

The latest pipeline explosion, which blocked all natural gas supplies to Armenia, occurred just before midnight Thursday in Georgia's Marneuli region, an area near the Armenian border populated mostly by ethnic Azerbaijanis.

Armenia, a republic in the Caucasus mountains, has no fuel of its own and depends exclusively on imports, which are especially vital in winter.

Last year, the pipeline was blown up at least seven times.

# Bonn keen to trade with India

BOMBAY, Feb 13: Germany supports investment and joint ventures in India because of New Delhi's on going market reform policies, German Minister for Economic Cooperation Karl Difter Spranger said here yesterday, reports AFP.

Spranger said Germany was looking for new opportunities to create economic and cultural ties with South Asian nations, adding that his government was particularly interested in business with India because of ongoing sweeping open-market reforms.

"The openness in market reforms now justifies improving Indo-German ties," he said. "The liberalisation programmes are sending definite and clear signals that the Indian government would stay by the course of market economy."

"Positive activities and trends have already emerged from the process," he said of the economic reforms launched in 1991 by Prime Minister P V Narasimha Rao's government.

Spranger told a meeting of the Indo-German Chamber of

Commerce here that Germany would encourage the Indian government to press on with the reforms and further open the economy to private sector investment.

Chamber president Helmut Brenneiser acknowledged that German industry had changed its attitude towards India as a result of the reforms.

"In the past the attitude was more reserved and critical. Today, German industry has clearly discovered India as part of the South Asian growth

engine," he said.
The official said the German automobile giant Mico Boshche joint venture here was planning to expand production, while Siemens had also announced a number of new projects.



cadres were found to be unprofitable, primarily due to mismanagement. Some were on the brink of bankruptcy. Despite painstaking efforts by the municipal government to put them back on the right track, they showed little sign

of life. The PRPB system has given these languishing enterprises a shot in the arm; 90 per cent of them turned a profit before the first year was up. According to Tongling municipal reports, labour productivity has increased 50 per cent in these leased enterprises.

The PRPB system requires that each state-or collectivelyowned enterprise offered for lease has to evaluate scrupulously its assets before advertising for private lessees. After signing contracts ranging from three to 10 years and before assuming control of operations, each private leaseholder must pay rent and insurance premiums. Fees amount to 5-10 per cent of the enterprise's gross property value for rent. and 1-10 per cent for insur-

The lessee then assumes responsibility for all staff members. He or she gets to have the final say on almost everything except property ownership. This has the disadvantage of making workers at the former state-owned enter prises confused. Suddenly, they are no longer public servants, but ordinary employees. Employees of privately-run public enterprises may also fear that their jobs now depend on the whims of their new boss. To prevent any abuse on the part of the new managers, regulations require that no less than 70 per cent of the employees must be retained, a rule intended to protect work ers' interests. Others will be retrained, or will have to find

other jobs. Regulations also stipulate that after paying taxes, leaseholders can retain 20-50 per cent of the profit. The cost of the gross receipts goes toward equipment renewal, technology upgrading, and employees

According to Mayor Wang, a striking characteristic of the PRPB system is that the private entrepreneurs enjoy full autonomy. The PRPB system takes advantage of dynamism intrinsic to private manage-

ment, so as to avoid certain drawbacks encumbering the development of public businesses," said Wang.

Tongling's Jinxing Silk

Fabrics Factory is just one of the many successes of he PRPB system. In just one year, the innovative system has breathed new life into the factory. Yearly profits amount to nearly one million yuan (172,000 US dollars), and the monthly maximum wage for each worker is now 500 yuan (86 US dollars), three times

what it used to be. Si Qin, the leaseholder of the factory, understood the challenge when he put his name on the front office door 'I run this factory at my own risk. If I fail, I'll pay for the loss with my personal prop-

'However, I have the power need to make the decisions ! deem best for the factory. don't need to worry about following rigid bureaucratic rules. For example, I have every right to sack those who are not working hard. In the past, this was simply inconceivable. think the potential rewards

justify the risks, he said. Presently, Si employs 340 people, 16 of whom are whitecollar workers. In this privately-run enterprise, there is no dead wood and no idle pa-

per-pushers. The success of the pilot programme in Tongling city led to the introduction of the PRPB system in Beijing. Liaoning, Shanghai, Tamjin, Hubei, Guangdong, Henan, Jilin, and other cities and provinces. Results in these places have also been most en-

in some cases the PRPB system has even turned what seemed to be worthless metal into gold. Last year, workers of the Yingkou Transformer Factory in Liaoning province, northeast China, paid one million yuan (172,000 US dollars) to purchase management rights for the factory for three years. The money was paid in the name of Fan Xianguo, the former factory director. Now that we operate as a PRPB enterprise, we have created a favourable environment to de-

Fan, the titular leaseholder. Bo Jingchun, a worker at the factory, added, 'Now the more I work, the more I earn.

velop our great potential, said

My monthly labour productivity has gone up 100 per cent. The average income of workers at the factory has increased by 30 per cent, and the factory showed profit of 800,000 yuan (138,000 US dollars) by the end of July 1993. They expect to clear another 600,000 yuan (103,000 US dollars) by the

end of this year. Although there are still kinks to be ironed out, such as the often arbitrary rent charges, the PRPB system has effectively spurred China's

public sector in recent years. Economists predict that some medium-sized enterprises may evolve quietly into joint-stock companies now that the PRPB system is working quite well. Recently, the Chinese central government announce some small stateowned enterprises can be sold to individuals and collectives This amounts to privatisation

on a small scale. China now has more than 400,000 industrial enterprises, and 97 per cent of them are small or medium sized. With these enterprises producing 70 per cent of the nation's gross industrial output value, the PRPB system may play a major role in China's future economic growth and reform. — Depthnews Asia
