

JERUSALEM, Feb 27: Israel's Cabinet on Sunday ordered the arrest of Jewish extremist leaders and said it will disarm radical settlers in the occupied territories in a bid to smother a wave of Arab fury following Friday's massacre of Muslims, reports AP:

Environment Minister Yossi Sarid also announced that authorities will start releasing some 800 to 1,000 Palestinians held in Israeli prisons.

Earlier, the army sealed off the occupied West Bank and Gaza Strip for an indefinite period, blocking more than one million Palestinians from entering Israel.
