Rupali got off to a sensible start as opener Nripen and Rana who made 23 and 21 respectively put on 45 runs for the first wicket. Three wickets then fell in a heap but Jahangir and Kiron forged another useful partnership with the former emerging as the topscorer with a 43 ball 38. Kiron, whose share in the fourth wicket partnership of 50 was 23 fell to Naimur's off-spin who also took two catches to complete a satisfying day's work. Rupali Bank never recovered from the shocks and were done for in 38.5 overs with the score on 152, 11 adrift of the Grindlays total. Kamrul and Atiq collected two wickets apiece while Towhid, Naimur, Mahub and Kajal took one each. Grindlays will play Fisons in the Plate final on May 1 at the same venue. The Cup final between Techvaly and Acme, a day-night affair, will be played at the Dhaka Stadium on May 5.

Tradition bows to individual talent

LONDON, Apr 28: Warwickshire broke with 114 years of tradition on Wednesday when they awarded record breaker Brian Lara his county cup without him having played for them first, reports Reuter. "As a world record holder we felt that he deserved it and it was the right thing to do straight away," said Warwickshire's chief executive Dennis Amis. Lara, who made a world record Test score of 375 against England earlier this month, found himself confronted by an army of photographers and reporters when he arrived at the English county's Edgbaston ground. Warwickshire provided Lara with a car with a special personalised number plate — 375 Lara — and also presented him with an inscribed silver salver to mark his world record score in Antigua.

Tyson to rejoin ring

NEW YORK, Apr 28: Former heavyweight champion Mike Tyson says he has been working out twice a day and plans to fight again when he is released from prison, reports Reuter. Tyson spoke about his future plans in an interview with CNN talk show host Larry King at the Indiana Youth Centre in Indianapolis, where Tyson has been confined since being convicted in 1992 of raping a beauty pageant contestant.

Vogts' search continues



ABU DHABI, Apr 28: German coach Berti Vogts hunt for some inform strikers for this year's World Cup finals suffered a setback when the world champions struggled to a 2-0 victory over unglamorous opponents the United Arab Emirates on Wednesday, reports Reuter.

Vogts' team rarely looked like hitting the target against the UAE for most of the World Cup warm-up friendly, and could only return home victorious after a 67th-minute headed goal from Ulf Kirsten and a last-minute strike from substitute Maurizio Gaudino. Vogts is struggling to find a partner for first-choice forward Juergen Klinsmann, who missed Wednesday's friendly because of his club Monaco's European Cup semifinal. Apart from his headed goal, Kirsten rarely looked dangerous alongside his Bayer Leverkusen partner Andreas Thom, who was substituted in the second half. Vogts was not happy with the performance against a country the Germans thrashed 5-1 in their last meeting at the 1990 World Cup. "It was a nice training match but we need to assert ourselves more, especially up front," the German trainer said. Vogts has been hinting in recent months that he may have to call Marseille veteran

Rudi Voeller out of two years of retirement from international football for the World Cup finals in the United States in June and July. After Wednesday's lackluster performance the German

coach may be forced to ring up Voeller and make sure he is fit for the finals. The match was played in warm, humid conditions. Although the world champions had most of the play, they failed to produce enough clear-cut goal scoring chances. In the first half the Germans only had one real chance when midfielder Guido Buchwald's header hit the bar midway through the half. Midfielder Andy Moeller had the ball in the net shortly after Kirsten's goal but the referee blew for offside. Moeller was one of the German's better players and his long-range effort nine minutes from the end forced UAE goalkeeper Mohsin Masbahfaraj into a good save. In the last minute Gaudino made the result look better than the mediocre performance when he dribbled into the box and fired in with his left foot. Vogts will hope his strikers can lift their form in further friendlies against Ireland, Austria and Canada before the Germans start the defence of their title.

Valderrama back in action

BOGOTA, Apr 28: Colombia's captain Carlos Valderrama has been included in the national squad for the first time since suffering a serious knee injury in February, reports Reuter. The 32-year-old midfielder was named by coach Francisco Maturana to the 18 man squad which will take part in a four team tournament in Miami in May. Valderrama suffered damaged knee ligaments during a bad tempered friendly between Colombia and Sweden.

Greece get into groove

ATHENS, Apr 28: Greece put on a magnificent performance to thrash fellow-World Cup finalists Saudi Arabia 5-1 in a soccer friendly on Wednesday, with 20-year-old striker Nikos Mahlas scoring twice, reports Reuter.

Mahlas, who scored the only goal in Greece's World Cup qualifying victory over Russia in Athens, opened the scoring in the 10th minute with a hard driven shot from nine metres after a brilliant cross from Stratos Apostolakis. Mahlas scored again from 15 metres on the stroke of half-time when he latched on to a pass from Alexis Alexoudis. Alexoudis put them 3-0 up two minutes after the break as the Greeks dominated the second half and repeatedly penetrated the Saudi defence. Alexoudis's goal was set up by Vassilis Tsartas, who also provided the pass to Christos Kostas for the Greeks' fourth in the 74th minute. In between Saudi Arabia, who like Greece will be appearing in their first finals, pulled a goal back with a penalty after a rare counter attack. Striker Sami Al-Jabeir, who was brought down, scored from the spot in the 60th minute. Greece completed the rout in the 90th minute when Vassilis Tountziaris scored with a left-foot shot.

AC march into Euro Cup final

MILAN, Apr 28: Italian champions AC Milan, playing with only 10 men from the 40th minute, overpowered incept Monaco 3-0 on Wednesday to reach their fourth European Cup final in six seasons, reports Reuter. Frenchman Marcel Desailly headed Milan into the lead in the 14th minute, midfielder Demetrio Albertini drilled home the scored three minutes after halftime and Daniele Massaro volleyed a superb third in the 65th minute to decide the one-off tie. Milan will play Barcelona, 3-0 winners over Porto of Portugal, in the May 18 final. But the Italians will be without central defenders Alessandro Costacurta, sent off on Wednesday night, and captain Franco Baresi as they seek to win Europe's premier trophy for the fifth time. German referee Bernd Heynemann provoked uproar among a crowd of almost 80,000 when he dismissed Costacurta in the 40th minute for a second bookable foul on German striker Juergen Klinsmann. Milan captain Baresi had been booked two minutes earlier for tripping Monaco's Youri Jorkaef, his third caution in the competition this season. Both he and partner Costacurta will be suspended for the final in Athens. Costacurta was booked for a scathing tackle from behind on Klinsmann — who used to play for Milan's city rivals Inter — earlier in the first half. His second caution was more debatable, the tall Italian catching Klinsmann on the

edge of the penalty area with a challenge which was high but in which he appeared to be going for the ball. However, Referee Heynemann immediately produced the yellow card, followed by the red and remained the calmest man in the stormy San Siro as angry fans hurled missiles from the stands. The German official himself picked up a bottle which landed on the turf and carried it to the side of the pitch. Milan, without a win in their previous seven league and cup games, had taken a deserved early lead through Desailly, a member of the Marseille side which beat the Italians in the European Cup final last May. The powerful Ghana-born midfielder out jumped veteran Monaco goalkeeper Jean-Luc Ettori to head home a Zvonimir Bohan corner. Monaco, replacing the disgraced Marseille as the French

representatives in the competition, could not take advantage of their extra man with Belgian Enzo Scifo their only player to perform well. Milan have struggled for goals at season but produced two classic strikes in the second half to kill off the game. Italian international Albertini rifled the second into the top corner from 30 metres after Bohan had tapped a free-kick to him. Watched by princes Rainier and Albert, Monaco almost clawed their way back into the game five minutes later when midfielder Laurent Viaud's shot bounce off the inside of the post and into the grateful arms of grounded Milan goalkeeper Sebastiano Rossi. Massaro, Milan's leading scorer this season, capped an impressive Milan performance with a marvellous goal. Defender Christian Panucci sent a pass fully 50 metres across the pitch into the outside right position, the ball sitting up perfectly for Massaro to hammer in first time beyond the hapless Ettori. Milan coach Fabio Capello said: "It is extraordinary to win such an important game by scoring two goals when down to 10 men. It's hard to repeat such a feat." He then slammed the rules which will deprive him of his two central defenders for the final against Barcelona on May 18. "This rule must be changed. Players like Costacurta and Baresi deserve to play in the final," Capello said, adding he had not decided who would replace them against the Spaniard.

France see no problems

VIENNA, Apr 28: France, hosts of the 1998 World Cup soccer finals, cleared the way on Wednesday for a tournament embracing 32 teams, reports Reuter. Fernand Sastre, joint president of the French World Cup Organising Committee, told International Football Federation (FIFA) officials he believed it would be possible to expand from 24 to 32 teams in four years' time. Sastre was responding to a proposal put forward by FIFA president Joao Havelange.




