Nation pays homage to language martyrs

The nation paid homage to the martyrs of the historic Language Movement Monday with a renewed pledge to strengthen the democratic institutions and root out communalism from the country.

Thousands of barefoot people, wearing black badges and carrying bouquets, poured into the Shaheed Minars across the country to honour the heroes of the 1952 Language Movement which sowed the seeds of independence of Bangladesh in 1971.
