Hosokawa will hold emergency cabinet meet

TOKYO. Mar 6: Japanese Prime Minister Morihiro Hosokawa will hold an emergency cabinet meeting Wednesday to hammer out market-opening measures as an effort to appease Washington over a stalled trade row, government officials said Saturday, reports

But JIJI press said Tokyo was unlikely to unveil concrete steps to liberalise its markets during the meeting, as Hosokawa still said a final decision would not be made until late March.

Following February's failure of so-called framework agreements. Hosokawa announced an outline for voluntary trade measures to promote US imports and slash its swollen trade surplus with the United States.

The cabinet meeting, to be attended by key trade negotiators including trade and industry minister Hiroshi Kumagai and Foreign Minister Tsutomu Hata, is aimed at developing an

The meeting will be held a day before planned talks between Hosokawa and US Secretary of State Warren Christopher, who is to visit here next week during his three-nation Asia-Pacific trip.

News reports, however, said that major progress is unexpected in the Hosokawa-Christopher talks, as Japan was unlikely to show something new by then.

Financial support to Bosnian Muslims pledged

JAKARTA, Mar 6: An Indonesian committee for Bosnia and a leading Muslim organisation have pledged financial support to Bosnian Muslims to set up a representative unit in Jakarta, the official Antara news agency said today, reports Reuter.

lo facilitate communication between Indonesia and Bosnia, it would be best to have a Bosnian representative office here," Probosuted Jo, head of Indonesia's Solidarity Committee for Bosnian Muslims, was quoted as saying.

Robosuted Jo. a businessman who is also president Suharto's half-brother, spoke after meeting visiting Bosnian Prime Minister Haris Silajdzic here on Saturday.

He said the committee and Indonesian Ulema Council (MUI) were prepared to help fund the representative office's expenses in view of the financial difficulties faced by the war-torn Bosnia-Herzegovina.

Eximbank supports sales to Argentina, Australia

WASHINGTON, Mar 6: The Export-Import Bank of the United States (Eximbank) has approved a 52.7-million US dollars, guarantee to support the 59-million US dollar sale of three General Electric gas turbine generator sets to Central Neuquen, a private Argentine company, reports

Eximbank said March 1 that the three 123-megawatt gas turbine generators will be used in an electricity generating plant in the province of Neuquen, Argentina. The 369megawatt plant is expected to be one of the lowest cost producers of thermal electricity in Argentina, Eximbank said. Eximbank's guarantee of the

loan by Citicorp of New York must be repaid in 14 semiannual installments, beginning December 15, this year.

A day earlier, Eximbank approved a guarantee of \$62.9 million to support a \$80.7-million sale of two Boeing aircraft to Ansett Worldwide Aviation Services of Sydney, Australia.

Eximbank said that it has also issued a preliminary commitment to help Ansett finance seven additional Boeing aircraft worth \$383 million for delivery in 1994.

Minister Benazir Bhutto pledged on Saturday to enforce austerity in government: spending to cut Pakistan's budget deficit, reports Reuter. She said in a speech to

journalists beit-tightening would apply to her federal government and the four provincial administrations. "If people are going to

tighten their belts, the government must also tighten its belt," she said. Bhutto accused the government of her predecessor

Nawaz Sharif of extravagance and said her four-month oldgovernment's policy of tighter economic discipline had halted it.

"Now we are aiming at between 1.5 billion dollars and 2.0 billion dollars (in reserves)," she said. Bhutto said she was appalled at overspend ing by some provinces and threatened to impose penal-

"If we have an IMF agreement, the province must also have an IMF agreement," she

She said she opposed higher taxes but would not reduce income tax in the next budget because of a projected increase in the salaries of government employees and high spending by the previous government.

GATT accord 'just hot air' unless Super 301 banned: Balladur

PARIS, Mar 6: Prime Minister Eduard Balladur accused the United States of "not playing by the rules" of international trade Saturday after it threatened to impose sanctions on French goods in retaliation for France's blockage of US fish, reports AFP.

He also said the GATT agreement is 'just hot air' unless a controversial US trade retaliation measure, known as Super 301, is banned.

President Bill Clinton this week reinstated the article over a trade dispute with

The French Prime Minister said the latest US moves proves 'we were right to call for the suppression of Supera 301, the provision of US trade law which allows sanctions to

be imposed against a country deemed to be unfairly competing with the United States. "As long as we don't do it (ban Super 301), the (GATT)

ganisation which would abolish this type of retaliation. "The agreement doesn't go into effect until 1995." Balladur said, adding that for

A European diplomatic source in Washington said Friday that the US had threatened to limit French imports of cheese and other goods in retaliation for the French blockage of US fish.

Deputy US Trade Representative Rufus Yerxa meanwhile announced Friday that the United States and France had reached a preliminary agreement to settle the row over rigorous health checks imposed on US - and other foreign fish imports.

The French restrictions were imposed after violent demonstrations a month ago by French fishermen demanding minimum price limits and curbs on fish from outside the European Union.

Oman may resume contacts with non-OPEC producers

DUBAI, Mar 6: Six Gulf Arab Oil Ministers ended talks in Saudi Arabia early today and a conference source said Oman was expected to resume contacts with non-OPEC producers to help coordinate efforts to boost low prices, reports Reuter.

There was no immediate sign of a joint decision by the six countries, members of the Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC), to cut production.

The GCC ministers met for more than two hours in Jeddah and conference sources said Oman briefed its allies on the outcome of contacts with independent oil producers but its presentation did not include specific steps to boost prices.

The sources said the GCC appeared to be in favour of further coordination with independent producers.

The GCC, which controls about half of the world's known oil reserves, asked Oman in December to contract producers outside the Organisation of **Petroleum Exporting Countries** (OPEC) with an offer for 'balanced' cuts by all to help boost prices.

The GCC usually makes a final statement after such meetings but none was issued immediately after the talks ended in the early hours.

Opening the meeting, Saudi Oil Minister Hisham Nazer stressed the importance of cooperation to promote GCC interests and said he hoped the meeting would settle some outstanding issues, official Gulf news agencies said.


