

Flood situation worsens in Netrokona

NETROKONA, Apr 4: Flood situation in Kaliyuri thana under Netrokona district deteriorated further due to heavy rainfall during the past five days and also onrush of hilly waters from across the border, reports BSS.

Reports reaching here at the district headquarters Sunday from the thana sadar said the flood waters have so far submerged eight haors, two embankments and washed away high yielding boro paddy on over 10,000 acres.

Netrokona district water development board sources said that river Dhanu crossed danger mark Sunday morning at Kaliyuri point.

District administration sources said that a message was despatched Sunday to the Relief Ministry asking for allotment of relief both in cash and kind for the affected people of the thana.

BSS correspondent during a visit to the affected area saw the vast cropland under water. Besides, Kaliyuri, two other thanas of the district — Mohanganj and Modan — have also been partially affected by the flash flood.

Telephones disconnected, Tk 4.25 cr bills outstanding

BARISAL, Apr 4: Five hundred telephone lines were disconnected Sunday to realise about 39 lakh taka outstanding telephone bills from private consumers in Barisal town, reports UNB.

According to the Barisal T&T Revenue Office, there are 1.75 crore taka in semi-government offices and Taka 2.50 crore in private sector outstanding telephone bills in 11 districts under Barisal Telecommunication zone.

The districts are: Barisal, Jhalakati, Bhola, Pirojpur, Patuakhali, Barguna, Faridpur, Madaripur, Shariatpur, Rajbari and Gopalganj.

Besides, Taka 1.20 crore remain outstanding bill against 1,000 closed telephones in these districts.

There are about 11,000 telephone consumers in these districts, the sources said.

88 people including a fugitive held, arms recovered

SIRAJGANJ, Apr 4: Police arrested a fugitive, allegedly involved in various criminal activities for the last three years from Kutirchar-Bhadraghat village in Kamarkhand thana Saturday, reports UNB.

Alam 24, son of Ali Zaker, who was wanted in seven dacoity cases, including stabbing of a local Jubadul leader and assaulting Shahidullah Khan MP, was arrested from his residence at 11 am.

Police said, Alam had stabbed Md Hanif, Organising Secretary of Jubadul at the court premises on February 20. The critically wounded Jubadul leader is now undergoing treatment at the Dhaka Medical College Hospital.

Another report adds: Sadar thana police in a special drive recovered a country-made pipegun and 13 rounds of bullet from Khokshabari village in Kamarkhand thana on Friday night.

Acting on a tip, police rushed to the village where a gang of dacoits was preparing to commit dacoity.

Sensing the presence of police, the gang fled the scene, leaving the arms and ammunition.

In Sirajganj district, police arrested some 88 people on various charges in a special drive against crimes in last one month. The arrested included some absconding convicts.

Projects to construct flood shelters in coastal area

MAJDEE COURT (Noakhali), Apr 4: Five projects have been taken up in the coastal areas of three thanas of the district to save the people during the flood, reports UNB.

For the successful implementation of these earthen shelter projects, at least 497 metric tons of wheat have been allocated, official source said.

According to District Relief and Rehabilitation Department, about 181 metric tons of wheat have been allotted for two projects in sadar thana, 112 metric tons of wheat for one project in Companiganj thana and 203 metric tons for two projects in Hatiya thana.

These projects will mostly facilitate the people of the coastal areas for taking shelter during the flood and disaster.

The work on the projects is expected to be completed by June next.

Dredging of 126-km-long Khowai river needed Farming on 80,000 acres of land, future of 4 lakh people uncertain

HABIGANJ, Apr 4: Cultivation on 80,000 acres of land and future of over four lakh people have become uncertain as the dredging of river Khowai has been stopped for the reasons not known.

The Water Development Board look up the plan to save crops of the vast area from flood.

The 126-km-long Khowai river often overflows the bank along the villages of Chunarughat, Baniachang, Bahubal, Lakhal and other thanas.

During the time of flood, sand flows from the upper stream of the river which is situated in Indian territory. As a result, flood waters flow over the banks of the river and submerge the adjoining areas.

Most of the families of the areas face crisis for the regular flood.

To control the flood, a plan was prepared and placed for construction of an embankment along the river Khowai in 1964.

For permanent solution of the problem, a scheme was taken up in 1971-72 at an estimated cost of Taka 39.41 crore. The scheme was scheduled to be completed by 1981-82 financial year.

Unfortunately, the Water Development Board could not complete the work of the scheme for the reasons not known.

The present government

stopped the work in July last which left the people helpless.

Another report says: Nine persons were killed and 10 others injured in separate incidents in different places of the district during the last few weeks.

According to police sources, Taskir Mia, a businessman of village Chargaon under Nabiganj PS was killed by a group of miscreants of village Kanaipur under the same PS.

A case was started with the Nabiganj PS in this connection. A day-long hartal was observed at Nabiganj demanding punishment to the killers.

Police arrested Abdur Rouf, Chairman of Nabiganj sadar union parishad in this connection.

In another incident, a pregnant woman of village Ladiya under Habiganj PS was killed recently.

Witnesses said, Musammath Mahbanu, a pregnant woman was severely beaten by her enemies over a petty matter. She died on the spot.

A minor boy was killed and another one injured in a tragic road accident at Baniachong recently.

Police and witnesses said, on the day of incident at about 1:30 pm a Habiganj bound truck (Sylhet T 02437) from Baniachong hit two minor boys at Rathna Ferry Ghat and they were seriously injured. They were immediately taken to

Habiganj sadar hospital where one of them died.

A case was started with the concerned police station.

Police seized the killer truck but the driver was absconding.

One Pervin Begum, 12 was run over by a truck on Dhaka-Sylhet highway near Kamaichara police camp under Bahubal PS and killed him on the spot.

The victim was a servant of a clerk of Kamaichara Tea Garden.

A case was filed with the Bahubal police.

One Nuruzzaman, 14 of village Mohanpur under Habiganj sadar thana reportedly committed suicide recently.

Family sources said, on the date of incident the victim exchanged hot words with his mother regarding last Eid-marketing. At one stage he lost his mental balance and took poison.

He was immediately taken to Habiganj sadar hospital where he was declared dead by the doctors.

One Probindra, 27 of village Kalipur under Kaliyabangsha union of Nabiganj thana also committed suicide recently.

Family sources said, the victim committed suicide by cutting his throat by a knife. He was taken to Habiganj sadar hospital in a critical condition. He died in the hospital.

A case was started with the Nabiganj police station.

Use rural road network for economic activities

DUMURIA, (Khulna), Apr 4: Six-kilometre-long Dumuria-Mirzapur Road under Dumuria thana of Khulna district was formally inaugurated by Jatiya Sangsad Whip Ashraf Hossain Saturday, reports BSS.

The project is being implemented by Local Government Engineering Department and financed from government's own resources.

In the first phase of the project, bricks laying work of two and a half-kilometre of the road will be implemented within the current financial year at a cost of Taka nine lakh.

On completion of the project, road communication between Daulatpur and Dumuria thana headquarters via Solua will be convenient and easier. Besides, a number of hat-bazar and growth centres will be connected through this road.

Addressing a meeting on the occasion, Ashraf Hossain called upon the people, particularly those of rural areas to

properly utilize the rural road communication facilities for revitalising economic activities to improve their condition.

He reiterated that opportunities were being created by the government for their economic emancipation and poverty alleviation.

Earlier, Md Ashraf Hossain inaugurated the final competition of the Kalipada Memorial Cricket Tournament at Dumuria Jubo Sangha ground.

A week-long drama festival began at the Khulna railway auditorium on Wednesday under the auspices of Khulna Shilpakala Academy.

Jatiya Sangsad Whip Ashraf Hossain formally inaugurated the festival. It was presided over by the president of Khulna Zila Shilpakala Academy and Deputy Commissioner of Khulna Kazi Reazul Huq. The inaugural function was addressed among others by Prof Anwarul Kadir.

Three killed in separate incidents

MAJDEE COURT (Noakhali), Apr 4: Three people died in separate incidents in the district, police said Sunday, reports UNB.

In one incident, a school student was killed and his friend injured seriously on Thursday when their bi-cycle was hit by a speeding microbus near Datterhat.

The victims met the accident when they were coming to Majdee Court from Banderhat riding on a bi-cycle. Ershadul Kabir 13, student of class seven of Noakhali Zila School died on the spot and his friend Azizul Huq was rushed to the Noakhali General Hospital.

A case was filed with the police.

In another incident, both the mother and her son of village Mohammadpur in Companiganj thana died when they were struck by lightning on March 25.

According to family sources, while witnessing the heavy shower standing at the corridor of their dwelling house they were struck by the thunderbolts. The son died on the spot while the ill-fated mother died on way to hospital.

Another message adds: Two school girls received serious burn injuries when a gang of miscreants threw acid on them on March 29.

According to family sources, the miscreants forcibly entered the house of Saleha 16, a student of class ten and Rehana of class three of village Bircot in Senbag thana and threw acid on them injuring them grievously.

No water available even from deep tubewells

RAMGATI, (Lakshmipur), Apr 4: Acute scarcity of drinking water has been prevailing in Ramgati thana causing great suffering to the rural people for quite a long time, reports UNB.

Local people said, almost all the ponds, canals and ditches in the locality have been drying up and no water is available from the deep tubewells as the ground water level has fallen further.

More than 50 per cent of existing shallow and hand driven tubewells have gone out of order. Hence the drinking water scarcity is taking a serious turn day by day, they added.

People of the Char Bashan, Char Kalkini, Char Thika, Char Kalakopa, Char Martin, Char Sekandar, Char Neamat, Balun Char, Char Krishnapur, Char Poragacha, Azad Nagar, Char Jangalia are the worst sufferers.

Water-borne diseases like diarrhoea and cholera are the common features in the locality which claimed hundreds of lives in the last year due to intake of impure water.

Housewife roasted alive in Gaibandha

According to reports, fire originated from a kitchen.

Development projects on progress in Barisal

BARISAL, Apr 4: The re-cavation work of two canals measuring about 16 kilometres in two thanas of Barisal district has been progressing fast, reports BSS.

According to relief and rehabilitation office sources, government sanctioned 315 metric tons of wheat for the implementation of these projects during the current dry season.

The projects included Lakutia canal of about 10 kilometres long and Dhopair canal of about seven kilometres long. Meanwhile, about 35 per cent work has already been completed.

Over 500 men and women have been working on the projects every day. A total of 2,19,508 cubic metres of earth will be removed from these canals.

Barisal paushava has been implementing six projects of repairing and reconstruction of roads during the current fiscal year.

According to an official source, Taka 85 lakh is being spent for these projects.

The roads are: Bagura Road, Kaunia Main Road, Hatkhola Road, Bazar Road, SWA Road and Shahid Zia Road.

A meeting of the members of Barisal public library was held here on Thursday with Deputy Commissioner Mamtaz Uddin, President of the library, in the chair.

S M Iqbal, Secretary of the library, read out the annual report.

The report said, the library earned Taka 5,92,498 from different sources including the donation during the last three years. It incurred an expenditure of Taka 5,12,878 during the same period.

The meeting adopted a number of resolutions for development of the library.

Work hard to rehabilitate destitute people

Successful sugar crushing season

Apr 4: Faridpur Sugar Mills produced 13,717 metric tons of sugar by crushing 1,71,490 metric tons of sugarcane in the just concluded crushing season, officials said Sunday, reports UNB.

While talking to UNB, General Manager of the mills KM Abul Quasem, informed that the mills produced 37 per cent above its annual production capacity during the 161 days crushing period which started on October 15 last year.

Taka 3.38 crore was given to the registered growers of the mills as loan in the last year for sugarcane cultivation and 99.8 per cent loan was recovered from them during the season, he added.

The sucrose recovery during the season was eight per cent which was quite satisfactory, the GM added.

About 15,200 acres of land were cultivated for sugarcane in the current crushing season.

Demand for card phone system

Apr 4: Card phone system needs to be introduced at Puran Bazar at the town, which is commercially developed area since many years, reports UNB.

Puran Bazar is a commercially important area and there are as many as 10,000 trading concerns including whole sale centres besides government offices and commercial banks.

In the absence of card phone, everyday many businessmen and traders are facing inconveniences to talk to their people at the other corner for business and other purposes.

The card phone at Chandpur Head Post Office is two miles away from Puran Bazar. Besides, the turbulent river Dakatia is also a bar to all and the traders and concerned people have to kill enough time and energy to reach the head post office.

The telephone exchange at Puran Bazar has become absolutely worn-out and it has lost its longevity long ago, local people alleged. The traders said they cannot talk to their clients and other people clearly over phone to know the market position.

The businessmen of the area said a card phone at the Puran Bazar will ease the sufferings of the people and government will also earn a huge revenue.

Heroin worth Tk 6.5 lakh recovered
